





The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks by Rebecca Skloot tells a riveting story of the collision between ethics, race, and medicine; of scientific discovery and faith healing; and of a daughter consumed with questions about the mother she never knew" (author's website). This bestselling work will be the book for discussion at the July Courtyard Book Club meeting. This remarkable book is on more than 60 critics "Best of 2010" lists. They were taken into early space missions to see what would happen to cells in zero gravity. Scientific milestones since then have used her cells--cloning, gene mapping and in vitro fertilization. COURTYARD CALLER

Culinary Classics *Chipotle Chicken Breasts*

- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- 2 canned chipotle peppers in adobo sauce, seeded and chopped
- ¹/₄ ancho pepper
- ¹/₂ onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 3 tomatoes
- 2 tablespoons fresh cilantro, chopped
- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- 1 cup Mexican blend shredded cheese
- Blue cheese dressing, for dipping or garnish

Heat olive oil in skillet. Add chipotle peppers, ancho pepper, onion and garlic to the skillet. Sauté for 5 - 7 minutes until caramelized. Add tomatoes to pepper mixture in skillet. Cook stirring for 3 - 5 minutes. Add cilantro and simmer on low for 30 minutes, stir occasionally. Cook chicken breasts on a preheated grill until done, approximately 15 minutes per side. Pour warm chipotle sauce over cooked chicken and top with cheese. Place a dollop of blue cheese dressing on top or on the side for dipping.

Paraprosdokain


