

FROM THE WHITE HOUSE

Fairfield Facts-

As of the end of February, there are 4486 homeowner lots in Fairfield. In addition there are 173 lots owned by builders and 312 lots owned by the developer. This brings the current total to 4997 lots in Fairfield. When this community is built out, there will be approximately 5800 to 6000 lots depending on the need for larger or smaller lots in the future. The current number of lots in the various subdivisions is as follows:

**The remaining future lots will be in this subdivision.*

You can see that the developer increased the number of lots in the most recent subdivisions. This helps to reduce the costs per home through the elimination of duplicate subdivision costs. There has been great interest in how many people live in Fairfield. To date, I have not found any specific information in the recent census to give an answer. Based on the three elementary schools and one new junior high school, the number of children per home in Fairfield is quite large. I estimate there are somewhere between 3.2 to 3.6 persons per household. If my estimates are correct, this would make the population of Fairfield to be in the 14,300 to 16,200 range.

CONGRATULATIONS TO FAIRFIELD'S GOOD SHEPHERD METHODIST-

GSMC will be opening a new 32,000 sq. ft. education building around the week of April 4th. This building adds 10 Children classrooms, 10 Adult classrooms, 3 Youth classrooms, 1 Library and a large Assembly Hall. The Assembly Hall is a 3400 sq. ft. two story room in the center of the building with a performance stage and a state of the art sound and lighting system. The existing second floor of the present classroom building is being reconfigured into a great room for junior and senior high youth. This building expansion will be very great addition to the Fairfield community.

What's New for the 2011 Swim Season?

The Fairfield Pool Committee has been very busy preparing for the 2011 swim season. We would like to thank all of you who returned the surveys that were sent out last year. After review of the survey results and comments, the Fairfield Pool committee is excited to announce a couple of changes for 2011.

In response to the community requests for a SAYOR (Swim at Your Own Risk) pool, we are happy to implement this change at the Lakeside Trails pool. Lakeside Trails SAYOR pool will be open for extended hours this summer. The exact hours will be announced in the near future. Please note that there will be NO lifeguards on duty at the Lakeside Trails pool for the 2011 swim season. We will require a separate waiver before pool access will be granted.

As a result of this change and the safety of the community, we will also implement a new electronic access card system to use for entrance to this pool, as well as all other Fairfield community pools, FAC weight room and new park opening in spring/summer 2011. The cards will replace the old swim tags and will be issued to property owners who are up-to-date with Fairfield and Neighborhood Association dues. It could take up to two weeks from receipt of final payment to issue cards. There will be more information to follow on the access levels and method of issuing these cards. 




Dear Residents,


Harvest Bible Church

"For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. For one will scarcely die for a righteous person – though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die – but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:6-8).

Once a Christians understands his standing before Christ as one made righteous by faith, he will live with complete assurance in the eternal security Christ provides (cf. John 10:28). Over time his sufferings produce endurance which give him proof that his salvation is genuine, and that proof produces hope – a personal certainty which comes from God's love being poured into him via the Holy Spirit (Rom. 5:1-5). Hope will never put believers to shame: "Indeed, none who wait for [God] shall be put to shame... Oh, guard my soul, and deliver me! Let me not be put to shame, for I take refuge in You. May integrity and uprightness preserve me, for I wait for you" (Ps. 25:3, 20-21). God says in Isaiah 28:16: "Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone of stumbling, and a rock of offense; and whoever believes in Him will not be put to shame" (cf. Rom. 9:33; 1 Pet. 2:6). This certainty comes from the Holy Spirit who seals believers for eternity (Eph. 4:30), who is the guarantee of future redemption (2 Cor. 1:21-22; Eph. 1:13-14). The Holy Spirit indwells them (Rom. 8:9), guides them, and delivers them (cf. 1 John 3:24; 4:13).

The character of God's love, poured out in full measure to all Christians, explains why those who trust in God can be assured of their salvation in 5:6-8. Verse 8 teaches that God "shows His love" which means that God's love is a verb. The display of His love in 5:6-8 has four characteristics. First, God's love through Christ's death was for the "weak" – a reference to man's moral depravity and inability to save himself (cf. Rom. 3:10-18). So, Christ did for man what man could not do. Second, He died "at the right time" which refers to God's appointed time for Christ's death (cf. Gal. 4:4). Third, God's display of His love was "for the ungodly" which of course includes all of mankind since all are ungodly (Rom. 4:5). Fourth, God demonstrated His love for mankind by sending Christ to die for them "while we were still sinners." Christ died in the place of sinners so as to take their punishment upon Himself.

Jesus pointed out that even the pagans could be expected to die on behalf of a family member they loved (Matt. 5:46). The Apostle Paul likewise said that a person might consider dying on behalf of a good man, but *(Continued on Page 49)*

no one in their right mind would die to save a scoundrel! Yet Jesus did. While man was ungodly, weak, and sinning freely, Christ took his punishment—death on a cross—to save those who would submit to Him. His death proves God's love for all of mankind, but those who fail to receive Christ and submit to Him as Lord can only enjoy God's love as long as they live. When they die His love ceases to be upon them. It is then that they become the objects of His wrath for scorning His wondrous love in His Son Jesus Christ.

C.C. Hodge said, "If God loved us because we loved Him, He would love us only so long as we love Him, and on that condition. Then our salvation would depend on the constancy of our treacherous hearts. But as God loved us as sinners, as Christ died for us as ungodly, our salvation depends, as the Apostle argues, not on our loveliness, but on the constancy of the love of God." If you are one who has trusted Christ as Lord and Savior, then God's love is abundant within you. And since God's love is a verb – one that transcends emotions – ought not ours be the same? Demonstrate your love for others today – even your enemies. Do something that only a redeemed Christian can do. Show the world and yourself that God's love abides within you.






