The Jester Homeowners Association (HOA) held its annual meeting on Tuesday, April 2, and despite the heavy downpour that evening, a great group of residents still turned up to learn about what the HOA accomplished for 2012 and join in discussions about 2013. Diana Miller, President of the HOA thanked all the attendees for coming despite the weather and also acknowledged Ofek and Dana Bruhis two Jester babysitters who helped babysit. Highlights from 2012 include:

- the hiring of new landscaping, management, and insurance companies for better practice and cost efficiencies to the HOA
- the establishment of the Maintenance Guidelines and Firewise Committees

- landscaping renovations to the Jester Blvd. entrance

In 2013, we plan to continue with more landscaping improvements, such as a clean-up of Jester hill, and sponsor some new social and networking events. Teresa Gouldie, Social Chairman, shared that if any resident would like to start a new neighborhood group where people of like interests can meet each other, contact her and it can be promoted in the Warbler.

Treasurer Glen Brown shared budget results from 2012 and projections for 2013. By comparison to the budget entering the year, several administrative items were under budget, and the board approved expense for landscaping improvements over the original budget during the year. The 2013 budget reflects additional administrative cost savings and increases in landscaping and upkeep.

“30-feet For Firesafety” Weekend A HUGE Success!

Jester and Lakewood residents partnered with the City of Austin and the Texas A&M Forest Service to put a big dent in the neighborhoods' wildfire risk over the past month. Almost 40 properties have completed or will receive Firewise risk assessments, and over 100 properties signed up to participate in the special brush pickup associated with creating defensible space around our homes.

The highlight of the weekend event was a full-scale drill by the Austin Fire Department on Saturday, April 13th, which brought a fire department task force into the neighborhood to practice operations on a mock wildfire event in the canyon. Dozens of residents and local TV and newspaper reporters showed up to witness the event.

“The Jester-Lakewood Firewise partnership is an effective model

Food Safety Tips Help Prevent Food Poisoning

When getting together to cook for loved ones, the last thing you want is to get sick from the food you eat. Roberta Anding, a registered dietitian at Baylor College of Medicine, has a few tips to keep your food safe.

- Always use a meat thermometer to check if meat is fully cooked. The color of the meat can't determine the safety of the meat. All meat should be cooked to 165 degrees Fahrenheit.
 - Wash your hands frequently and thoroughly during food preparation.
 - Wash all produce before cutting and chopping.
 - Refrigerator leftovers within two hours.
 - Use a thermometer when reheating food as well.
- Following these basic guidelines will ensure that the food you serve is safe to eat, said Anding.

for the rest of Austin to be following,” said Jeff Shapiro, a Jester resident and chairman of the neighborhood Firewise Committee. “We certainly hope that other neighborhoods around the city will recognize, as we did, that wildfire safety requires homeowners to step up and prepare properties for a wildfire event. In a major fire, we can't simply assume that the fire department will be able to save every home, particularly those that haven't done their part to prepare.”




The Welcome Committee was happy to deliver 3 bags to new residents last month. They were to

NatureWatch

Visiting Vireos

Spring marks the return of many different bird species, including the small, foliage-gleaning vireos. Often confused with warblers, vireos are generally plain green or olive above and whitish or washed yellow below. They can have wing-bars, eye-rings or eye-lines, and are bigger-headed, thicker-billed, and more deliberate in their movements than their warbler cousins. For identification purposes, vireos are often separated into two distinct groups: those with both wing-bars and eye-rings (often called spectacles), and those without wing-bars but with eye-lines. Only the males sing, and these birds are often heard rather than seen.

In Central Texas, those vireos belonging to the first group include the White-eyed Vireo (*Vireo griseus*) and the endangered Black-capped Vireo (*Vireo atricapillus*). Like the common name implies, the White-eyed Vireo has white irises surrounding dark pupils, yellow spectacles, two whitish wing bars, and is greyish-olive above, white below, with a yellowish wash on its sides. Somewhat secretive, it prefers thickets of vines and is more often heard singing a short, harsh song from dense, brushy tangles within woods. The male Black-capped Vireo's glossy black cap contrasts sharply with its white spectacles and deep red eyes, and it is also olive above and whitish below, with yellowish wing-bars and sides. Its song is a series of twittering notes, and it is often very hard to see as it stays hidden while it moves about in oak scrub and thickets. This vireo is endangered across its range, largely due to habitat destruction and brood parasitism by the Brown-headed Cowbird.

Also returning by April is the Red-eyed Vireo (*Vireo olivaceus*) and the less commonly seen Warbling Vireo (*Vireo gilvus*). The Red-eyed Vireo has a ruby red iris, a white eyebrow bordered above and below with black, with a blue-grey crown, olive back, and whitish underparts. Its song is a persistent series of short phrases, and it prefers broad-leafed forests, often found foraging in oaks.

Warbling vireos are paler overall than Red-eyed vireos, having a white eyebrow with little to no black borders, a dark brown eye, grey or olive-grey above, and pale yellow to white below. Its song is a series of long but rapid, melodious, warbling phrases. This vireo is most often seen in spring and fall, as most pass through our area on their way to more northern breeding grounds or more southern wintering grounds.

All vireo species have a rather stout, cylindrical bill with a slightly hooked tip and one or two very small notches near the tip of the upper portion, as this aids them in capturing insects and tearing into fruit, which are the mainstays of their diet. Several species can exist in close proximity by utilizing different niches such as thickets and vines versus taller trees, which are both present in our forested canyons. They build well-formed, somewhat pendulous, open-cupped grass nests suspended from the fork of a small branch, with both parents feeding the young hatchlings.

Whether you actually see or just hear these spring beauties, take the time either way to enjoy our visiting vireos!
