"Due to severe drought conditions and extreme fire danger the Travis County Fire Marshall has declined all fireworks permits for the foreseeable future," said Andra Dearing, Director of Parks & Recreation.

"Therefore we have canceled our evening festivities at City Park, including shuttle service, and have revised the entire event. Instead we'll have an *Old-Fashioned Block Party* surrounding the Lakeway Swim Center. Free parking will be available at Serene Hills Elementary and adjacent streets on The Hills Drive and Highlands Blvd."

The evening's entertainment begins with the Block Party at 5 p.m. featuring the exciting sounds of *Duck Soup*, playing your favorite rock n' roll, country, jazzy blues, and more. Duck Soup is one of the most talented bands around, with their strong vocals and incomparable devotion to their instrumentals and singing. So grab your partner and dance to your favorite tunes under the marquee tents, complete with a dance floor, tables and chairs. Or bring your own chairs, if you prefer.

Kids will love the carnival rides too—a Ferris Wheel, an Airplane Ride, a Hi-Striker for ages 10 and up, a Foam Machine, an Inflatable Dry Slide, Lasertag, and last, but not least, a Circus Train Inflatable, where kids can go through the 3-section funhouse, past the monkeys, down the slides and through the obstacles.

And don't forget those good eats. Concession stands include Frozy's Snow Cone Stand, Kettle King KettleKorn, Kona Ice, P.Terry's Hamburgers and Hot Dogs.

All this and more makes this an event you won't want to miss. As usual, the July 4th celebration begins at 8:30 a.m. with a Parade on Lakeway Drive from the Live Oak Golf Course to the Activity Center. This year's theme is *"Proud to Be An American."*

The Pageant of Flags follows the parade at 10:30 a.m. at the Activity Center, where you will meet Grand Marshal Col. Charles Edwards as he gives his keynote address. The pageant also includes patriotic music and presentation of parade awards.

Don't forget the Lakeway Swim Center will be open from noon until 9 p.m at a reduced rate of \$3 per person.

So while we won't have fireworks, the show will go on with lots of fun-filled activities for the whole family.



"I've been looking forward to using OverDrive with my Nook and I have found it to be an extraordinarily easy system to use," said library patron Jane Yorke. "The selection is amazing."

Users may browse the library's website, check out with a valid library card, and download to PC, Mac, and many mobile devices. Users will need to install free software. For audiobooks, music and video, install OverDrive Media Console. To read eBooks, users will need Adobe Digital Editions. Titles can be enjoyed immediately or transferred to a variety of devices, including the iPod, Nook, Sony Reader, and many others. Some audio titles can also be burned to CD to listen to on-the-go. SPIRIT OF FREEDOM MONUMENT

The Lakeway Heritage Center and Park

The Lakeway Heritage Commission and the City of Lakeway proudly welcomes you to Heritage Park, funded in part by generous donations from our citizens and the support of the Lakeway Civic Corporation.

Located on over two-acres of land which was formerly the site of a ranch house complex built in the 1930's by Gus Mauermann, the park showcases the Spirit of Freedom Monument. Originally dedicated on the 50th anniversary of the end of World War II, the monument honors and provides a perpetual reflection of local residents who served or presently serve in our armed forces during periods of armed conflict.

The center obelisk lists names of those veterans who served during World War II. Separate panels list the names of veterans from the Korean and Vietnam Wars. The most recent addition to the monument is the panel nearest to the flags; that panel allows the addition of names over time, and is not specific to any period of armed conflict.

Collectively, there are nearly 1000 past or present Lakeway residents who have responded to the call of our country during critical times in our history.

The Heritage Commission solicits annually the names of veterans eligible to be added to the monument for recognition on Veterans Day each year. The annual deadline for submission is August 15th. A tax-deductible donation of \$150.00 is required for each name to be engraved. Persons interested in having a name added to the monument should fill-out the preliminary information below and deliver the form to the Heritage Center or to Parks & Recreation at city hall. You will be contacted by a representative for additional information, confirmation of eligibility, and method of payment.


