US 290 RECONSTRUCTION –

The first phase of the expansion and reconstruction of US 290 from the IH 610 Loop to FM 2920 in Waller will begin shortly after a contract is awarded on May 26. This \$151.5 million contract known as Project K involves the rebuild of the US 290 / IH 610 interchange. At the present time, funding is only committed for the expansion of US 290 from the West Loop to Beltway 8. With the projected cost of the US 290 corridor improvements totaling \$2.8 billion, there is still approximately \$1.5 billion of the program unfunded. The US 290 Corridor program also includes the conversion of Hempstead Highway to be a toll road in parallel with US 290 from Bauer Road (just west of the Grand Parkway connection) to the West Loop IH 610. The plan is to also convert the existing rail line along Hempstead Highway and US 290 into a dual use commuter rail and freight line. For more information on the overall project, look at: www.my290.com and <http://my290.com/portals/0/images/fundingmap.html> Although it may be years before US290 main lane construction reaches the Fairfield community, the extension of the Grand Parkway from IH 10 to US 290 should happen in the next year. Harris County has returned control of this segment to TXDOT so construction of this tollway can begin. Fairfield has already been compensated for the land acquisition at Fairfield Place and the US 290 frontage road. The compensation was received because the flyover ramp

connections at the start of this intersection will wipe out the existing entrance monument and fountain on the NW corner. The ramps connecting US 290 to the Grand Parkway will begin just to the west of the Houston Premium Outlet Mall. It appears that the north side of US 290 will be the good side. The south side will be less desirable as access will be more difficult because it will be blocked by the toll road and rail line. This should make the commercial tracts in Fairfield much more desirable for development in the near future. The drought continues into the summer months. It is extremely important to water your lawns, trees and shrubbery. Adequate watering also helps prevent potential cracked slabs. Don't rely on our usual June monsoon rain to make up for any damage caused by the drought.

Local Bluegrass and Old Time Music Jamming

Bluegrass music jamming in Cypress (Fairfield Subdv.) is growing. We are just about to out-grow our house. We enjoy the Jamming and camaraderie so much that we don't mind being a little crowded. All pickers are invited to get that instrument out of the attic, clear your throat, get some songs you want to play/work-on, and come, join the circle and have fun. If you would like to just listen, we would be happy to see you also.

The typical format for the jam is, after everyone tunes their instrument, each person in the circle, in turn, may either suggest a tune for the group to play or pass to the next person. The person that suggests the tune may either lead the singing or ask someone else to lead the singing if they are not comfortable leading. The lead singer gets to select the musical key for the song. If the tune is an instrumental, then the person that suggests the tune announces the key and starts (kicks-off) the playing. Other instruments take turns playing a portion of the tune (called taking a "break" or a "ride"). Sometimes the tune is ended by all playing the tune together. The signal used by the leader to communicate the approaching end of the song is to kick up one foot. To ensure a good time is had by all, being considerate of each person in the jam is very important. For example, a considerate jammer will try to blend in with the others by keeping the established tempo, not singing or playing too loud, and giving others adequate space and a chance to play.

In our jam, players may bring their song lyrics, chords, and music stands. In some more advanced jams, the players typically know their tunes "by heart" and music sheets aren't used. However, as tunes are repeated over a period of time, many of our jammers have memorized them, and that is a good thing. If you listen close you will hear "that was a good lick," or "boy you nailed that one."

Most of the time our trips are based on when and where Tony can find a Bluegrass Jam or Festival. He manages to find them all. Even our professor son will accompany him when we are in Arizona. I guess that is a little togetherness.

We have added an interesting new venue for our Jammers. The Jam will be at Spring Creek BBQ in Cypress on the 2nd and 4th Monday of April and May at 6:30 to 9: pm and we will meet in Fairfield on the 1st and 3rd Monday, from 7: to 9:30 PM of April and May. We will give you the rest of the dates for 2011 later. For more information please call: 281-373-1777. Come a little early and have some great BBQ with us.

Do kids need sports drinks?

Although children may request sports drinks, they offer little advantage over cool water, say nutritionists at Baylor College of Medicine (BCM) in Houston and the USDA/ARS Children's Nutrition Research Center at Baylor and Texas Children's Hospital. Sports drinks are designed to benefit athletes engaged in continuous, high-intensity aerobic workouts that last for 90 minutes or more.

But, if the availability of sports drinks encourages your kids to drink, consider making your own. Combine caffeine-free herbal tea, a little sugar, a pinch of salt, a few ounces of orange juice, and chill in individual bottles. Active kids need to fill up on fluids to prevent dehydration. Children should be encouraged to drink before heading outside and every 15 to 30 minutes during playtime activities.

