I'm not just the Whiteshark Coach, I'm also a Whiteshark Dad. Usually when I write a newsletter article I'm talking to you as Coach Jon, diehard coach of the Whitesharks. This time I thought I would write to you as Jon, Swim Dad. Sure, I have mentioned my kids in previous articles, but always as Coach Jon (which, by the way, my kids start calling me by the end of the season, even at home!). Now I can tell my story from the perspective of a Whiteshark parent.

You could say we are a "swim family." Mindy and I swam competitively growing up, then on our varsity teams in college, and we still swim and even compete today. Naturally I want my kids to swim, but like any good parent, I don't push it. My kids swim because they love it, and they swim because of the Whitesharks. Even when we swim in the winter and spring, it's all about getting ready for the Whitesharks. David has improved through the summers and has had a great time, which are the two most important goals of the Whitesharks. As a parent, I love that about the Whitesharks.

Caroline started swimming last summer. My little social child was more interested in talking than swimming most of the time, but many of the Whitesharks are there for the social side of the sport, and that's great too. Caroline improved tremendously, and strangely enough for two breaststroke parents, she has turned into quite a little backstroker. I can't help but burst with pride as she swims, "That's my girl!". This summer I know I will burst with pride again as little Leah also climbs up on those blocks and launches herself into the pool for a race.

True to Whiteshark spirit, other parents cheer for my kids as well. We all cheer for each other's kids, it's one of those things that makes the Whitesharks special. It's social time for us as well. We get to hang out as we watch our kids swim (OK, so I don't get to hang out as much as some of the other parents, but I get to be social sometimes too). I know parents who are sad when their kids decide that they don't want to do swim team again. Actually, we all are. The Whitesharks is it's own little family, and we don't like to see anyone leave. The Whitesharks have great retention, about the best in the league, but we still lose some of our swimmers to other activities, or frustratingly, to their cozy bed on Saturday mornings (I still don't understand this. of branches. Fill half full with fertilizer, balance with soil, then water thoroughly. All roses, shrubs and plants. Azaleas AFTER blooming. Camellias lightly. PEST CONTROL: Spray roses and shrubs if infested with scale. Watch closely for aphids, red spiders, and cut worms on new growth. Treat immediately with formula recommended by your favorite nurseryman. Spray azaleas 2 or 3 times a week during blooming season to avoid petal blight. Spray camellias for tea scale. PRUNE: Finish pruning roses and dormant shrubs and trees. Azaleas AFTER

BULBS: Beginning in February, plant **gladioli** every two weeks through May for succession of summer blooms. Planting may be resumed in July, continuing through September for fall blooms. Bed should be of rich, sandy garden soil in a location that is well drained and has at least 6 hours of sun. Work lots of organic

matter and bonemeal into soil. Avoid fresh manure with all bulbs.

Select bulbs that are an inch thick and about 11/2" in diameter. Dust

bulbs with insecticide before planting. Water freely and feed with a liquid fertilizer once a week from the time the stalks begin to

lengthen until they show color. Bulbs should be lifted **after foliage** has dried. Remove old foliage before storing and treat with insecticide.

As the spring flowering bulbs fade, remove flower heads to prevent going to seed. Cut foliage after it has turned brown

and dried. The leaves on bulbs produce the food for next year's

flowers. Feed each bulb as soon as blooms fade with about three

VACATION: If you go on vacation and would like to have the sheriff check on your house, call 281 290 2100. Be prepared to give the sheriff your name and address, contact phone numbers and dates when you are gone.

ALARM SYSTEMS: The Sheriff's Dept. has asked that we send out something in our newsletter to remind everyone that alarm system permits are required for any residence or business in all of Harris County, not just the city. Fee is \$35 to be issued and \$10 annual renewal. Permit fees waived for 65 and older.

Under current guidelines, a permitted locations is allowed five (5) free false alarms annually. Any subsequent false alarms during your permitted year are subject to a \$75 fine that is billed to the permit holder's address. If a house has an active alarm system, yet does not have a permit to operate such alarm, a false alarm may result in a Class C citation which could range up to a \$500 fine. You can review the regulation and print a copy of the application form by visiting the Harris County Sheriff's Office website at www.hcso.hctx. net and search for alarm permit or call the Sheriff's Alarm Detail at 713-755-4600.

at anytime: 713.771.7665. You may also visit us online at www. greaterhoustonpool.com. Further, please take the time to introduce yourself to your lifeguard team. We truly enjoy getting to know the members we so proudly serve.

Allow us to start the swim season off on a positive note by providing some valuable safety reminders. It is very important to remember that ultimately you, as the parent/guardian, are the first line of defense for a safe trip to the swimming pool. It is imperative that your non-swimming or novice swimmers are always within an arms length of a parent/guardian. With your support, we are confident that the 2011 swim season will be a safe and positive experience for all.

- Parents must closely supervise their children at all times. Remember, it only takes seconds for a child to drown.
- Define a safe zone for your children where they can always touch the bottom. One of the most common saves a lifeguard must make is when a swimmer strays to an area that is too deep for them to stand.
- Access rules to the facility will be strongly enforced and are the responsibility of each member to understand and follow. It is a very awkward and uncomfortable situation for everyone when

a lifeguard must ask a member to go back home to get the appropriate access tag.

- The safety of a child in the baby pool is the responsibility of the parent or guardian. The lifeguards will always enforce the pool rules throughout the facility, but children who cannot swim must have an adult within arms reach at all times. The same rule applies even if the child is wearing a floatation device.
- Remember that there are several different types of people who like to use the pool throughout the summer. Both young and old, everyone wants to have a good time.
- Do not dive in areas marked "NO DIVING". Nearly 90 percent of all spinal injuries occur in the shallow end of the pool.
- Breath holding games can be very dangerous and may cause cardiac arrhythmia or seizures. Games like who can hold their breath the longest and swimming the longest distance underwater should be avoided at all times.
- Don't allow children to play with or around the main drain. The main drain suction can be very powerful and has been known to cause severe injuries and in some cases death.
