

### From the White House **FAIRFIELD CENTRAL UPDATE**

In case you have not heard, the vote by Bradford Creek, Chappell Ridge and Garden Grove homeowners to combine into Fairfield Central Neighborhood Association, Inc. was finally completed in early December 2012. The three neighborhoods had distinctively different bylaws. The bylaws for Chappell Ridge and Garden Grove required that two thirds of the homeowners had to be in agreement for any proposal to pass. The bylaw requirements for Bradford Creek to pass a proposal were much less stringent.

The proposed merger of the three neighborhoods into one Fairfield Central Neighborhood Association was based on the financial aspects only while the deed restrictions for each neighborhood remained as originated. The Bradford Creek neighborhood of 1177 homeowners very quickly met the bylaw requirements for the number of votes needed for approval of the financial merger. The Chappell Ridge and Garden Grove vote was more of a challenge and required several of the board members of these neighborhoods to go door-to-door to get out the vote. Eighty-seven percent (87%) of those homeowners voting in Chappell Ridge were in favor of the merger into Fairfield Central Neighborhood Association. In Garden Grove, ninety-six percent (96%) of the homeowners voting agreed to the merger. Both Chappell Ridge and Garden Grove exceeded the required two thirds votes of all of the homeowners.

There are a total of 1881 homes in the Fairfield Central Neighborhood Association. Combining the three neighborhood finances resulted in reduced costs for management fees, audit fees and miscellaneous operating expenses. These changes will keep the neighborhood annual assessment for Fairfield Central at \$300.00 for at least two years. AMI is working to reduce the costs of several budget line items to further improve the Fairfield Central balance sheet.

One of the benefits of getting out the vote was the chance to meet many homeowners in this very large neighborhood. We found that many people overlooked the request to vote, did not understand it or lost it in their very busy suburban lives. The direct meeting with those homeowners helped to get out the vote.

Fairfield Central encourages Inwood Park, Lakes of Fairfield and the Trails of Fairfield neighborhood associations on the east side of Mason Road to consider combining into one neighborhood association to provide a strong presence in Fairfield. Such a move would make for three larger neighborhood associations (Fairfield South, Fairfield Central and Fairfield East) to share a voice and the direction of this great subdivision.





### **Tennis Court Complex Dedicated to John K. Holladay**

On Saturday, December 8th, The Fairfield Village Community was proud and honored to dedicate its tennis court complex to John K. Holladay.

John Holladay began working for Friendswood Development Company in June of 1980 as the head tennis pro at the Copperfield Racquet & Health Club in west Houston. "I remember it very well", says Holladay, "I was working out of a small temporary trailer because the clubhouse was still under construction. We had a tiny air conditioner and it was one of the hottest summers on record in Houston that year." Holladay went on to own and operate Copperfield for 24 years, and eventually sold the club in 2004. Along the way, in 1994, he started working with a new venture with Friendswood, when he was contracted to manage the Fairfield Athletic Club. The FAC, as it is called, is part of the amenities package that is afforded homeowners in Fairfield, another one of Friendswood neighborhoods in west Houston. "Fairfield had really just been getting off the ground back in the early 90's, and the growth that has taken place since then is truly amazing - it's quite a settlement," John said lightheartedly. On this journey with Friendswood, Holladay was instrumental in investing into the development by adding four of the six tennis courts that are now a part of the 20 acre FAC recreational package. The Club also includes, swimming, indoor basketball, outdoor soccer and baseball fields, as well as a state of the art health and fitness center. In addition, programs are offered to youngsters before and after school and during the summer for working parents. Holladay's enthusiasm for tennis is not by chance - he played professional tennis in the 1970's (right after Abe Lincoln was president he likes to joke) competing in the US Open, Australian Open, and Wimbledon. John still plays tennis for fitness and fun, but also competes here and there. He and his daughter, Hannah, a recent graduate at UC Irvine, were ranked number 1 in the US in 2008, after winning three national titles. This past September he also won the United States Professional Tennis Association (USPTA) International Doubles Championships in the 55's division. "Although I love all kinds of sports and fitness, my heart belongs to tennis," he says, "and I have been very fortunate to spread my love of the game with many youngsters - and oldsters, due to my relationship with Friendswood at Copperfield and the homeowners at



Fairfield. I hope to continue to work for many years with our great team at Fairfield to bring health and well being to all of our participants in their favorite sport or fitness activity.

