

The 3rd Annual Colin's Hope Classic Was a True Success



Summer and swim season are just around the corner, so there's no better time to start thinking about water safety and drowning prevention! Cue the 3rd annual Colin's Hope Classic golf tournament hosted by the Austin-based non-profit organization, Colin's Hope. On April 13th, 110 golfers teed up to spend their day in support of the charity's mission to promote water safety awareness and help prevent childhood drowning. The beautiful Flintrock Falls Golf Club was the backdrop for a spectacular spring day filled with fun and fundraising. And 100% of the money raised that day will go toward making children safer in and around the water this summer!

The inaugural tournament was held in April 2009, just 8 months after the organization was launched in 2008 in honor of 4-year-old Colin Holst, who drowned in an Austin-area public pool. Since then, fueled by hope, passion and an army of tireless and dedicated volunteers, Colin's Hope has moved from a grassroots charity to a nationally recognized organization. The organization now has partnerships with Schlitterbahn, YMCA, Safe Kids Austin, the American Red Cross, the United Way and the Central Texas Water Safety Coalition, IPSSA Austin, City of Austin, not to mention Olympic gold medalist Brendan Hansen and Dr. Ari Brown. All of these relationships have helped Colin's Hope spread the word that, in most cases, drowning is preventable! The charity has developed a Water Guardian pledge and a badge, which is worn by a designated adult who takes responsibility for staying focused on children who are in the water. In addition, it promotes 7 key drowning prevention tips to help save lives, all of which can be found on their website at www.colinshope.org. In addition, Colin's Hope has



Colin's Hope has become one of the "go to" organizations in the community for water safety questions and concerns. Just recently, Colin's Hope was featured in a local TV news segment regarding foreclosed homes with pools with no fences or protective barriers. The organization's executive director, Alissa Magrum, was alerted to two such homes and took immediate action, letting the bank owners as well as the neighbors and the community know of the inherent danger of this type of situation. Drowning can and will affect you or someone you know!

The 2011 Colin's Hope Classic was sponsored by 25 companies and almost 50 donors, whose generosity has only grown over the past 3 years. In addition, more than 75 volunteers donated their time, energy and talents to make the tournament happen as well. Prizes were awarded for the top 3 scoring teams, as well as for longest drive, longest putt and closest to the pin. In addition, one winning golfer was drawn to participate in a \$2000 50-foot putt challenge and two golfers were drawn for a \$100,000 shoot-out for a 165-yard hole-in-one challenge. However, the only big winners on this day were the children and families Colin's Hope works to protect!

The organization is now beginning to see the first proof of its success in our community! The number of drownings in the Austin area declined in 2009 and in 2010 as compared to the 2008 launch year. In the two highest-risk zip codes in Austin in which Colin's Hope focused its attention and education during its 2010 initiatives, the number of drowning deaths was reduced to zero! Colin's Hope strongly believes that its presence in the community is responsible in many ways for these changes, and that is why all those golfers, sponsors, volunteers and families really came out on April 13th for the Colin's Hope Classic. Because Colin's Hope will help save the life of a child this summer! Swim safe!

Bee Cave Public Library Events in May




Story time continues year-round in Community Room A above the library inside City Hall. Storyteller "Ms. Laurie" Works and her mascot puppet, "the Bee Cave Bee," delight children 4 times a week with stories, songs, fingerplays, and more. Thursday's sessions at 10:30 and 11:15 am are aimed at preschoolers ages 3-5, while Friday's sessions at 10:30 and 11:15 are designed for toddlers—simpler stories and songs for shorter attention spans. At the end of each session, "if the children have been good listeners," according to Ms. Laurie, the Bee makes an appearance to greet her fans, often wearing a costume to match the day's theme. 

TxDOT and City of Lakeway Warn: Talk. Text. Crash.

With technology at their fingertips, drivers are constantly faced with distractions such as talking or texting, putting their safety and that of others at serious risk. April is National Distracted Driving Awareness Month and the City of Lakeway is proud to join the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) in its Talk. Text. Crash. Campaign to raise awareness of the dangers associated with distracted driving and to encourage Texans to put down their cell phones while driving.

Distracted driving is becoming increasingly common and dangerous, causing traffic crashes and fatalities. Data from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) shows the proportion of fatalities reportedly associated with driver distraction increased from 10 percent in 2005 to 16 percent in 2009. In fact, 20 percent of injury crashes nationally in 2009 involved reports of distracted driving.

This deadly trend is mirrored in Texas, where nearly one in four crashes involves driver distraction, according to TxDOT. In 2009 alone, over 100,000 vehicles were involved in crashes where distraction in vehicle, driver inattention, or cell phone use was cited. Sadly, 408 of those crashes were fatal.

