### GIRL SCOUT WRITES CHILDREN'S BOOK ON CANCER WITH CTRC'S HELP

"I know children are very curious," said Olivia Martin, 15. That's because Olivia had lots of questions herself eight years ago when her mother was diagnosed with breast cancer. The experiences of Olivia and her little brother inspired her Gold Award project for the Girl Scouts of Southwest Texas a short children's book called "C is for Cancer: A Guide for Children Whose Family Members Have Cancer." She presented the book to a group of patients Aug. 21 at the Cancer Therapy & Research Center, part of The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio.

Children want to know "Adults might think, 'Oh, they're young, they don't really know what's going on,'" Olivia said. "Even if you don't tell them anything, they can tell by body language." Olivia's book gives short, simple explanations about cancer, its stages and its treatment. She describes side effects like hair loss and vomiting in the gentlest terms, and also includes a section on what kids can do to help. "Helping wash the dishes, fold the laundry, and clean the house are some things you might have to do," she writes. "Do not be embarrassed if your family member is bald. Do not be afraid to ask questions. You do not have to be afraid of catching cancer. It is not contagious like a cold."

Helpful resource for parents Her mother, Jeanine Martin, recalled her own attempts to educate and reassure her small children when she was diagnosed. Both Olivia and her little brother had a lot of questions, she said. "Why won't the cells stop growing? Why do you have it and not somebody else? It was very difficult to find the answers to those questions at a child's level," Martin said. She also realized, after explaining the diagnosis and surgery, that they still faced chemotherapy and radiation. That brought more rounds of questions. "I don't think it was until I got to twice-a-year visits that they really started to relax," Martin said.

CTRC faculty and staff helped with the book CTRC faculty and staff members were among those who helped Olivia. They include Steve Weitman, M.D., Ph.D., director of the Institute for Drug Development; Mary Jackson, director of Patient and Family Services; and Kayla Jackson, senior research coordinator. Olivia is planning to publish her book online, and it is now posted on the CTRC website where people can access it for free. "It's a book you can give to kids, but it can also be a guideline for adults with younger children," Olivia said. "By children knowing what to expect, they won't be as fearful."

### **COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS**

The regular meeting held September 19th dealt with new fiscal year needs primarily. Council approved ratifying the 2013 property tax, approved the balanced 2013-2014 General Fund and Utility Fund Budgets, levied the property tax rate at .2663 per \$100 valuation same as 2012-2013 and included dates due, delinquent and applicable for early payment discounts. The exemptions were approved to remain as previous years. In addition, Council approved the 2013-2014 Staffing, Compensation and Benefits Package. The City is prepared to continue its operation activities effective October 1, 2013 for another year! You can view all budget materials on the city's website.

Jack Kassinger was born in Henderson, Ky, and grew up in nearby Livermore where he graduated from high school in 1967. In January 1968, when he was invited to be drafted into the U.S. Army, he elected to join the U.S. Marines.

Jack served one tour in Vietnam where he was wounded in action on Memorial Day 1969. Later, after returning from Vietnam, he served as a Marine Security Guard at the United Stated Embassy in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. He left the Marine Corps in 1972 and went to work for the Central Intelligence Agency. Since his retirement from the CIA, he has worked as the principal executive overseeing the construction of the American Embassy in Moscow, Russia, and the American Embassy in Beijing, China.

Jack is the recipient of the Intelligence Star and two Intelligence Medals of Merit awarded by the CIA and numerous other citations by the Department of Defense.

Jack began writing his memoir, "*Holding Hands with Heroes*," to give his children an appreciation for the work he did as a CIA employee. He discovered he enjoys the creative outlet writing provides. He has now authored two novels that draw heavily on his experience in the CIA - *Noble Cause* and *Storms Over Zimbabwe: The OPCON Finding*.

He has done presentations at the Marine Corps Heritage Museum in Quantico, Virginia, local Rotary Clubs and the Assistance League of San Antonio.

Jack resides in Fair Oaks Ranch, Texas, with his wife, Cherie. They have two children, Emily Rose married to Scott Rose and Jesse Kassinger married to Michelle Nichols Kassinger. They are the proud grandparents of five grandchildren. In addition to writing, Jack enjoys golf and travel.