Spring Landscaping & Gardening Tips

Here in Houston it's time to start planning for the soon to come spring garden activities. For those of you who need a little guidance on what your landscape needs will be and some helpful hints to properly prepare we have outlined some of the most commonly asked questions. The following suggestions can help yield the desired results for you and your neighbors.

Before the weather starts to warm up have a plan to keep your landscape properly watered, this is very important. Those of you that have an automatic irrigation system can take advantage of this time to check it and make sure all repairs have been made prior to the extreme conditions we will face in the summer. Remember to set your irrigation controller to water between the hours of 2:00am and 6:30am. For those of you that do not have the benefit of an automatic irrigation system you will need to come up with a way to water with hoses and portable sprinklers. We suggest trying to use more than one sprinkler at a time if possible, this will save you some time. Set a schedule that will allow you to water in the early evening, when the sun is starting to set. Even though the best time to water is early in the morning this watering time may fit better in your daily schedule while still allowing you to help prevent the loss of water due to evaporation. Also make sure your hoses are in good condition and have no leaks. Don't over water and make sure your sprinklers are adjusted; this will help conserve water. The most important thing to consider is to evaluate the needs of your landscape and water accordingly.

Another item that many people have questions about is the type of fertilizer they should use and when to apply it. In our opinion, the most beneficial formulation for a spring lawn fertilizer with a post emergent, to take care of broadleaf weeds, would be the Scott's 29-3-4 blend with Atrizene. Another formulation we would recommend that is a well balanced lawn fertilizer without any post emergent would be a 15-5-10 blend. Both of these fertilizers will promote a healthy green lawn. There are also special formulated fertilizers for your hibiscus, azaleas, camellias, bougainvilleas and other plant material that have special needs. All or most of these fertilizers can be found at your local lawn and garden centers as well as the Home Depot located along FM 518. Fertilizer needs to be applied at the rate recommended on the label, using the recommended spreader. Please remember (Continued on Page 53)

one thing, "more is not better", especially when comes to fertilizers blended to control weeds with herbicides. Fertilizers should be applied during the first two weeks in March. After the fertilizer is applied make sure to wash down or sweep off concrete walks and driveways, this will help prevent discoloration caused from iron.

If you have any perennial plant material, such as ornamental grasses, groundcover or other such plants, cut back these plants to a one inch stub after the last chance of freezing temperatures. Other plants that have been damaged from the cold weather may need to be trimmed instead of cut back. The trimming required for these plants may be minor; this will be up to you. Crepe myrtles will also need to be trimmed not cut back. When trimming your crepe myrtles remove any rubbing branches and deadwood then trim only the tips that are no larger than approximately ¹/₄ of an inch.

We recommend mulching all beds and tree wells, doing this protects your plant's root system as well as adds a rich clean look to your landscaped beds. Apply the mulch after you have completed all of your trimming and cutting back any of your perennials. Try not to apply more than two inches of mulch at one time.

Spring is a great time to start enjoying your lawn and all of your hard work; however this is just the beginning of our growing season and all of the work it takes to have a beautifully landscaped yard.

Enjoy your spring garden work!

FINANCIAL FOCUS Sandwich Generation Needs "Stress Busters"



You may be too busy to realize it, but April is Stress Awareness Month. Sponsored by the Health Resource Network, a non-profit health education group, Stress Awareness Month is designed to promote awareness about ways to reduce stress in our lives. And if you're a member of the so-called "Sandwich Generation," you may well have plenty of stress to deal with — especially financial stress. And that's why you may want to look at this month as an opportunity to explore ways of "de-stressing" yourself.

To understand the scope of the problem facing people in your situation, consider this: One out of every eight Americans aged 40 to 60 is both raising a child and caring for an aging parent, according to the Pew Research Center. The definition of "caring" for an elderly parent can range from actually having the parent living in one's home to helping pay for the parent's stay in an assisted living or nursing home facility. When you consider the costs involved in this type of care, added to the expenses of raising your children, and possibly even providing some financial support to them as young adults, it's easy to see that you could potentially face enormous strains, both emotionally and financially.

To help ease this burden, consider these suggestions:

- Save. As a Sandwich Generation member, you're probably within shouting distance of your own retirement - so you need to be saving for it. This may not be easy. You don't know how much financial support you may someday have to provide your elderly parents - and even after your children are grown, they may need some help from you. Unfortunately, in helping these "boomerang" children, many people have to disrupt their day-to-day cash flow and raid their savings. That's why it's important to try to "pay yourself first" by deferring part of each paycheck into your 401(k) and by automatically moving money, each month, from your checking or savings account into your IRA.
- Talk. Many people in the "Greatest Generation" (over age 80) have not even

prepared a will, so, if your parents are in that group, you may want to talk to them about taking action. Also, find out whom, if anyone, is handling their investments. And ask if your parents understand how Medicare works and if they need to add supplemental health insurance, such as Medigap. Plus, you need to find out if your parents have created a power of attorney or health care directive. It's best to have these conversations sooner, rather than later.

 Delegate. You eventually may have to take some responsibility for your parents' care

 but you don't have to do it alone. You could, for example, work with a financial services provider that offers trust services, which can be invaluable if your parents are incapacitated, but which are useful even if they aren't. A professional trust officer can, among other duties, help manage your parents' investments, pay their bills, keep their records and supervise distribution of their assets to beneficiaries. In short, a qualified trust officer can make life a lot easier for you.

Stress Awareness Month only lasts 30 days, but by taking the right steps, you can de-stress yourself for many years to come. After all, just because you're in the Sandwich Generation, it doesn't mean you have to be "squished."
