

Have you looked around the neighborhood?

New or improved streets – If you have not noticed the new streets in or around Fairfield, you are missing an opportunity for quicker and easier routes then those you have been using. The completion of Cumberland Ridge Drive makes for an easy drive between Fairfield Place Drive and the Mason Road / Schiel Road intersection. This completes the four lane segment that is close to a parallelogram around the center of Fairfield. This rectangle consists of Cypresswood Drive on the south, Fairfield Place

Drive on the west, Cumberland Ridge Drive on the north and Mason Road on the east. These routes make for much easier travel to your destinations than zigging and zagging through the neighborhoods. During the first half of 2011, Harris County should complete an extension of Cypresswood Drive. The existing two lane Cypresswood Drive from Good Shepherd Methodist to the end of the current road behind Fairfield Baptist will be expanded to a four lane road. From the current east end of Cypresswood Drive in Fairfield, contracts have been awarded to extend the four lanes to complete the connection to Mueschke Road. Construction has already been completed on



Cypresswood Drive past Cypress Lakes Golf Course connecting Mueschke Road to Cypress Rosehill Road. When completed, Cypresswood Drive will provide Fairfield residents a four lane back door route to the Walmart / Walgreens / Lowes shopping areas without having to use US290.

We are Fairfield! - Keying in on the famous Marshall University slogan, I want to encourage you to be sure you have the Fairfield decal on the back windows of all of your automobiles. This decal will enforce

our Fairfield pride to others in the metro area. It is helpful to our patrolling sheriff's deputies to let them know you are a Fairfield resident. This is especially important during the late evening hours when the deputies would not expect a lot of non-resident travel in the subdivision. A copy of the Fairfield decal can be picked up at the Fairfield Information Center on Mason Road at Cypresswood. When you stop in to pick up the decals, take a look around to see the large mockup map of Fairfield. You will find it quite interesting.

Neighborhood Scout earns BSA National Honor Medal



Life Scout Gabriel Roberts, Senior Patrol Leader of Troop 1907 of the Fairfield Baptist Church has been awarded the Boy Scouts of America National Honor Medal for "demonstrating unusual heroism and skill in saving or attempting to save life at considerable risk to self". The incident happened in August 2010 when Gabriel

saved the life of a drowning person even though he was twice pulled under by the panicked swimmer. He remained calm and pulled the person to safety, made sure he was breathing normally, then swam back across the river to retrieve an inner tube in order to ferry him across to help waiting on the bank.

In order to receive an honor of this type, all the facts and witness accounts must be reviewed by two separate independent committees at the council and national level before approval is given. This medal was awarded only 37 times in 2010 and 2,271 times since 1923 when the medal was first awarded. In comparison, over 56,000 boys attained the rank of Eagle Scout during 2010. It is one of the highest honors of heroism a scout can receive from the national office of the BSA. He is to be commended for his bravery and calmness in the face of what could have been a life-threatening situation for both himself and the survivor.

Otherwise, what will those do who are baptized for the dead? If the dead are not raised at all, why then are they baptized for them? (1 Corinthians 15:29).

The Mormon church uses this passage to justify their practice of baptizing people on behalf of deceased family members who did not know God. They are attempting to save them through their own baptisms and good works. Although a straightforward reading seems to promote the practice of baptism for the dead, the entire concept is actually contradicted throughout the whole of Scripture. Salvation does not come to anyone as a result of works (like baptism) but by God's grace alone (Rom. 4:5; Gal. 2:16; Eph. 2:8-9). So being baptized on another's behalf who has passed away is worthless. Each person must make that choice on their own while they live after God compels them to

trust in Jesus Christ (cf. John 1:12; 6:44).


Having already made the case for Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead in vv. 1-11, the Apostle Paul now asks the question about those who are baptized on behalf of the dead in v. 29. Apparently those who took part in that practice were the very ones who denied the bodily resurrection of the dead prompting the resurrection topic in 1 Corinthians 15. There are at least three possibilities for what Paul is talking about in this passage. First, when Paul says, "What will those do who are baptized for the dead" he could be using "baptized" the same way Jesus used it in Mark 10:38 and Luke 12:50 (referring to Christ's enduring God's wrath). This interpretation means that v. 29 should read, "What will those do who are dying the deaths of martyrs and joining the ranks of the dead?" The answer to those people would be that those dying as martyrs were dying in vain if there was no resurrection.

Though their motives were pure in dying for the Christian cause, they would be deluded people for doing so.

A second possibility is that those who are baptized simply refers to Christians, and the "dead" refers to deceased believers. The Greek preposition "for" is then rendered "because of," and the passage would read, "Otherwise, what will Christians do who come to know Christ because of the testimony of saints gone before?" This refers to people who were being saved as a result of the lives of the faithful Christian martyrs. With no resurrection and no hope of life after death, then why are people coming to Christ through of the witness of dead saints?

The third and best possibility is that Paul was sarcastically referring to the cultic practice of baptisms for the dead (i.e., "If you don't believe in the resurrection, then why engage in the practice of baptizing people for

the dead?"). The pagans might have been outwardly ridiculing the concept of resurrection, but inwardly they didn't want to take any chances. So they baptized themselves for the dead. Paul's sarcasm reveals that the practice was so twisted it needed no comment. Furthermore, he does not say "we" practice such a baptism but "they" as he refers to the pagans who did such. This is the best interpretation since it does no injustice to the text, AND throughout 1 Corinthians Paul emphasizes his familiarity with the readers by using first person pronouns ("I" and "we"). Yet in v. 29, he switches to the third person plural pronoun "they."