John Holladay and his staff at the FAC, would like to thank Friendswood Development Company, the resident board members, especially Ed Hofer for his continued support and hard work as well as the Fairfield Village Community Association and the on-site AMI property managers.

Fairfield Area Swim Team (FAST) is a neighborhood summer swim league that is part of the W1 division of NWAL (Northwest Aquatic League) which currently has over 99 swim teams. Fairfield's swim team has an awesome reputation as a neighborhood swim team, and we have our terrific 8 lane neighborhood pool, right here in Fairfield!!!

I've been treating headaches for over 25 years and I believe they are very misunderstood by the general public.

It's only human nature to have a reason for why something is occurring, so when people get a headache they usually try to determine the reason for their headache. Some of the reasons I hear are quite amusing. "My husband gives me a headache, ... my boss, ...my kids." "I sit at a computer all day and THAT is the reason I have a headache."Sometimes people think that headaches are just normal and everyone gets them. I can assure you that headaches are not normal. Headaches are a sign that there is something wrong. Just like all symptoms are signs that something is wrong.

Headaches can be caused by a lot of different things. They can be caused by exotic and dangerous things like a brain tumor, but more often they are caused by common things. The most common reason is pressure on the nerves of the neck that radiate back into the head. When the bones of the spine are misaligned it will put pressure on the delicate nerves that exit the spine. This will in turn cause the muscles of the neck and shoulders to become tight and develop knots in them You can actually reach up and feel the knots in your muscles. These knots are not normal and are a sign of spinal misalignment and soft tissue damage. Once the spinal misalignments are corrected the muscles relax more and the headaches are gone. Just for fun, I sometimes ask a headache patient when was the last they had a headache, once they have had their spine corrected. They will usually say something like "Gosh I haven't had a headache in months". I will ask them if they got divorced and they will look at me funny and say "NO, why?" You said your husband was the cause of your headaches! "Oh I guess I was wrong!"

So headaches are not normal, but are very common. They're usually caused by nerve pressure built up in the neck which causes tight muscles in the neck and shoulders. They can usually be corrected with gentle chiropractic therapy. You should get this checked even if the headaches are mild because if the bones of the spine are misaligned it will cause arthritic changes to form in the bones of the spine which will limit your ability to move and bend as well as other difficulties. Be proactive about your health.





# **Tennis** Tips

#### HOW TO EXECUTE THE SERVE

In previous newsletters, I offered tips on how to hit a forehand groundstroke, a two-handed backhand, one-handed backhand, forehand volley, and the two handed backhand volley. In this issue, I will give you instructions on how to execute the serve, considered as the most important stroke, since the player has complete control of the game at this time. In these pictures student Helen Bourgeois demonstrates the proper form and technique. Photos by Charlie Palafox.

**Step 1: Ready Position:** The body is sideways with the right hand holding the end of the racket in a forehand grip position and the left hand is holding the ball under the throat of the racket. The left arm is slightly straight and the ball is held with the thumb, index finger and middle finger. This allows for a consistent toss without using the wrist and/or elbow. Feet are a shoulder width apart and the body is in equal balance. For

beginners, it is okay to change the grip slightly toward the forehand grip. As the player gets more advanced, the continental grip will be a better one to give more spin on the ball.

