## **Developers Update**

#### SUBDIVISION DEVELOPMENT

Taylor Woodrow Communities recently completed development on the final 26 lots in the Mediterra neighborhood of 60' wide homesites for Taylor Morrison Homes and has completed the final 47 - 80' lots in Emerald Ridge, also for Taylor Morrison Homes. The next phase of 24 - 70' lots in Palisades are under development with completion expected in May. Stop by the Taylor Morrison model homes in Mediterra, Palisades and Emerald Ridge for more information on the available homesites, including many lots backing to greenbelts.

Custom lot sales continue in The Bluffs on south Quinlan Park Rd., Bellagio Estates on Lake Austin, and in the newest phase of the golf community, Shoreview Overlook, at the end of University Club Drive. For more information on these custom homesites and all other builder neighborhoods in Steiner Ranch you may contact the Welcome Center at 266-5833. The Welcome Center has new days of operation for 2011 – closed on Monday and Tuesday, but open on Wednesday through Saturday - 9:30 to 5:30, and Sunday - 11:30 to 5:30.

#### COMMERCIAL/MIXED-USE DEVELOPMENT

Quinlan Crossing Development at Quinlan Park Rd & RM 620 – As most everyone has seen by now, Property Development Centers (PDC), a commercial/retail developer, has received their City/County development permits and has begun site development for the Quinlan Crossing retail/office project at the southwest corner of Quinlan Park Rd and RM 620 that will be anchored by an upscale Randall's grocery store (Mixed Use #1A on Master Plan Map). The developer is negotiating with additional anchor tenants for this site but has not announced any specifics. They also have not announced an estimated completion date for the first phase including the Randall's grocery store.

The other very visible "new" development is The Fairways condominiums site grading off of University Club Drive. Taylor Morrison has acquired the 82 remaining units from the bank that had foreclosed on the original builder. Sales are well underway with 13 units already pre-sold. Taylor Morrison is offering homes ranging in size from 2,000 to 2,800 square feet with many one-story floor plans and the units fronting on the 3rd through 6th holes on the UT Golf Club course.

Taylor Woodrow Communities continues to receive interest from various developers for the remaining mixed-use development sites in Steiner Ranch. Vintage Fine Homes has completed city/county site plan approvals to build approximately 20 patio homes on Tract #18 along Steiner Ranch Blvd. across from the Monterone apartments. With the slow down in the local housing market they still have not announced a timeframe to begin construction on this site. Also, pre-leasing continues on the retail/office mixed use development on Tract #4 at the southwest corner of Quinlan Park Rd and Steiner Ranch Blvd.

## 😪 Steiner Ranch History Corner 🍣

### Why is Marshall Ford on my Phone Bill?

If you ever stop to examine your landline or cell phone bill for itemized calls you will likely see a lot of calls going to Marshall Ford or originating in Marshall Ford. A few years ago the wife of my business associate Bob who lives in Houston called my home and asked who lived there. It's a long story, but she noticed that her husband was making a lot of calls to someone in Marshall Ford, Texas and she was checking it out. Once we figured out who each of us were, we had a good laugh about it and of course we teased Bob unmercifully in the office after that.

In fact, Steiner Ranch is in the vicinity of the old Marshall Ford, which is now known as a resort and fishing area on Lake Travis. There is a community of homes which shares the name, as well as a marina and a local swing band. The original ford or low-water crossing of the Colorado River was used for many years to connect the agricultural and ranching areas of the western part of Travis County with Austin. There was a trading center and supply point in the bend of the river which became the local market for cedar timber and posts. In 1934 the area was taken over by the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA), and Mansfield Dam was built as the key flood-control structure in a series of dams in the Colorado basin.

A post office opened at Marshall Ford in 1937 with Jack S. Beauchamp as postmaster. You could say that just as the community was taking off in terms of population and vitality the unfortunate timing of Mansfield Dam put the area under water. The engineers changed the course of the river somewhat and then later the area flooded. This loss of a ford across the river caused some hardship for the cedar choppers. The post office was discontinued in 1942, and mail for the community was sent to Austin. There is still a low-water crossing below the dam but it is not in the original location of Marshall Ford and it's essentially a private drive. Source: Texas State Historical Association. 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## **Trails Update**

Sping on our trails is a wonderful time. The songbirds are coming back and the trees are starting to bud again. Recently the HOA has had to advise some individuals who wished to organize rides or hikes and also to publicize them. Remember your trails are totally private and are for residents' use and for your accompanied guests only. While organized activities are allowed to be posted by residents, the posting must include the words, "Steiner Ranch trails are private and for resident use only." Postings cannot include the Steiner Ranch logo.

Remember organized hikes of groups larger than three are never allowed in the Balcones Preserve land of Steiner Ranch. Neither are bikes or dogs allowed in the Preserve.

If you see any organized activity for Steiner Ranch posted at a bike store or on a web site, click "Report a Problem" on the HOA web site at http://www.steinerranchhoa.org or contact the HOA at 266-7553.

