

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### HOA ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN & REVIEW COMMITTEE NEWS

### ADRC Definition

The Architectural Design and Review Committee (ADRC; aka Architectural Control Committee - ACC) is your neighborhood committee responsible for approving all exterior property modifications. The committee is comprised of three volunteer members who work to conserve the natural beauty of our neighborhood while helping to maintain property values.


As families grow, so does the need for more space. The first place most families utilize is the garage. For some homeowners, using the garage to store equipment and seasonal items isn't always an option. Installing a storage shed in the backyard can help to free up space in the garage. Sheds come in many sizes, colors and materials but not all meet the HOA guidelines. There are several factors to consider when choosing both a shed and its placement. The Avery Ranch Master Declaration of CCR's has very specific rules as to the type and placement of temporary storage buildings.

Homeowners are required to submit an ACC request before installing a storage shed. Here are a few tips to remember so that the process can be made easier. All storage sheds must not be more than 80 square feet in size and cannot be taller than

6 feet from the ground to its highest peak. Storage sheds can not be placed within the setbacks/build lines which can be found on the homeowners plat map that was given at the time of closing. A storage shed must be completely screened and located in a manner as to not be seen from a front or side street. When submitting an application please remember to include all information about your project including the materials used plus paint color info, all dimensions (size of shed – height, length, width and footage of placement from fence lines), and a plat map with a drawing of location of improvement.

The complete rules governing the restrictions of sheds can be found in both the packet that was given at the time of closing and the Avery Ranch HOA website (www.averyranchhoa.com Article III (j)(i)(ii)) front page for a copy of the CCR's).



### Pool Rules

- Persons using pool facilities do so at their own risk. HOA assumes no responsibility for accident, injury or death.
- Pool patrons MUST obey directions given by agent or representative of the HOA.
- Residents and guest must be especially careful in supervising and watching their young children at the pool.
- Pool yard gates may not be propped open or otherwise rendered inoperable, even temporarily.
- No children under the age of 12 will be allowed in the pool at any time, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian to supervise the child and has assumed responsibility for such supervision.
- The pool may be used only between 6:00 a.m. and 10 p.m.
- Pool area is CLOSED from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Entry or use during these hours is trespassing and violators will be prosecuted.
- The pool may be used only by residents and their guests.
- No food or drinks within 5 feet of the pool.
- No food may be served or eaten in the pool area at any time without the HOA's express approval. No glass containers are allowed in the pool area.
- No running, horseplay, fighting, dangerous conduct, or noise which disturbs the other residents is allowed in the pool area.
- No radios, stereos, or musical instruments may be used in or around the pool area.
- Residents and guests must place their own towels over the pool furniture when using suntan oil or other lotions.

- HOA is not responsible for articles which are lost, damaged, or stolen.
- Safety equipment is to be used only in case of an emergency.
- Residents shall be responsible for paying cleanup expenses, repair costs and damages caused by residents and resident's guests.
- Residents should feel free to ask others to cease any violations of these rules. Residents are requested to immediately notify HOA's representative of said rule violations.
- Each Avery Ranch household can bring only 5 guests to the Amenity Center Pool Area.
  - Swim diapers only. No regular diapers allowed.
  - Animals are not allowed in the pool and pool area.
  - Pool will be evacuated during: lightning or contamination by blood, feces or vomit.
  - Parents, guardians, or custodians of a child are totally responsible for the child's compliance with the rules. These rules apply to residents, occupants, guest and their children.
  - Only toys or objects designed for use in the water an less than 30 inches in diameter will be allowed.
  - No smoking is allowed inside the gated pool area.
  - No illegal drugs, firearms or fireworks will be allowed.
  - Avery Ranch residents will lose pool privileges if he/she doesn't follow pool rules.

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

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Kids 'R' Kids wins a prestigious grant For immediate press release

On March 1, 2011, Kids 'R' Kids Learning Academy was awarded the Texas School Ready! grant funding. The center is NAEYC accredited, which is the highest national accreditation conferred on child-care centers. Kids 'R' Kids has demonstrated the ability to implement quality improvement recommendations and suggestions. Time and again, the center has proven to exceed the State's Minimum Licensing standards.

