ASKTHE BOARD

Question: I'm interested in replacing the two large pine trees that are in our front yard. Since we must remove these trees to protect our property, we would request your help in letting us know what if any deed restrictions, conditions, limitations, etc. that we must comply with in order to prevent problems with the HOA.

Answer: Please visit www.silverlakehoa.com to complete a home improvement form to indicate the removal and replacement of the trees in your front yard. Removal of trees in your community requires ARC approval and must be replaced with hard wood trees.



Question: We are thinking about repainting the outside of our house with the same color it was painted by the builder. Do we have to submit the architectual review form?

Answer: If you are painting your home the exact same colors with no variation an approval is not necessary however it is recommended that you apply so that in the future if you sell your home the current owners will know what paint colors were used on your home.

Question: Please let me know how to get an access card to the tennis court. I am a silverlake resident.

Answer: You may obtain the amenity access form and instructions by visiting www.silverlakehoa.com under the documents section.

Apply Before You Improve

Just driving throughout Silverlake, one can see that the properties are well maintained by the proud homeowners, that's what keeps Silverlake looking so good. As our homes get a little older and we settle into our lives, it's only natural that you'll want to make improvements to your home. Perhaps you'll finally get those solar screens you've been thinking about, paint your home, add a play structure for the kids or even replace your roof. These are all big ticket items, so it is in your best interest to do your homework prior to changing the outside of your home.

Did you know that all of the above home improvements and many others must be approved by the Architectural Review Committee ("ARC") prior to beginning work on your home? Failure to obtain approval before work is started can be a costly mistake to the homeowner. In order to maintain the well-groomed appearance of Silverlake, there are specific home improvement guidelines that must be adhered to by all homeowners.

The HOA board is currently working on updating the ARC guidelines which will clarify some of the problem areas that we have run into in the past. The current set of guidelines can be found at www. silverlakehoa.com and will be updated once the new guidelines are completed.

The Board strongly urges you to review the guidelines and ask questions if you don't understand a specific section. Both the ARC Committee and the Board can help you through this process. We would hate to have to deny completed work on your property after you've spent so much time, energy and money to make unapproved changes to your property.

Spring Landscaping & Gardening Tips

Here in Houston it's time to start planning for the soon to come spring garden activities. For those of you who need a little guidance on what your landscape needs will be and some helpful hints to properly prepare we have outlined some of the most commonly asked questions. The following suggestions can help yield the desired results for you and your neighbors.

Before the weather starts to warm up have a plan to keep your landscape properly watered, this is very important. Those of you that have an automatic irrigation system can take advantage of this time to check it and make sure all repairs have been made prior to the extreme conditions we will face in the summer. Remember to set your irrigation controller to water between the hours of 2:00am and 6:30am. For those of you that do not have the benefit of an automatic irrigation system you will need to come up with a way to water with hoses and portable sprinklers. We suggest trying to use more than one sprinkler at a time if possible, this will save you some time. Set a schedule that will allow you to water in the early evening, when the sun is starting to set. Even though the best time to water is early in the morning this watering time may fit better in your daily schedule while still allowing you to help prevent the loss of water due to evaporation. Also make sure your hoses are in good condition and have no leaks. Don't over water and make sure your sprinklers are adjusted; this will help conserve water. The most important thing to consider is to evaluate the needs of your landscape and water accordingly.

Another item that many people have questions about is the type of fertilizer they should use and when to apply it. In our opinion, the most beneficial formulation for a spring lawn fertilizer with a post emergent, to take care of broadleaf weeds, would be the Scott's 29-3-4 blend with Atrizene. Another formulation we would recommend that is a well balanced lawn fertilizer without any post emergent would be a 15-5-10 blend. Both of these fertilizers will promote a healthy green lawn. There are also special formulated fertilizers for your hibiscus, azaleas, camellias, bougainvilleas and other plant material that have special needs. All or most of these fertilizers can be found at your local lawn and garden centers as well as the Home Depot located along FM 518. Fertilizer needs to be applied at the rate recommended on the label, using the recommended spreader. Please remember one thing, "more is not better", especially when comes to fertilizers blended to control weeds with herbicides. Fertilizers should be applied during the first two weeks in March. After the fertilizer is applied make sure

IT'S ALMOST POOL TIME!

The 2011 pool season is just around the corner! The HOA wants to make sure that all residents who want to enjoy the pools are aware of what they need to do to use the pools this year.

If you already have an access card and are in good standing, the only thing you will need to do is just show up at the pool with your access card in hand. You'll be able to use the pool and tennis courts. In addition, Southwyck Section I (4805 Northfork Road) and Southwyck Section IV (3131 Morgan Road) pools have the same access entry system so your Silverlake access card will allow you to access those pools also.


If you are new to Silverlake or you do not have an access card, you will need to complete the 2011 Registration and Indemnification form; go to the Silverlake HOA website at: www.silverlakehoa. com. Fill out the form completely and mail to: Silverlake HOA, P.O. Box 219223, Houston, TX 77218. PCMI will process your information and mail an access card to you. You will not be able to pick up your cards from PCMI in person. The first card per

household will be issued at no charge. All family members can be admitted with one card, and two guests are allowed into the pool per card. Each additional access card or replacement card is available at a cost of \$20.00 per card.

