A Note on Exterior Modifications to Your Home

All exterior alterations or improvements to a property in the ACIA neighborhood must be reviewed and approved in advance of construction by the Architectural Control Committee (ACC). Residents must complete an ACC Approval Request Form and mail it to Sterling at 562 Kingwood Dr. Suite 13, Kingwood, TX 77339 with a plat map/survey, drawings, samples, and photos/brochures describing the request.

The ACC will review the request and issue a written approval, conditional approval or disapproval within 30 days. If it is not approved as submitted, the ACC may provide suggestions for making changes so it can be resubmitted for approval.

Any applications dealing with the exterior appearance of the house (such as painting or roofing) must be accompanied with project details or the application might be disapproved for lack of information. Also include a plat map or survey of the property that indicates the project in conjunction to the property lines and easements when applicable.