Geocaching in the greenbelt is not permissible because going offtrail anywhere on the greenbelt is not allowed by the HOA restrictions and for safety reasons. This clearly means that going off-trail in order to plant and retrieve geocaches is not permitted. Geocaching is fine in the parks and fields as long as it doesn't interfere with sports practices or games. Is your favorite trail in need of repair or in need of better sign locations? If you see a problem on the trails, call the HOA at 266-7553 or visit http://www.steinerranchhoa.org under "Report A Problem." Be specific about the location on the trail, the problem you see, your ideas for a solution, and your contact information. DIY trail maintenance: If you see a branch hanging over the trail where it could be hazardous, just bring a hand saw on your next trip and cut it off. Note that any other cutting is never allowed in the greenbelts. Only your HOA is allowed to make trail repairs or reroutes - see below.

Construction of any kind is not allowed on the greenbelts or along trails. Your HOA dollars are wasted paying for labor

to remove structures such as forts, and the responsible parties are subject to fines. If you see any construction, take a picture and contact the HOA.

Only the HOA is authorized to create trails in Steiner Ranch. Unfortunately, someone has been cutting down trees in our greenbelt trying to make rogue trail. These *(Continued on Page 23)*

are not authorized trails and are actually dangerous routes. We don't wish to spend your HOA money trying to close and revegetate rogue trails. Instead, we want to hear from those who want new trails because we are actively looking at routes within Steiner to expand our trail system. Would you like to help us plan new trails? Contact your trails committee to get involved or come to the next Trails Committee meeting on Thursday April 14 at 7PM at Bella Mar. All residents are welcome to attend. To get connected here and volunteer your skills, contact the trails committee at (512) 632-0162.

If you see any rogue trail cutting or dangerous activity, including motorcycles anywhere on the trails or in the parks, take a picture and call the Travis County Sheriff West Command at (512) 854-9728 and the HOA. Remember, your trails are private and are for your use, and your accompanied guests' use only.

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## **Greenbelt Tree Cutting**

One aspect of Steiner Ranch that makes it such a beautiful place to live is the extensive amount of natural greenbelts that surround each of the neighborhoods. There are some homeowners that love the greenbelts just the way they are. And then there are other homeowners that might have a bit of a view of Lake Austin or of a valley so they would like to cut down a few trees. That is a request that the Architectural Committee (the "AC") will consider approving within certain parameters.

Approval by the AC is required BEFORE any disturbance to the greenbelt. The greenbelts are private property of the HOA. Disturbing the greenbelt without prior written approval by the AC will result in fines that could cost the offending homeowner thousands of dollars, plus the cost to replace the trees that were cut down. Other additional fines and penalties could be enforced depending on the severity of the disturbance.

Please help us maintain the beautiful, natural trees and vegetation we are so fortunate to have throughout Steiner Ranch. If you back to a greenbelt and would like to remove some cedar trees, please submit a request to the AC before you do any cutting.

students in a building that is too small and ill equipped. Desks and books are scarce. They have a very poor water supply and rare medical care. They have no soccer field, balls or toys. With the money that Steiner Ranch Elementary has generated, this will all change. A group of 20 people will travel to Bolivia in April of this year to give the students a new building, water supply, medical clinic, desks, books, soccer field, balls and toys. Included in this group are three Steiner Ranch residents, Erin Newman, her 5th grade son Ethan Newman who attends SRE and Gayle Morris. Erin, Ethan and Gayle are part of a charitable corporation called A.B.L.E., Inc, (Assisting Better Living Everywhere) that initiated the Students Helping Students project at SRE. A.B.L.E., Inc. was started approximately two years ago by Erin's father, Ed Todd and friends in Lexington, Kentucky where A.B.L.E.'s headquarters reside. A.B.L.E. also has a chapter right here in Steiner Ranch. A.B.L.E. is 501 (c) (3) approved. It is completely staffed by volunteers and focuses on helping improve living conditions around the world. A.B.L.E. travelers pay for their own trips. For more information

## **Sidestepping Solicitors**

Annoyed by the persistence of solicitors' unwelcome knocks on the door? It seems like no matter what they do, they always manage to show up on your front porch. They come with fliers, door hangers, a rehearsed speech and the distinct ability to ignore the polite decline of the products they're peddling—cleaning supplies, appliances, cosmetics, magazine subscriptions, home-improvement products, coupons for local businesses and other unwanted items—sometimes even making you feel trapped in your own home.

Steiner Ranch is a particularly attractive and frequent target of commercial, religious and political solicitors; part of the appeal is that population density makes our community an easy environment for them to canvas. Because of this, finding a way to keep solicitors away can be invaluable.

The simplest way to deter solicitors is by posting a "No Solicitors" sign on your door or in your front window. If you get knocks on the door anyway, you also can ask solicitors for their license, permit or company identification; many don't have it and will leave.

While a visit from a solicitor is often annoying, they can sometimes be more than just a nuisance; some might have ulterior motives, such as fraud, canvassing a home to commit a crime or other unseemly behavior. If you believe a solicitor is acting suspiciously or you feel threatened, call the Travis County Sheriff's Office immediately at 974-0845.

