### **Architectural Applications**

Now that the Holiday season is approaching you may be considering making changes or additions to your home. Please be reminded that anything that alters the exterior appearance of your home or your property, i.e., basketball goal, play equipment (including trampolines), patio cover, storage building, play houses satellite dish, etc. must have your Association's prior written approval before construction or installation commences. If you're building something that has a roof and/or sides, i.e., patio cover, storage building, you will need to include the following along with your application: materials including roofing, dimensions, height (measured from ground to peak), width and length, and a copy of your lot survey indicating the proposed location and a side view elevation drawing. Remember, metal, plastic, etc. are not permitted. If you plan to install play equipment, please include a copy of your lot survey showing the proposed location, the dimensions of the equipment (height, width and length) and color of the tarp. If you're painting your home, please include a sample of the color(s) you wish to use. Basketball goals - include a copy of your recorded lot survey indicating the proposed location where you wish to keep the goal.

Keep in mind that installation/construction may not commence until you have received your Association's approval. It's a real easy process and takes no time at all to adhere to your governing documents. You can apply by U.S. Mail, fax (713-932-6059) or email (ami@amitx.com) or via Fairfield Village's website www.fairfieldvillage.org — whichever is easiest for you. An application as well as your Governing Documents can be obtained on line. 

# Cy-Fair Science Resource Center Needs Volunteers of All Ages

On October 24 Alice Flood enthusiastically welcomed 60 youth volunteers from The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Cy-Fair ISD's Science Resource Center (SRC) at 11206 Telge Road.

"Your task this evening is to help us create 2,400 plastic bag chemistry kits that will be used by approximately 9,000 fifth graders in 52 schools to learn about endothermic and exothermic reactions," said Flood, who manages the Science Resource Center. "These kits will begin going out to classrooms in the next two weeks, so we appreciate your help so much. It would take our staff six to eight weeks to finish this work if we had to do it in addition to our many other duties."

Flood said that they normally expect to have a few volunteers assist SRC staff in preparing plastic bag chemistry kits during the school year. ,"It is rare to have such a large group here at one time. They finished 2,400 kits in less than an hour!" she said. "We were amazed and thrilled! Now we can turn our attention to other projects."

"I really enjoyed this experience," said 12-year-old volunteer Caitlyn Clark. "It made me feel happy to know that I helped to do something that made such a difference in the work load for the staff members here."

"This was an easy service project to organize," said VaDon Pace, who coordinated the volunteer efforts of three Latter-day Saint congregations, including one in Fairfield, to achieve the high participation numbers. "It

was also fun for the youth. We are very grateful to Alice Flood for providing us with such a great way to serve our community."

Flood explained that there are always plenty of volunteer opportunities for youth and adults at the Science Resource Center. "The Science Resource Center originally received federal funds but is now funded entirely by CFISD," said Flood. "Additional funds are received as donations from district PTOs, business partners and individuals. We are especially appreciative of community volunteers who are willing to give of their time and talents to help our science teachers enhance classroom experiences. Many of our needs fit quite nicely into Eagle Scout service projects."

The Science Resource Center loans models, incubators and Van de Graff generators to classrooms; works with CFISD field trip groups; creates experiment materials; assists with Science Olympiad; and provides demonstrations by volunteer presenters. The center also houses quite an assortment of animals that periodically visit classrooms with volunteers, including turtles, hedge hogs, chinchillas, guinea pigs, mice, rats, hamsters, rabbits, ferrets, snakes, lizards, frogs, birds, mealworms, tarantulas and even hissing cockroaches. Teachers who have had the animal care class may check out animals for up to two weeks in the classroom. 





# 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Mobility Forum

State and local officials stressed the need for partnerships in regards to transportation projects during the 5th Annual Mobility Forum hosted by the Cy-Fair Houston Chamber of Commerce and underwritten by Methodist Willowbrook Hospital. "It's about finding solutions together, because TxDOT doesn't have all the answers, and it certainly doesn't have all the money," said Phil Wilson, TxDOT executive director. "Neither does your local county [or toll road authority], but together we can find critical key needs and leverage our resources together by utilizing toll roads and design-build programs. We can move projects forward in a faster, smarter and more efficient way."

George Greanias, CEO of the Metropolitan Transit Authority of

Harris County, also discussed the benefits of partnerships during a speaker's panel presentation. "With Hwy. 290, if we don't coordinate, we won't get the optimum use out of that corridor," he said.

During the keynote speech, Wilson spoke about the challenges TxDOT faces in keeping up with population growth in Texas during a time when 1,200 people move to the state everyday. The gas tax, which has remained the same at 20 cents per gallon since 1991, is TxDOT's main source of revenue. After deductions, TxDOT has about 11 cents left over to use for infrastructure. "That 11 cents in 1991 bought a very different amount than it does in 2012," Wilson said.

The future of high-speed rail in Texas also came up during a presentation by Seth Moulton, managing director of Texas Central Railway, a private company attempting to build a line between Dallas and Houston that would get riders between the two cities in 90 minutes traveling at 205 mph. In Japan, the average delay for a high-speed rail trail is 30 seconds, and in Spain travelers receive a full refund if a high-speed train is five minutes late,

Moulton said.

"If you think about what we're used to in America for travel times, things could be a lot better," he said. Texas Central Railway is working on an investment grade ridership survey and focusing on what type of stations would be best for the project: downtown, suburban or dual-station. "This has really important implications for real estate development because often times there are more development opportunities around the stations when you do something outside the city," Moulton said. The dual-station model could be a possibility in an area like Houston, which has a lot of growth outside the city.

"If you look at the potential commuter rail system for Houston, six of the seven lines go north or west of the city," Moulton said.

"Since we are coming in from the north, there are a lot of options because there's a lot of growth and development out here. The dual-station model might make a lot of sense."

Moulton said the project will most likely be privately financed, and the company hopes to have it running by 2021. "We were pleased to have so many transportation experts update us on what is going in the Cy-Fair area, said Leslie Martone, president of the Cy-Fair Houston Chamber of Commerce. "We had great participation from our membership and the community and we are looking forward to our continued partnerships to meet the future needs of our growing community."