As a result of the grant, the pre-kindergarten classrooms of Kids 'R' Kids will receive a substantial amount of manipulatives, books and will continue to engage children in hands-on learning activities. The grant offers a state approved Pre-K curriculum, a kit designed to assist with classroom management and focuses on teacher mentoring, professional development and preparation.

In previous years, pre-kindergarten classrooms of Kids 'R' Kids have exceeded the learning expectations of Round Rock and Leander school district. The infant, toddler, preschool and after-school classrooms of the center have a seven year track record of implementing research-based instructional models, materials and best practices.

The Pre-kindergarten classroom teachers of Kids 'R' Kids are researchers for the University of Texas's Building Blocks for Science project. The National Science Foundation-funded Building Blocks for Science research study involves extensive classroom observations by teachers and researchers of prekindergarten children's ability to learn science processes and content, delivery of intensive professional development and mentoring support for prekindergarten teachers to earn science, and development of qualitative and quantitative assessment strategies.

Based on continuous parental demand, Kids 'R' Kids will introduce a private kindergarten classroom starting August 2011. The kindergarten classroom will have a reduced student: teacher ratio with a degreed teacher certified in Early Childhood Education. The kindergarten classroom demonstrates the highest standards in early childhood education by following the blue prints of Advanced ED-accreditation, state of the art technology and emphasis on literacy instruction. Registration for the Kindergarten classroom will begin in June.

Foster a Child

Every day hundreds of reports of abuse and neglect are made to Child Protective Services for children living in Central Texas. After being investigated, many of these reports are found to be true and children are immediately removed from their home to ensure their safety.

In 2010 there were 3,148 children in foster care in the Central Texas area. Many studies have documented that the outlook for foster youth who age out of the foster care system, without loving families, is often grim:

- · One in four will be incarcerated within the first two years after they leave the system.
- Over one-fifth will become homeless at some time after age 18.
- Approximately 58 percent had a high school degree at age 19, compared to 87 percent of a national comparison group of nonfoster youth.
- Of youth who aged out of foster care and are over the age of 25, less than 3 percent earned their college degrees5, compared with 28 percent of the general population.

Recently, a six-month-old child came into foster care due to severe abuse from her parent. Her parent abused her so badly she had a skull fracture and three broken fingers. An amazing foster family was contacted and they quickly stepped up to the plate to care for this fragile child. Currently, the child is healing and the doctors expect a full recovery.

A 12 year old came into care after being sexually abused by her father, while her mother looked the other way. After years of being nurtured and loved by a single foster parent, she has now been accepted to college and is eager to become a productive member of society. Meanwhile, she knows she has this foster parent in her court.

These are just two stories of children being given second chances by foster and adoptive parents, several of whom live in the Avery Ranch Community. Each child has their own unique story and deserves a safe and loving home where they can begin to heal and be given the opportunity of childhoods free of abuse and neglect.

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#### HERE'S HOW YOU CAN HELP.

- 1. BECOME A FOSTER PARENT! There is a huge need for safe and loving homes for the children of central Texas. Open your heart and home to a child who desperately needs you.
- 2. BECOME AN ADOPTIVE PARENT! There is a huge need for adoptive parents. Especially for sibling groups and children over the age of two. Make a commitment to a child who deserves a permanent home.

Foster and adoptive parents as well as volunteers come in all shapes and sizes. They are single, they are married, they are newlyweds, they are grandparents. If you are interested in becoming a foster and/or adoptive parent but are worried about finances, it is important to realize that monthly subsidies are provided to parents caring for foster children and adopted children. Also, each child will be covered by Medicaid (covering medical and dental) until the age of 18, even if they are adopted.


It takes a community with loving, nurturing and healing arms to raise a child that has suffered abuse and/or neglect. Will you be part of that community?

### **Gardening:** Don't prune your oak trees yet

Oak Wilt disease is spread by the nitidulid beetle which is most active from February 1 - June 1. For this reason it is strongly suggested that no pruning be done on any variety of Oak tree during these months. During all times of the year, if a cut is made on an Oak tree, it should be immediately painted over with paint...any kind will do, such as a latex spray paint or one that's brushed on... but do it within 10 minutes of making the cut!

Oak Wilt disease is also spread via the root systems underground, which graft together from tree to tree. Once a tree has this disease it can die within a month. I can't imagine our neighborhood without it's beautiful Oak Trees. Please spread the word and do what you can to prevent your trees from getting it!