So stay safe, keep your sanity and do your part in discouraging solicitors from trolling our community. You'll soon hear just how sweet an un-rung doorbell sounds.

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

1/2 C brown sugar, packed 4 T soy sauce 4 T hot water 4 T miso (soybean paste) Salmon, either fillets or slab - your preference 1 T olive oil 1 T fresh chives, chopped cooked Jasmine Rice 2 T ginger, peeled and minced 1 T shallots, minced 1 T butter 1/2 C + 1 t Sake 1 T heavy cream 1/2 C butter, diced 1/2 t lime juice salt to taste **DIRECTIONS:** 

Preheat grill or broiler, depending on how you plan to cook the salmon. Combine brown sugar, soy, hot water and miso in a bowl, stirring well. Marinate for 10 minutes. Arrange salmon on baking sheet or on grill, brushed with olive oil so it doesn't stick. Grill or broil for 10 minutes or until fish flakes easily when tested with a fork, basting with the miso sauce during the cooking process. Sprinkle with chives.

While cooking the salmon, start the sake butter. In a small saucepan over medium-low heat, sweat the ginger and shallots with the 1 T of butter. Add 1/2 C Sake and simmer for 3 minutes. Add the heavy cream, stir and simmer for an additional 3 minutes. Add the diced butter, bit by bit, whisking constantly to incorporate. Remove from heat and whisk in the additional 1 t of Sake, lime juice and salt. To plate, make a bed of Jasmine Rice, Salmon and Sake Butter and serve!

## The Mess in the Mailbox

Disgusted by all of those unsolicited credit card offers clogging up your mailbox? Tired of lugging catalogs and junk mail to the recycling bin? All of this unwanted mail creates nothing but headaches and wasted paper, so it's no wonder putting an end to it is a priority for many people. While you can't eliminate everything, you can noticeably reduce the avalanche of paper in your mailbox just by picking up the phone or hopping online.

Here are a few simple ways to put a kibosh on the heaps of junk mail that keep piling up:

So Long, Pre-Screened Credit Offers: If your credit is anywhere near good, credit bureaus— Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion—are selling your name to credit card companies as a hot prospect. That's why you're getting those "you've been pre-approved" offers every day.

Put an end to it by calling 1-888-5-OPT-OUT (1-888-567-8688). You will need to provide your name, address, telephone number, Social Security number and date of birth to ensure your opt-out request matches your credit record rather than someone else who shares your name. You can also opt out via the Internet at: www.optoutprescreen.com/ opt\_form.cgi.

If you prefer not to disclose your Social Security number and date of birth, the online form does not require this information. However, the website strongly urges you to provide this information because it helps ensure that your request will be processed correctly, and it protects your information from unauthorized access.

Opting out is good for five years. However, if you'd like your name removed permanently, you will be mailed a confirmation form within about five business days to sign and return. For more information see the FTC's Facts for Consumers, Prescreened Offers of Credit and Insurance at www.ftc.gov/bcp/edu/pubs/ consumer/credit/cre17.shtm

Remember, this won't stop all credit offers only those that result from screening your credit report. Your bank or credit card company may still send you offers for new credit or share information about you with other companies.

Although you don't have total control over the information that's shared by financial companies, you do have some. For more on how to limit data sharing by banks and other financial institutions, read the Privacy Rights Clearing house Fact Sheet 24, Protecting Financial Privacy in the New Millennium: The Burden Is on You, at www.privacyrights. org/fs/fs24-finpriv.htm.

Jettison the Junk Mail: You can reduce other types of junk mail—magazine offers, sweepstakes and other national advertising mail—by contacting the Direct Marketing Association's (DMA) Mail Preference Service (MPS). This opt-out lasts for five years and can be renewed. Go to www.dmachoice.org/ dma/member/regist.action. There is no charge for registering online. For those who want to want to register via USPS, send \$1 check or money order to the Mail Preference Service, *(Continued on Page 49)*

PO Box 643, Carmel NY 10512. (See their sample letter available at: www.privacyrights.org/Letters/letters.htm#Junk\_Mail.) The MPS will put you into the "delete" file, which is sent to subscribing organizations several times a year.

Cut Out the Catalogs: When you buy something from a mailorder catalog, your transaction is likely to be reported to Abacus, a company that compiles a cooperative database of catalog and publishing companies' customers. Your name is then sold to other mail-order companies that send you catalogs and offers. This explains why you are likely to receive several unsolicited catalogs after ordering anything by mail.

To opt out of the Abacus database, write to Abacus, P.O. Box 1478, Broomfield, CO 80038 or email abacusoptout@epsilon.com. Include your full name and current address (and previous address if you have moved recently). For more information, visit www.abacusoptout.com.

You'll have to notify companies yourself that do not participate in the DMA and Abacus opt-out programs. Contact the customer service department and request that your name and address not be shared with other companies. Contact magazines, charities, nonprofit organizations and professional associations to which you have either donated money or joined.

It may take a few months to see results, but eventually the mess in your mailbox will thin out.
