The 3rd Annual Colin's Hope Classic

Was a True Success

Summer and swim season are just around the corner, so there's no better time to start thinking about water safety and drowning prevention! Cue the 3rd annual Colin's Hope Classic golf tournament hosted by the Austinbased non-profit organization, Colin's Hope. On April 13th, 110 golfers teed up to spend their day in support of the charity's mission to promote water safety awareness and help prevent childhood drowning. The beautiful Flintrock Falls Golf Club was the backdrop for a spectacular spring day filled with fun and fundraising. And 100% of the money raised that day will go toward making children safer in and around the water this summer!

The inaugural tournament was held in April 2009, just 8 months after the organization was launched in 2008 in honor of 4-year-old Colin Holst, who drowned in an Austin-area public pool. Since then, fueled by hope, passion and an army of tireless and dedicated volunteers, Colin's Hope has moved from a grassroots charity to a nationally recognized organization. The organization now has partnerships with Schlitterbahn, YMCA, Safe Kids Austin, the American Red Cross, the United Way and the Central Texas Water Safety Coalition, IPSSA Austin, City of Austin, not to mention Olympic gold medalist Brendan Hansen and Dr. Ari Brown. All of these relationships have helped Colin's Hope spread the word that, in most cases, drowning is preventable! The charity has developed a Water Guardian pledge and a badge, which is worn by a designated adult who takes responsibility for staying focused on children who are in the water. In addition, it promotes 7 key drowning prevention tips to help save lives, all of which can be found on their

website at www.colinshope.org. In addition, Colin's Hope has become one of the "go to" organizations in the community for water safety questions and concerns. Just recently, Colin's Hope was featured in a local TV news segment regarding foreclosed homes with pools with no fences or protective barriers. The organization's executive director, Alissa Magrum, was alerted to two such homes and took immediate action, letting the bank owners as well as the neighbors and the community know of the inherent danger of this type of situation. Drowning can and will affect you or someone you know!

The 2011 Colin's Hope Classic was sponsored by 25 companies and almost 50 donors, whose generosity has only grown over the past 3 years. In addition, more than 75 volunteers donated their time, energy and talents to make the tournament happen as well. Prizes were awarded for

the top 3 scoring teams, as well as for longest drive, longest putt and closest to the pin. In addition, one winning golfer was drawn to participate in a

was drawn to participate in a \$2000 50-foot putt challenge and two golfers were drawn for a \$100,000 shoot-out for a 165-yard hole-in-one challenge. However, the only big winners on this day were the children and families Colin's

Colin's Hope strongly believes that its presence in the community is responsible in many ways for these changes, and that is why all those golfers, sponsors, volunteers and families really came out on April 13th for the Colin's Hope Classic. Because Colin's Hope will help save the life of a child this summer! Swim safe!

Around Lakeway

TxDOT and City of Lakeway Warn: Talk. Text. Crash.

With technology at their fingertips, drivers are constantly faced with distractions such as talking or texting, putting their safety and that of others at serious risk. April is National Distracted Driving Awareness Month and the City of Lakeway is proud to join the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) in its Talk. Text. Crash. Campaign to raise awareness of the dangers associated with distracted driving and to encourage Texans to put down their cell phones while driving.

Distracted driving is becoming increasingly common and

dangerous, causing traffic crashes and fatalities. Data from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) shows the proportion of fatalities reportedly associated with driver distraction increased from 10 percent in 2005 to 16 percent in 2009. In fact, 20 percent of injury crashes nationally in 2009 involved reports of distracted driving.


This deadly trend is mirrored in Texas,

where nearly one in four crashes involves driver distraction, according to TxDOT. In 2009 alone, over 100,000 vehicles were involved in crashes where distraction in vehicle, driver inattention, or cell phone use was cited. Sadly, 408 of those crashes were fatal.

Drivers can be distracted by conversing with other passengers, eating, smoking, manipulating dashboard controls, reaching for something in the vehicle, and talking or texting on a cell phone. Among the many distractions drivers

face on the road, cell phone use is one of the most common and a major cause of distracted driving traffic accidents and fatalities. At any given moment during the daylight hours, over 800,000 vehicles are being driven by someone using a hand-held cell phone, according to NHTSA. In 2009, 3,308 crashes in Texas were attributed to cell phone use and 41 of those crashes were fatal.

"Drivers simply do not realize the dangers that are posed when they take their eyes and minds off the road and their hands off the wheel and focus on activities other than driving," said Carol T. Rawson, P.E., TxDOT's Traffic Operations Division Director. "Talk. Text. Crash. reminds Texans of the consequences associated with distracted driving. Eliminating distractions and putting away their cell phones while driving can and will save lives."

The Talk. Text. Crash. Campaign aims to reduce distracted driving, not only for National Distracted Driving Awareness Month, but throughout the year. Although cell phone use is the most easily recognized distraction, all in-vehicle distractions are unsafe and can cause crashes or fatalities. Lakeway Mayor Dave DeOme reminds drivers to put away their cell phones and wait until they arrive at their destination to use their phone.

Memorial Day 2011 Plans Simplified in Lakeway

Memorial Day is a day of remembrance for those who have died in our nation's service. At sunrise, on Monday May 30, 2011, flags at the Lakeway Heritage Park Spirit of Freedom Monument will be lowered to half-mast and remain so until twelve-noon, when they will again be raised. A bugler will play the appropriate music at each event.

Memorial Day was officially proclaimed on May 5, 1868, and first observed on May 30, 1868, when flowers were placed on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery. Following World War I, the holiday was changed from honoring just those who died fighting the Civil War to honoring Americans who died fighting in any war. In 1971, the U.S. Congress passed the National Holiday Act which designated the last Monday in May as Memorial Day to ensure a three day weekend for Federal Holidays.

