

PRESIDENT'S LETTER

The State Legislature has a real burr under it¹s saddle about Homeowners Associations and that is because a few rogue ones take advantage of the homeowner apathy.

Now to another contentious subject, WATER!! Bridgestone MUD still has signs up requesting VOLUNTARY rationing which is quite reasonable, but some selfish homeowners decide to ignore that and water out of hours as often as they like, not only being selfish but wasting water by watering the road, driveways and sidewalks.
