# TxDOT Shelves Plan to Limit Left Turns on Loop 360

The Texas Department of Transportation, facing huge opposition from neighborhood associations along Loop 360, says it will drop plans to add "Modified Michigan left turns" to ease congestion on Loop 360. "We just didn't have the public support that we would have liked to have seen," said Carlos Lopez, the Austin district engineer for TxDOT. Most neighborhoods along Loop 360, including Jester, banded together to challenge TxDOT's proposed plan.

#### FIREWORKS ALERT!

From Public Information Office Manager for the Austin Fire Department, Michelle Decrane:

"It is illegal to possess fireworks within the City of Austin. It is illegal to use or sell fireworks within the City of Austin and within 5,000 feet outside the city limits. The fine is \$248; that may not seem like much but if your fireworks cause bodily harm and/or property damage, the Austin Fire Department can charge you with assault and/or arson, both felony crimes. The U.S. Department of Transportation does not classify the following items listed as common fireworks, and their use is allowed within the City of Austin:

Wire Sparklers | Smoke Bombs | Glow Worms & Snakes Poppers, Trick Noisemakers, Snappers

Sparklers can reach temperatures of 1,800 degrees and smoke bombs shoot a flame of two to three inches when ignited. So even though these fireworks are legal, they can still be very dangerous."

#### **Nature Watch**

Dancing Damselflies

Often overlooked but in the same Order (Odonata) as dragonflies, damselflies are a group of insects that differ from dragonflies by wing shape, wing position, and eye separation. Damselflies have similarly shaped fore and hind wings, typically hold their wings together over their abdomen when perched, and their eyes are widely separated but never touching. In comparison, the hind wings of dragonflies are broader basally than their fore wings, they hold their wings spread out and away from their body, and their eyes are much larger and usually touch at least at a single point.

While damselflies are less robust fliers than dragonflies, they are still quite agile in flight. They can move each of their four wings independently, and can not only beat them up and down, but also rotate them on their own axes. Most damselflies fly by alternating the two pairs of wings, and while one is moving down to propel them forward, the other is moving up. In spite of their fast wing beats, damselflies have relatively short, narrow wings that don't allow them fast flight, and they move at an average speed of about 2 meters per second.

Over 75 species of damselflies occur in Texas, more than half of the known species in North America. These species represent members of all families of damselflies, which include broad-winged damsels (jewelwings and rubyspots), spreadwings, threadtails, and pond damsels (dancers, bluets, yellowfaces, wedgetails, damsels, forktails, swampdamsels, sprites, and firetails). Like most dragonflies, the males are usually the most colorful and the easiest to identify.

Usually inhabiting small seepages and springs, the Springwater Dancer (Argia plana) is one of the most common pond damsels in our area, and has a blue head, face, and eyes, and a blue thorax with a black dorsal (top) and shoulder stripe. Its abdomen is also predominately blue, with black rings on most middle segments. It can often be found along roadsides, away from water. The Great Spreadwing (Archilestes grandis) is the largest damselfly in Texas and the US, and is recognized by its blue eyes, the metallic green stripes on the top of its thorax, and bright yellow stripes on its sides. Its wings are clear to slightly smoky, often with darker tips. Found around bodies of standing water, it perches in a distinct manner on vertical stems with its body hanging downward and its wings partly spread. Common around open streams and rivers, the American Rubyspot (Hetaerina americana) is a broad-winged damsel that has a metallic red thorax, a metallic green abdomen, and a vivid red patch at the base of its wings that grows larger with age.

Observed throughout the summer at almost any body of freshwater, damselflies are slender and delicate. They seem to dance around and about the water, marked with colors of the rainbow, delighting all those who take the time to get to know and admire them!

#### **ADULT EYE HEALTH**

Maintaining a healthy lifestyle is an important part of preserving good eye health. Keys to healthy vision include:

- Avoiding smoking
- Eating a balanced diet, rich in dark green vegetables and foods that contain zinc, vitamins C and E, and beta-carotene

- Controlling your blood pressure
- Protecting your eyes from the sun by wearing eyewear that absorbs UV rays and brimmed hats or caps
- Staying current with periodic eye exams as recommended by your doctor if you have diabetes or other chronic conditions that can affect your vision

# SIGNS OF PROBLEMS See your doctor if you experience any of the following:

- Unusual trouble adjusting to the dark
- Difficulty focusing on objects
- Squinting due light sensitivity
- Change in color of iris (colored part of your eye)
- Red, crusty, or swollen eyelids
- Recurring pain around eyes
- Double vision
- Dark spots or floaters in vision
- Distorted or wavy lines/edges
- Watery eyes
- Itchy or burning dry eyes
- Seeing spots or ghost-like images

#### **CHILD EYE HEALTH**

Newborns should be checked for inherited eye problems at the time of delivery. Between six and twelve months, infants' eyes should be checked again by a health care professional. At three to four years old, children should start getting their eyes checked at regular intervals.