The simple ceremonies at sunrise and twelve-noon on May 30, 2011 are open to the general public to reflect upon those who have died in our nation's service. Heritage Park and the Spirit of Freedom Monument are open to the public 24 hours daily. Questions will be answered by contacting the Heritage Center at 512-608-9533, or history@lakeway-tx.gov.

Entries will be placed in categories for judging – Corporate Business, Civic Organization and Clubs, Schools and Scouts, and



Beginning May 23rd through July 5th, the artwork of Janet Campbell will be on display at the Lakeway City Hall Art Gallery. The exhibit may be viewed during regular City Hall office hours Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM. The Art Gallery is located off the lobby of City Hall at 1102 Lohmans Crossing.

Janet Campbell, a native of San Antonio, Texas, received her early training in commercial art. This background provided her with a basic foundation in drawing and design skills. She has lived in Europe, Asia and several metropolitan areas of the United States. Exposure to artistic expression in these different cultures has given her a universal appreciation of fine art.

It was not until the last of her children began school that she seriously returned to painting. At the time she lived on an historic Army post and had the Kansas City art community to influence her. After working in different mediums, she found watercolor to be the most spontaneous and challenging.

Janet has been painting professionally for 30 years. Her strong

impressionistic style of watercolors is easily recognized. It employs the "wet-on-wet" technique and features the bold use of colors. The technique evolved from experience and the experimentation work with nationally known water color instructors. She especially is drawn to the light and shadow on a building or the colorful reflections and patterns in glass or on water.

Campbell has sponsored The Briscoe Western Art Museum's National Western Art Foundation Show in San Antonio for the past five years and received their People Choice Award in 2009.

The primary subjects of her paintings have been the scenes around her in Central Texas (particularly Austin and San Antonio) and images from her travels to Central America, England, France, Italy, Japan and Mexico. Landscapes, lake scenes, architectural and historical structures and cityscapes have predominated.

To Honor Past Presidents at May Installation Meeting



CAVALIER EX'S CONTRIBUTE TO LONGHORN DIAMOND SUCCESS

Two Lake Travis High Ex's—Chance Ruffin and Cohl Walla—have contributed to the success of Longhorn Baseball teams. As a junior pitcher, Ruffin was the premier closer for the Longhorns and all of NCAA baseball last year. Chola Walla has been one of the 'Horns better hitters this and last year.

As a right-handed closer, Ruffin had a 6-1 record for the Longhorns last year. He led the NCAA Division I in strike outs at 13.5 per nine inning game. With a fast ball in

the mid-90 mph, a slider and curve ball, he ranked high in NCAA categories with a 1.11 ERA, 14 saves, and an opposing batting average of .180 for the 'Horns. He was named as a 2010 All-Big 12 first team pitcher. He nearly contributed to the Longhorns' return to the College World Series (CWS), but the return was sidelined when 'Horns lost to TCU in a three-game super regional last June.

He had a won-loss pitching record of 8-3 in 2008 and 10-2 in 2009 for the Longhorns. One of many 2009 honors was a first team selection for the All-Big 12 team.

In deferring his senior year, Chance entered the MLB supplemental draft and was selected in the first round by the Detroit Tigers, signing for six figures. Baseball America's 2011 Prospect Handbook said he had the "best slider in the Tiger system." Sporting News' 2011 Baseball Annual ranked him fourth among Tiger "Down on the Farm" prospects, saying he "was perhaps the most dominant pitcher in college baseball last year." He was scheduled to start in the AA minor leagues this year.

With a number one on his uniform Cohl Walla worked himself into the starting lineup early last season. As a right-handed batter he had the team's third best batting average of .316. He started 52 of 62 games, delivering 72 hits, 40 RBI's, a slugging percentage of .491, and an on-base percentage of .357.

This year he has started most of the Longhorns' early games and had the third best batting average, although the team has been facing better pitching this year. The team continues to be ranked in the Top 10 of college baseball and expects another run for a CWS berth with the help of Walla.



Read to a Dog at Lake Travis Community Library

In partnership with the Austin Dog Alliance, Lake Travis Community Library offers Bow Wow Reading every third Saturday of the month from 10:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. This program allows 6 to 12 year

olds to improve their reading skills by practicing reading to a dog! Reading to dogs has proven to improve children's reading ability, confidence, and comprehension and to encourage a general love of reading.

"We don't have a dog and it has been great exposure for my son Adrian to get to be around a dog," said Rebecca Carroll. "It has been a good experience to develop independence as a reader – it's just Adrian, the dog, and the dog's partner."

Bow Wow Reading is offered by the library in partnership with the Austin Dog Alliance. Dogs go through a rigorous training process with the ADA and are certified through the Delta Society. Bow Wow Reading dogs must be at least one year old, tolerant of exuberant handling, and be calm, quiet, attentive, and comfortable in low-key settings. Background checks are also completed on the dog's adult trainers.

"My daughter Skyler absolutely loves dogs and she loves to read, too, so it's a perfect combination," said Angela Kawalek. "She looks to the program every month. When she's reading, she has a big smile on her face. Skyler has developed a real bond with Oakley and she's super happy when she is reading to him."

The library takes reservations for individual 15 minute sessions on a first come, first served basis. Six to twelve year olds are invited to participate in this program

and children can bring their own books to the session or use one of the dog themed books provided by the library.

"Registered therapy dogs have proven to improve children's reading skills," said Lake Travis Community Library Director Morgan McMillian. "This program is very popular with new readers, reluctant readers, and readers of all kinds!"