Any way you slice it the Bible never teaches that baptism saves a person. Water baptism always follows one's conversion to Christ in the Bible, but it isn't necessary for salvation. Salvation comes by God's grace, through faith in Christ, apart from works. Baptism inevitably follows, and although it isn't necessary for salvation, it is commanded in Scripture for Christians.





Salvation: (Greek) sōtēria- deliverance, preservation, safety, salvation, deliverance from the molestation of enemies.

Have you ever struggled with hearing the voice of God? Every Christian has at one time or another. But I know two specific ways to help you discern the leading of the Holy Spirit. The first one is praise and worship. simplicity and generous hearts, Constantly praising God and being in favor and goodwill with all the people; and the Lord kept adding [to their number] daily those who were being saved [from spiritual death]. Acts 2:46-48 AMP

Not only did the early church take communion everyday, but they also had favor with all of the people and God was adding to their church. Does this mean taking communion daily is tied to favor with people and people added to the Kingdom because of the favor? Not sure, but scripturally, it's possible! And, one of the many covenants in the NT is that we will know Jesus' voice and follow it! I know in the OT only certain priests, prophets and kings that God annointed could hear his voice. The Catholics still practice that OT principle and that is why they teach only an ordained Priest can forgive you of your sins and hear from God for the people. But...in the NT Jesus said this:

My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me. And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand. John 10:27-28 NKJV

I looked up the word salvation from Romans 10:

Because if you acknowledge and confess with your lips that Jesus is

Lord and in your heart believe (adhere to, trust in, and rely on the truth) that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart a person believes (adheres to, trusts in, and relies on Christ) and so is justified (declared righteous, acceptable to God), and with the mouth he confesses (declares openly and speaks out freely his faith) and confirms [his] salvation. The Scripture says, No man who believes in Him [who adheres to, relies on, and trusts in Him] will [ever] be put to shame or be disappointed. [No one] for there is no distinction between Jew and Greek. The same Lord is Lord over all [of us] and He generously bestows His riches upon all who call upon Him [in faith]. For everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord [invoking Him as Lord] will be saved. Rom 10:9-13

After Jesus rose from the dead, he came back and took the Lord's Supper with his disciples. After he did the disciples eyes were supernaturally opened:

Eleven-year-old Cait was trying to fall asleep when her 8-year-old brother, Doug, came into her room. He looked around a bit, but seemed really out of it. Then Doug went back into the hallway and stood there staring up at the hall light. Little brothers can be weird, but this was really strange. Cait didn't know what to do. Just then, Cait's father appeared and explained that Doug was sleepwalking.

WHAT IS SLEEPWALKING?

Not all sleep is the same every night. We experience some deep, quiet sleep and some active sleep, which is when dreams happen. You might think sleepwalking would happen during active sleep, but a person isn't physically active during active sleep. Sleepwalking usually happens in the first few hours of sleep in the stage called slow-wave or deep sleep. Not all sleepwalkers actually walk. Some simply sit up or stand in bed or act like they're awake (but dazed) when, in fact, they're asleep! Most, however, do get up and move around for a few seconds or for as long as half an hour.

Sleepwalkers' eyes are open, but they don't see the same way they do when they're awake and often think they're in different rooms of the house or different places altogether. Sleepwalkers tend to go back to bed on their own and they won't remember it in the morning. Researchers estimate that up to 15% of kids sleepwalk regularly. Sleepwalking may run in families and sometimes occurs when a person is sick, has a fever, is not getting enough sleep, or is stressed.

IS SLEEPWALKING A SERIOUS PROBLEM?

If sleepwalking occurs frequently, every night or so, it's a good idea for your mom or dad to take you to see your doctor. But occasional sleepwalking generally isn't something to worry about, although it may look funny or even scary for the people who see a sleepwalker in action. Although occasional sleepwalking isn't a big deal, it's important, of course, that the person is kept safe. Precautions should be taken so the person is less likely to fall down, run into something, or walk out the front door while sleepwalking.

WHAT WILL THE DOCTOR DO?

There's no cure for sleepwalking, but the doctor can talk to you about what's happening and try to find ways to help you sleep more soundly. Most kids just grow out of sleepwalking.

For kids who sleepwalk often, doctors may recommend a treatment called scheduled awakening. This disrupts the sleep cycle enough to help stop sleepwalking. In rare cases, a doctor may prescribe medication to help someone sleep.

HERE ARE SOME TIPS TO HELP PREVENT SLEEPWALKING:

- Relax at bedtime by listening to soft music or relaxation tapes.
- Have a regular sleep schedule and stick to it.
- Keep noise and lights to a minimum while you're trying to sleep.
- Avoid drinking a lot in the evening and be sure to go to the bathroom before going to bed. (A full bladder can contribute to sleepwalking.)

HOW DO I TAKE CARE OF A SLEEPWALKER?

One thing you can do to help is to clear rooms and hallways of furniture or obstacles a sleepwalker might encounter during the night. If there are stairs or dangerous areas, a grown-up should close doors and windows or install safety gates.

You also might have heard that sleepwalkers can get confused and scared if you startle them into being awake. That's true, so what do you do if you see someone sleepwalking? You should call for a grown-up who can gently steer the person back to bed. And once the sleepwalker is tucked back in bed, it's time for you to get some shut-eye, too!