Combination of limes, sun can result in 'margarita dermatitis'

Adding a slice of lime to a favorite summer drink is nice to cool off with, but it could leave your skin burning, say dermatologists at Baylor College of Medicine.

The condition, called phytophotodermatitis, happens when a certain plant compound comes in contact with the skin, making that one area light sensitive. During the summer, lime juice is the common cause for this condition, which is why some doctors call it 'margarita dermatitis.' The reaction usually looks like a sunburn, or a poison ivy rash, with redness and sometimes swelling and blistering, says Dr. Rajani Katta, associate professor of dermatology at BCM. It can be itchy and painful, and leave behind skin discoloration.

Treatment is similar to treating a poison ivy rash. Cool compresses and hydrocortisone creams along with oral antihistamines are used. Severe cases could require steroid pills. Preventative action is best. Be aware of what plant products you come in contact with and wash the area thoroughly before going out in the sun. As always, make sure to apply sunscreen and stay in shaded areas to maintain good skin health.

Physical activity keeps Parkinson's at bay

The management of Parkinson's disease is much more effective when regular exercise is included, say experts at Baylor College of Medicine (BCM) in Houston. "There's no doubt that people who have a positive attitude and exercise generally cope with the disease much better than those who don't," said Dr. Joseph Jankovic,

professor of neurology and director of BCM's Parkinson's Disease Center and Movement Disorders Clinic.

"Exercise is clearly a positive force in dealing with Parkinson's."

Jankovic said that a regular exercise program, tailored to the needs of the individual patient, is critical for continued well being. Exercises for Parkinson's patients should be designed to improve strength (through the use of free weights, weight machines, and elastic bands) and overall fitness (by walking and swimming). Swimming and water exercises have the additional advantage in that there is very little stress on the joints and the resistance improves muscle strength.

Traditional colonoscopy recommended over virtual method

The option for a "virtual" colonoscopy is now available but doctors at Baylor College of Medicine recommend sticking to traditional methods when screening for colon cancer.

A virtual colonoscopy is a CT scan image of the colon and does not require the use of an endoscope - a thin, flexible device that is inserted into the colon.

"While a virtual colonoscopy may sound less invasive than traditional methods, it isn't always as accurate," said Dr. Waqar Qureshi, associate professor of medicine and chief of endoscopy at BCM. "A scan is more likely to miss small precancerous growths, and catching those polyps early is the key to preventing progression to colon cancer."

Studies have shown that polyps smaller than 6 mm are frequently missed by CT scanning, Qureshi said. For someone who is at high risk for colon cancer, missing a polyp can be deadly. Almost all instances of colon cancer begin as polyps, which are easily detected and removed during a colonoscopy.

Many times a virtual colonoscopy must be followed by the traditional method, he added, and both procedures require the same preparation, which includes laxatives, diet restrictions and in some cases certain medications must be stopped.

Colon cancer screening should take place every 10 years starting at age 50. If colon cancer runs in a family, testing should begin earlier and be performed more often.

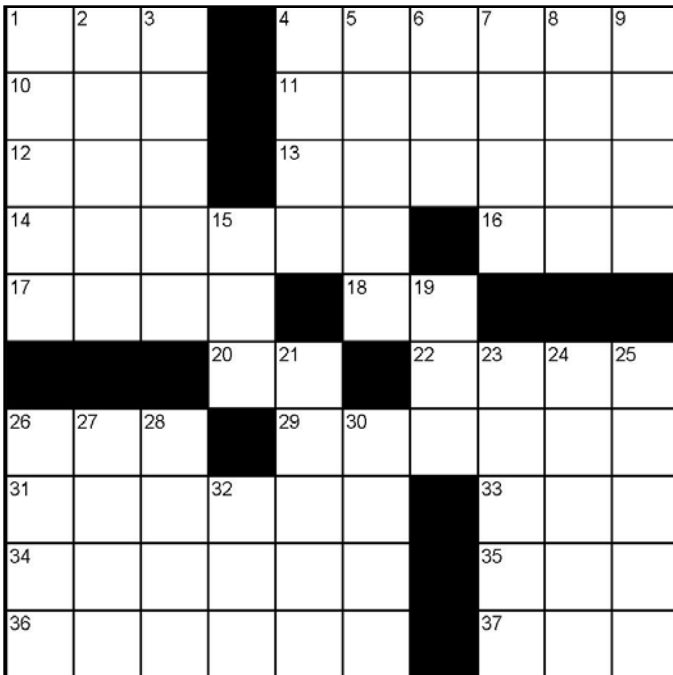

Know Your Investment Risks — and How to Respond

When you invest, you take some risks. While you can't totally avoid these risks, you can take steps to help reduce their impact and increase your comfort level. And the more comfortable you are with your investments, the easier it will be to follow a long-term strategy that can help you meet your goals.