Drivers can be distracted by conversing with other passengers, eating, smoking, manipulating dashboard controls, reaching for something in the vehicle, and talking or texting on a cell phone. Among the many distractions drivers face on the road, cell phone use is one of the most common and a major cause of distracted driving traffic accidents and fatalities. At any given moment during the daylight hours, over 800,000 vehicles are being driven by someone using a hand-held cell phone, according to NHTSA. In 2009, 3,308 crashes in Texas were attributed to cell phone use and 41 of those crashes were fatal.

"Drivers simply do not realize the dangers that are posed when they take their eyes and minds off the road and their hands off the wheel and focus on activities other than driving," said Carol T. Rawson, P.E., TxDOT's Traffic Operations Division Director. "Talk. Text. Crash. reminds Texans of the consequences associated with distracted driving. Eliminating distractions and putting away their cell phones while driving can and will save lives."

The Talk. Text. Crash. Campaign aims to reduce distracted driving, not only for National Distracted Driving Awareness Month, but throughout the year. Although cell phone use is the most easily recognized distraction, all in-vehicle

distractions are unsafe and can cause crashes or fatalities. Lakeway Mayor Dave DeOme reminds drivers to put away their cell phones and wait until they arrive at their destination to use their phone.





CAVALIER EX'S CONTRIBUTE TO LONGHORN DIAMOND SUCCESS

Two Lake Travis High Ex's—Chance Ruffin and Cohl Walla—have contributed to the success of Longhorn Baseball teams. As a junior pitcher, Ruffin was the premier closer for the Longhorns and all of NCAA baseball last year. Chola Walla has been one of the 'Horns better hitters this and last year.

As a right-handed closer, Ruffin had a 6-1 record for the Longhorns last year. He led the NCAA Division I in strike outs at 13.5 per nine inning game. With a fast ball in

the mid-90 mph, a slider and curve ball, he ranked high in NCAA categories with a 1.11 ERA, 14 saves, and an opposing batting average of .180 for the 'Horns. He was named as a 2010 All-Big 12 first team pitcher. He nearly contributed to the Longhorns' return to the College World Series (CWS), but the return was sidelined when 'Horns lost to TCU in a three-game super regional last June.

He had a won-loss pitching record of 8-3 in 2008 and 10-2 in 2009 for the Longhorns. One of many 2009 honors was a first team selection for the All-Big 12 team.

In deferring his senior year, Chance entered the MLB supplemental draft and was selected in the first round by the Detroit Tigers, signing for six figures. Baseball America's 2011 Prospect Handbook said he had the "best slider in the Tiger system." Sporting News' 2011 Baseball Annual ranked him fourth among Tiger "Down on the Farm" prospects, saying he "was perhaps the most dominant pitcher in college baseball last year." He was scheduled to start in the AA minor leagues this year.

With a number one on his uniform Cohl Walla worked himself into the starting lineup early last season. As a right-handed batter he had the team's third best batting average of .316. He started 52 of 62 games, delivering 72 hits, 40 RBI's, a slugging percentage of .491, and an on-base percentage of .357.

This year he has started most of the Longhorns' early games and had the third best batting average, although the team has been facing better pitching this year. The team continues to be ranked in the Top 10 of college baseball and expects another run for a CWS berth with the help of Walla.



Johnny Depp voices the scaly, heroic title character in "Rango."



Industrial Light and Magic sure knows how to make a great first impression. "Rango," the first-ever animated feature created by the George Lucas company, is an impressive adventure film set in the Old West featuring a scrawny pet chameleon as it's courageous hero.

When Rango (Johnny Depp), an aspiring thespian, strolls into the small town of Dirt after landing in the desert, he is given the chance to start on a clean slate and become whoever he wants in his new surroundings. No one in Dirt knows who he is, so he conjures up a few lies and jumps into character as a mysterious gunslinger who isn't afraid of anything the big, bad desert has to offer, including the villainous Rattlesnake Jake (Bill Nighy).

Reminiscent of the storyline in the 1986 comedy "The Three Amigos," the towns people, made up of some bizarre looking creatures, accept Rango into their dried-up community and make him sheriff when he accidentally kills a terrorizing hawk. As sheriff, it's now up to Rango to somehow bring water to the thirsty people of Dirt before more of them pack up and take off in search of the one thing they need to survive the desert heat.

Along with exquisite imagery and witty dialogue from the title character, "Rango" is an imaginative and sort of hallucinatory tribute (see if you can spot the "Fear and Loathing in Las Vegas" reference) to a genre most kids aren't

exposed to nearly enough. With a lizard as the lead, this is as kid-friendly as it's going to get.


