Hello fellow compadres ... your intrepid MUD board Director Hicks is ever on the quest for truth, justice and the VNP way! We start with news from a neighbor, our sister MUD district 282 (Wildwood) is experiencing rapid growth at the back of our subdivision. As stated in my previous article, we are in communication with them for an additional water plant to supply Wildwood with water and will include connections to MUD 281 (us), 280 and 15. MUD 282 will bear the largest portion of the cost of this water plant but MUD's 281, 280 and 15 will share a small portion of the costs as all the MUD's will participate in the benefits of this plant as well. The developer of Wildwood is on course to put in the infrastructure as quickly as possible and this includes extending Northpointe Blvd through to Shaw Road to the west. If you take a drive past the high school and turn left on Shaw headed toward Grant Rd., you will see the back entrance being built where Northpointe will intersect with Shaw. If you'd like to see a map of the finished development, go to www. wildwoodatnorthpointe.com, then click on "location" and you will see the site plan. It's gonna be a whopper of a subdivision with at least 1,200 homes (we anticipate around 850 home sites in VNP at build-out.)

Also, I've had several inquiries on the big project behind the new McDonalds up at the corner of Northpointe and 249. Our understanding from MUD 280 (Canyon Gate) is this is another apartment complex from the same developer as the apartments on Louetta across from Perry's Steakhouse. As you can see, they took out all the trees ... while not the best way to do things, please understand that many times the Harris County Flood Control District will dictate that the property must drain a certain way, have detention ponds, etc. Once they get all that sorted out there usually leaves little area on the property that can remain untouched. It's really too bad..but I guess that's progress. Since I can't leave you on a sour note ... I bestow upon you a lighthearted little limerick ... to wit:

The fee for a booth space is as follows: Inside 6X9 = \$30, 6x6 = \$25,6ft table = \$20. Outside 6x9 = 25\$, 6x6 = \$20, 6ft table = \$15 outside.

There is a charge to rent a table which is \$5 each.

Each vendor must donate a raffle item with a minimum value of \$25 If spaces are full when you submit your registration or if for any reason your application is not accepted (i.e. We already have a vendor selling the same type of item you want to sell for a lesser value), your check will be returned to you promptly.

THE COMPASS

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HCTRA Projects – SH 249 (Tomball Tollway)

The SH 249 (Tomball Tollway) project will provide three toll lanes in each direction to the existing SH 249 corridor. The current frontage roads will remain in place and will not be tolled. The project is proposed to be constructed in two phases.

Phase I will be the development and construction of three toll lanes in each direction from just north of Spring Cypress Road to north of the Tomball Bypass. Phase II will extend the toll lanes north of the bypass to the Harris County line at Spring Creek and points beyond in Montgomery County.

This project will require partnership with Montgomery County to achieve successful development. Schematic designs have been completed for the portion that lies within Harris County.

The estimated cost of this project is \$335 million. Construction of Phase I is estimated to begin in Fall 2013. (Recourse: HCTRA web site)






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OCTOBER GARDENING TIPS

- 1. Time to clear out your gardens of all the dead plants and flowers that didn't make it this year!
- 2. Plant trees, shrubs, rose bushes and perennials. Planting now will ensure better survival next spring/summer and earlier growth and blooms.
- 3. Plant fall and winter color pansies, dianthus, snapdragons, alyssum, ornamental kale and cabbage, dusty miller, etc. Plant in beds you cleaned out (from #1), or in pots on deck or porch.
- 4. Replace dead grass with St. Augustine sod. Weeds will sprout in dead patches if you don't. New sod will be well-established by spring.
- 5. Winterize the lawn that you still have left. An organic, slow release fertilizer is just what the grass needs to get ready for cold weather.
- 6. Plant fall veggies and herbs Broccoli, cauliflower, Brussels sprouts , lettuce, cabbage, peas, dill, cilantro, parsley, Swiss chard, mustard greens, etc.
- 7. Plant bulbs by the Holidays. Between Halloween and Thanksgiving: Crocus, anemones, freesia, ranunculus, alliums, lycoris, etc. Plant paperwhites in pots by November 11th (Armistice Day) for blooming in time for Christmas. Refrigerate tulips until New Year's Day, then plant every two weeks through Valentine's Day for longer bloom time.
- 8. Plant wildflower seeds through November bluebonnets, paintbrush, larkspur, etc. Also plant sweet pea seeds in November for better results in spring.
- 9. Move and divide perennials and roses while they are dormant or growing slowly. They will be ready to burst into bloom in spring.
- 10. Mulch, mulch, mulch the mulch you applied last spring is long gone! Protect roots and maintain moisture while keeping weeds to a minimum with a 3-inch layer of the mulch of your choice pine straw, bark mulch, compost, leaves.