In addition, you will not be eligible to receive your access card or use any of the pools, tennis courts or other community amenities if there is a delinquency on your account. Please make sure your account is current. Any unauthorized persons using the facilities or those not adhering to the posted rules will be removed by the Brazoria County Sheriff's Department.

Poseidon Pools has been re-contracted this year. We will again have monthly "Dive-In Movie" nights as well as other fun and games. We hope that this will be another summer to remember at Silverlake!

to wash down or sweep off concrete walks and driveways, this will help prevent discoloration caused from iron.

If you have any perennial plant material, such as ornamental grasses, groundcover or other such plants, cut back these plants to a one inch stub after the last chance of freezing temperatures. Other plants that have been damaged from the cold weather may need to be trimmed instead of cut back. The trimming required for these plants may be minor; this will be up to you. Crepe myrtles will also need to be trimmed not cut back. When trimming your crepe myrtles remove any rubbing branches and deadwood then trim only the tips that are no larger than approximately ¹/₄ of an inch.

We recommend mulching all beds and tree wells, doing this protects your plant's root system as well as adds a rich clean look to your landscaped beds. Apply the mulch after you have completed all of your trimming and cutting back any of your perennials. Try not to apply more than two inches of mulch at one time.

Spring is a great time to start enjoying your lawn and all of your hard work; however this is just the beginning of our growing season and all of the work it takes to have a beautifully landscaped yard.

Prescription Drug Take-Back Day

On April 30, 2011 from 10am to 4pm, DEA and its community partners will take part in a nationwide prescription drug take-back, operating collection sites around the nation where Americans can turn in their unused, unneeded, and/or expired prescription medications. Unused or expired prescription medications are a public safety issue, leading to accidental poisoning, overdose, and abuse. This service is free and anonymous. Tablets, capsules, and all other solid dosage forms will be collected. Intravenous solutions, injectables, and syringes will not be accepted. MILDEW STAINS ON DRIVEWAY, SIDEWALKS AND SIDING



This is the time of year when Houston homeowners begin to be plagued by mildew and dirt build up. It commonly shows up on the bricks or concrete on the north walls or side of the home, though any sheltered place that can stay damp will foster the growth of the unsightly green-to-black fungal nemesis.

The mildew stains can normally be removed without great difficulty by treating the affected areas with any anti-fungal or anti-mildew material available at local hardware stores. Many area homeowners have found a mixture of bleach and TSP (tri-sodium phosphate) to be an effective removal agent when brushed on and hosed off. For treatment of extensive areas of mildew growth, power-washing is the recommended approach. So our homes and the community can be kept as visually pleasing as possible, you are asked to inspect your homes, especially the north side walls, patio walls, mailboxes and entryways, and try to remove any mildew spotted.

Listed below are some tips to help you remove the mildew, and dirt off your investment.

ITEMS NEEDED:

Bleach (mix with water) 3 parts water to 1 part bleach Pressure Washer with at least 2600 PSI Ladder (if your home is two story) & Safety Goggles

Dear Stressed,

When people ask me what I do for a living, they are often surprised when I say I am a Stress Manager. For my athletes, we must stress the muscles, tendons, and the mind so that when they go to competition, their bodies are prepared. Without stressing the body, those muscles will shrink and for many former athletes, there is an increase in the midsection.

Ask the Coach

For my fitness clients, they have seen the evils of too much stress. Our bodies adapted to a lifestyle of "fight or flight". Today, our lifestyles have changed a lot. We can't just run from our bosses or fight them, so the sugar that was released in our bloodstream just gets reabsorbed back as fat around the stomach.

You need to find a way to incorporate exercise into your daily work schedule. When you feel yourself getting stressed, take a brisk few minute walk around the office or in the stairwell. I have some clients that have brought a jump rope to work and sneak into the conference room. You may feel awkward at first, but you will feel better when you battle the bad stress of work with the good stress of working out your muscles. 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

It's Tax Time (Again)!

The holiday decorations have been packed away and the refrigerator is finally free of leftovers, so what's next in our busy lives? One task is to get ready to file your 2010 tax return. I know, this is a chore we all hate doing, but it has to be done.

One way you can make it easier on yourself is to organize early. The end of the month will be here before you know it, so set up a file, or shoebox, to hold all of the information you should start to receive in the mail from your employers, banks and brokerage firms. There's nothing worse than sitting down to do your taxes and realizing you can't find a Form 1099 from that bank account you opened ten years ago.

If you claim a home office on your return, start gathering a listing of the expenses to run your home, such as electric, water, HOA dues, etc. You may be able to claim them on your return.

If you itemize, don't forget you'll need to gather the documentation for your unreimbursed medical expenses, mortgage interest, real estate taxes, (sorry, HOA dues is not deductible) and contributions. If you've incurred job searching costs, those items might also be deductible. Did you purchase a vehicle during 2010? If so, don't forget to claim the sales tax! Do your children go to daycare or after-school programs because you work? Well, don't forget to get the documentation from the day care provider so you can claim the credit on your return! You'll need the name, address, employer identification or social security number of the provider to claim the credit.

By no means does this list cover everything, but it is a starting point. So start early and prepare for this year's tax filing. Whether you do your return or pay a professional to do it for you, the sooner its over, the better.