**Step 2: Back Swing:** The left arm comes down and the right arm follows it. It is vital to slow down the motions to allow for both of the arms to have good balance in the front and behind the body. Notice that the hand is in the process of tossing the ball in front

of the body and the left wrist is bent down. It is imperative to have a good consistent toss since it will dictate the success or failure of the serve. **Step 3: The wind up:** While the ball is in the air, the right arm will

bend forcing the head of the racket to pick up speed by going behind the body. Notice the left arm is still up high and the toss is at least four to five inches above the possible point of contact on the sweet spot. The

head and eyes are focused on the ball and the body is still turned sideways. Knees are bent to allow maximum explosion of the lower body. Step 4: Point of contact: Once the player is ready to hit the ball, the right arm will force the racket toward the point of contact, while the left hand will come down toward the body. This allows for the "snap" of the wrist to accelerate and bring the ball down. Notice that the point of contact is slightly higher than then center of the racket. Eyes are still focused on the point of the contact and will be ready to look down as soon as the ball leaves the frame. The right hip is extended to allow the body to extend up.

**Step 5: Follow Through:** The racket speed will extend to the left side of the body. The

right foot is coming forward and is pointing toward the net. The trunk is straight and eyes are focused on the direction of the ball. At this point the player will take the split step and will jump either behind the base line to rally with the opponent or will move toward the net to serve and volley.



### Section for Kids with news, puzzles, games and more! Why Exercise Is Cool

Kids exercise all the time without even thinking of it. Just being active, like when you run around outside or play kickball at school, is a kind of exercise. What else counts as exercise? Playing sports, dancing, doing push-ups, and even reaching down to touch your toes.

When you exercise, you're helping build a strong body that will be able to move around and do all the stuff you need it to do.Try to be active every day and your body will thank you later!

#### EXERCISE MAKES YOUR HEART HAPPY

You may know that your heart is a muscle. It works hard, pumping blood every day of your life. You can help this important muscle get stronger by doing aerobic (say: airo-bik) exercise.

Aerobic means "with air," so aerobic exercise is a kind of activity that requires oxygen. When you breathe, you take in oxygen, and, if you're doing aerobic exercise, you may notice you're breathing faster than normal. Aerobic activity can get your heart pumping, make you sweaty, and quicken your breathing.

When you give your heart this kind of workout on a regular basis, your heart will get even better at its main job — delivering oxygen (in the form of oxygen-carrying blood cells) to all parts of your body.

So you want to do some aerobic exercise right now? Try swimming, basketball, ice or roller hockey, jogging (or walking quickly), inline skating, soccer, cross-country skiing, biking, or rowing. And don't forget that skipping, jumping rope, and playing hopscotch are aerobic activities, too!

### EXERCISE STRENGTHENS MUSCLES

Another kind of exercise can help make your muscles stronger. Did you ever do a push-up or swing across the monkey bars at the playground? Those are exercises that can build strength. By using your muscles to do powerful things, you can make them stronger. For older teens and adults, this kind of workout can make muscles bigger, too.

Here are some exercises and activities to build strong muscles:

- push-ups
- pull-ups
- tug-of-war
- rowing
- running
- inline skating
- bike riding

### EXERCISE MAKES YOU FLEXIBLE

Can you touch your toes easily without yelling ouch? Most kids are pretty flexible, which means that they can bend and stretch their bodies without much trouble. This kind of exercise often feels really good, like when you take a big stretch in the morning after waking up. Being flexible is having "full range of motion," which means you can move your arms and legs freely without feeling tightness or pain.

It's easy to find things to do for good flexibility:

tumbling and gymnastics

#### • yoga

- dancing, especially ballet
- martial arts
- simple stretches, such as touching your toes or side stretches

### EXERCISE KEEPS THE BALANCE

Food gives your body fuel in the form of calories, which are a kind of energy. Your body needs a certain amount of calories every day just to function, breathe, walk around, and do all the basic stuff. But if you're active, your body needs an extra measure of calories or energy. If you're not very active, your body won't need as many calories.

Whatever your calorie need is, if you eat enough to meet that need, your body weight will stay about the same. If you eat more calories than your body needs, it may be stored as excess fat.

#### EXERCISE MAKES YOU FEEL GOOD

It feels good to have a strong, flexible body that can do all the activities you enjoy — like running, jumping, and playing with your friends. It's also fun to be good at something, like scoring a basket, hitting a home run, or perfecting a dive.

But you may not know that exercising can actually put you in a better mood. When you exercise, your brain releases a chemical called endorphins (say: en-dor-funz), which may make you feel happier.
