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
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


SUMMERWOOD FINANCIAL REPORT

- 5. I love looking in your windows. I'm looking for signs that you're home, and for flat screen TVs or gaming systems I'd like. I'll drive or walk through your neighborhood at night, before you close the blinds, just to pick my targets.
- 6. Avoid announcing your vacation on your Facebook page. It's easier than you think to look up your address.
- 7. To you, leaving that window open just a crack during the day is a way to let in a little fresh air. To me, it's an invitation.
- 8. If you don't answer when I knock, I try the door. Occasionally, I hit the jackpot and walk right in.

- 9. If you leave your garage door open (even when you are home), I will enjoy helping myself and you will be surprised what I can snag in a very short amount of time. Of course if you leave it open when away from home, or sleeping at night, even better. I will have all of the time in the world.
- 10. I shine my flashlight in the windows of the automobiles in your driveway in the wee hours of the morning... more often than you think, and I look for purses or wallets, electronics, money, or anything else of value. If I don't see anything of value, I leave, but if I see something I want, you should know that "smash and grab" is easy and I can usually get away.

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MUSCOVY DUCKS

Muscovy ducks are the only domestic ducks that do not come from Mallard stock. They are a South American species, originating from Brazil. The original (wild type) coloration is black and white, but domestication has produced many more colors. Day old ducklings range in color from a solid pale yellow to yellow and black, the feet are yellow and black. Muscovy ducks tend to hiss rather than quack.

The males can grow to be quite large, weighing 10-15 lbs. Most of the females are 5-7 pounds but can reach up to 9 and sometimes 10 lbs. Their feet have strong sharp claws and are built to grasp, so that they can perch on branches. Muscovy are unique because of their bright red crest around their eyes and above the beak. Although, often considered ugly because of these large red warty caruncles.

They are, however, very personable, interesting birds. They are quite intelligent and entertaining.

Unlike most domestic waterfowl, Muscovy will often fly up and roost. They are very good flyers, especially the smaller females, but are known more for flying around than flying away. They do not swim much because their oil glands are under developed compared to most ducks. Muscovy hens can set three times a year, and the egg clutches can vary from 8 to 21 eggs. The eggs

are incubated for 35 days. Muscovy when crossed with other breeds, produce sterile offspring. For instance, if you cross a Muscovy male with a Pekin female you will hatch mules; if you cross a Pekin male with a Muscovy female the progeny are called hinnies. Whereas a Pekin takes 28 days to hatch and a Muscovy takes 35 days, a mule or hinny takes 32 days to hatch.

By the age of about three months, the males are nearly twice as large as the females. Not sure if this is always the case. But, it has been found that in younger Muscovies, the feet of the males are often larger. It is quiet, a good forager and is naturally broody. Muscovy ducks are good mothers and hatch and brood their ducklings efficiently.

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MATH STRATEGIES TO USE WITH YOUR CHILD AT HOME

We all want our children to grow up to be great, efficient problem solvers. Using mental math is one of the most powerful problem solving methods to accomplish that goal. Here are a few addition and subtraction strategies to use with your child that support mental math problem solving.



Addition Strategies	Problem	Example
Adding by Place	392 + 258	300 +200=500 (hundreds place)
		90 + 50=140 (tens place)
		8 + 2=10 (ones place)
		500+140+10=650
Keeping One Number Whole	392 + 258	392 + 8 = 400
		400 + 250 = 650
		(Keep 392 whole, break apart 258 into 8 & 250)
Changing the Numbers	392 + 258	400 + 250 = 650(Take away 8 from 258 & Add 8 to 392 to make 400)
		Or
		400 + 258 =658(Add 8 to 392 to make 400)
		658 - 8 = 650 (Minus 8 to find the sum)