#### **EYE INJURIES**

The most common causes of eye injuries in children are: misuse of toys, everyday objects, and tools (forks and knives, pens and pencils, garden tools), falls, contact with harmful household products (detergents, cleaning supplies, paint, glue), and car accidents. The best ways to avoid these types of injuries are to properly baby proof your home, read all warnings and instructions on toys, and be sure your children are properly secured in infant carriers and car seats.

### Seek immediate medical attention if your child...

- has obvious pain or trouble seeing
- has a cut or torn eyelid
- does not move one eye as well as the other
- has one eye that sticks out compared to the other
- has an unusual pupil size or shape
- has blood in the clear part of the eye
- has something in the eye that cannot be easily removed

#### Host a Foreign **Exchange Student**

#### TRAVEL THE WORLD WITHOUT LEAVING YOUR HOMETOWN

Who hasn't dreamed about walking among the Egyptian pyramids, or soaking in the sun on a beach in Spain, or wandering along the Great Wall of China? Every parent wants to give their children a taste of the world, but the economic reality of international air travel for a family, not to mention hotels, passports and food, makes it tough for most of us to consider except in our daydreams. There is a way to give your children the world – without leaving your living room. How? Host a foreign exchange student from a country you've always admired! Fascinated by France? Curious about China? Intrigued by India? By welcoming an international student from one of these countries into your home, you instantly open a portal to a far off land.

"My husband and I have been hosting for the past three years and have enjoyed every minute of it!" said Vicki Odom, an Ayusa host mom from Pearland, Texas. "The various students we've had in our home have taught us a great deal about their home countries. The students also love learning about life in Texas and participate in a good deal of community service. Their latest service project was volunteering to be Super Scoopers at the San Antonio Battle of Flowers Parade." Foreign exchange students come from all over the world. Ayusa matches host families with students from more than 60 different countries including Argentina, China, Ecuador, Egypt, France, Germany, Japan, Lebanon, Norway, Pakistan, Sweden, Thailand, Tunisia and Turkey. All high school foreign exchange students are fully insured, bring their own spending money, and are proficient in English - and all high school exchange programs are regulated by the U.S. Department of State.

'We welcome host families of all shapes and sizes - families with young children, families with no children, empty nesters whose children have left home, single parents and non-traditional families," says Connie Coutu, Regional Manager of Ayusa, a non-profit that promotes global learning and leadership through foreign exchange and study abroad opportunities for high school students. "The key requirements for a host family are to provide a safe and nurturing home environment, genuinely love children, and have a desire to learn more about a different culture." Volunteer host families provide foreign exchange students a nurturing environment, three meals a day and a bedroom (either private or shared with a host sibling of the same gender). Each host family and student is supported by a professionally trained community representative who works with the family and student for the entire program. All interested host families must pass a criminal background check and a home visit by an exchange organization.

Interested host families are required to fill out an application, pass a background check and interview with a local exchange program representative in their homes. Once accepted to a program, host

families can view profiles of students to find the right match for their family. "Hosting an exchange student is a life-changing experience – for the student, the host family, and the host community," says Coutu. "There is no better way to teach your children about the world around them than through welcoming an international high school student into your home." Ayusa is currently accepting applications for families to host an exchange student for the 2012 – 2013 school year. # Recipie of the Month

#### Leek Risotto

by the Four Points Foodie

#### Ingredients

- 2 T olive oil
- 2 leeks, greens trimmed, cut in half, rinsed & sliced
- 1 C Arborio rice
- 4 C chicken stock
- 1/2 C cream
- 1/3 C Parmesan, grated
- salt and pepper to taste

#### **Directions**

Heat the chicken stock in a small pot over medium heat. I removed the fibrous green tops from the leeks and cut them in half which makes it easier to clean the sand and grit away. Pat dry and slice thinly. In a sauté pan, add olive oil and sliced leeks and cook over medium heat until the leeks are tender.

Remove to a small bowl and set aside. In the same pan, sauté the Arborio rice for a few minutes. When most of the rice has become white, add your first ladle of simmering chicken stock, stirring frequently until almost all of the broth has been absorbed.

Then add another ladle of broth, and keep stirring. Do this until all the chicken stock is gone. Remove rice from heat and add in cream and Parmesan, stirring well. Add the leeks back into the rice and this is where I added sliced cooked chicken into the risotto. Season with salt and pepper and serve. This made 2 large servings which was perfect for a meal!