Let's look at the most common types of risk related to investing, along with some suggestions on helping to reduce these risks:

Losing principal — This type of risk is most closely associated with investing. For example, when you purchase a stock, you know that its value could go up or down. If it drops below your purchase price, and you then sell your shares, you will lose some of your principal.

Your response — You can't eliminate the risk of losing principal, but by owning a mix of stocks, bonds, government securities and other types of investments, you can help reduce the impact of volatility on your portfolio. Keep in mind, though, that diversification, by itself, can't guarantee a profit or protect against loss.

Losing value when interest rates change — This type of risk primarily affects fixed-income investments, such as bonds. If you purchase a bond that pays, say, a 4% interest rate, and the market rate goes up to 5%, then the value of your bond will drop because

no one will be willing to pay you the full price for it when newer, higher-yielding bonds are available.

Your response — You can combat, or even ignore, interest rate risk by holding your bonds until they mature. By doing so, you'll get your full principal back, provided the issuer doesn't default, and you'll continue to receive regular interest payments unless the bonds are "called," or repurchased by the issuer. (You can help protect against this by purchasing bonds that have some degree of "call protection" and by owning bonds with different maturities.)

Losing purchasing power — This risk largely applies to fixed-rate investments such as certificates of deposit (CDs). To illustrate: If you purchase a CD that pays 2%, and the

inflation rate is 3%, you are actually losing purchasing power.

Your response — Despite their vulnerability to inflation, CDs can offer you some valuable benefits, such as preservation of principal. Yet if you are concerned about fighting inflation, you may want to look for investments that have the potential to offer rising income, such as dividend-paying stocks. In fact, you can find stocks that have increased their dividends for many consecutive years. (Be aware, though, that companies can reduce or eliminate dividends at any time. Also, an investment in stocks fluctuates, and you could lose your principal.)

Apart from these individual techniques to reduce investment-related risk, you should also save early and save often — because the more money you accumulate, the greater your ability to follow a long-term strategy that reflects your personal risk tolerance. That's why it's a good idea to contribute as much as possible over the years to your IRA and 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan.

By understanding the different types of investment risk, and by acting to help lessen them, you can reduce much of the stress sometimes associated with investing — while you increase your prospects for achieving your objectives.

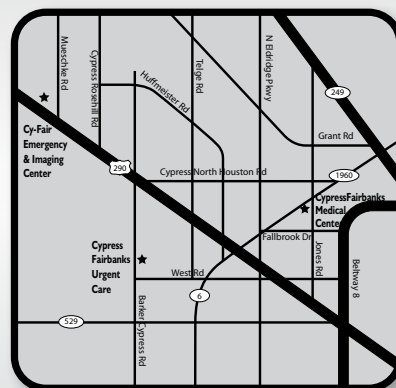

What a Fire Ant Is

There are many different types of fire ants, and they are found all throughout the southeastern and southwestern United States. The most common and aggressive kind is the red imported fire ant, which is reddish-brown and measures about 1/8-inch long (about half the size of a pencil eraser).

Red imported fire ants live in colonies that first nest in the ground, and then create a mound of dirt over the nest. These mounds can grow up to 18 inches high and over 2 feet wide! Red imported fire ants' nests can be found on lawns, in parks, on playgrounds, in fields, and in pastures. Some red imported fire ants create nests in walls of buildings.

What a Fire Ant Sting Looks and Feels Like

A person who gets stung by a fire ant will feel a sharp pain and burning. A person who steps on a fire ant mound will get a lot of stings at once because the ants have been disturbed where they all live together. Each sting will turn into an itchy white blister over the next day.

What You Should Do

If you ever think that you have been stung by a fire ant, tell an adult immediately. That's because the venom (poison) in the fire ants' stings can cause the area of the sting to swell up quite a bit, and a doctor may want to have a look to make sure you

are not having an allergic reaction. The symptoms of an allergic reaction include hives (red patches on the skin that sting and itch), nausea, dizziness, a tight feeling in the throat, or difficulty breathing. If these symptoms occur, the person needs to get medical attention right away.

But more often, you can follow these steps after a fire ant sting:

Wash the area with soap and water.

Apply some ice to the area.

Check with the doctor if you have redness, swelling, or itching.

What a Doctor Will Do

A doctor may suggest giving a medicine called an antihistamine to control swelling and itching. If you are having a more severe allergic reaction to a fire ant sting, he or she may give you a shot fights the reaction. People who know that they are allergic to fire ant stings also sometimes carry emergency medicine that they can give to themselves to prevent a severe reaction from happening.

How to Avoid Getting Bitten

The best way to avoid getting bitten by fire ants is to keep your shoes on when playing near fire ant mounds. If you come across one, don't ever poke at it or try to play with it.
