#### Why Are Stop Signs Being Ignored in Village Creek?

Drivers often feel safe when approaching a stop sign, but you are not safe in an intersection when another car driver runs a stop sign. Each year thousands of car accidents are caused by drivers that run stop signs. According to the Fatality Analysis Reporting System, there were 13,627 cars involved in fatal automobile accidents caused by running a stop sign in 1999 and 2000.

Stop sign running is often caused by impatience. People that run stop signs are often in a hurry or just merely assume that no one is coming as they blow through an intersection. Even worse, some drivers run stop signs without even realizing it until it is too late. Often these distracted drivers or reckless drivers also make unsafe lane changes, run red lights and cause many other assorted horrors on the road.

Precinct 4 Constables are currently patrolling Village Creek and are ticketing as many drivers that run stop signs as they can, but there are only so many patrol officers to go around. With less traffic, drivers will be more likely to run a stop sign — and also more likely to cause a car accident. The tragedy in all this is that a child may get hurt or even killed due to a driver deciding to run a stop sign so they can get home a half minute earlier. Would it be worth it to kill a child just so you can get home a few minutes sooner?

Residents: If you see a driver running a stop sign, be sure to report the description of the vehicle, get a plate number and time of day then report the violation to the Precinct 4 Constables Office.

The Board of Directors has a fiduciary responsibility to prepare a budget each year for the Association. Once the budget is complete and approved by the Board they then approve the rate of assessment for 2013.
