

BOARD MESSAGE

We hope everyone had a happy and safe holiday. Welcome to 2014! Please don't forget to mark your calendars to attend the Courtyard Homeowners' Association annual meeting starting at 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, January 26, 2014 in the lobby of the office building located at the intersection of Courtyard Drive and North Scout Island Circle. Information about this meeting will be coming by mail to you soon. Please read the written materials about the meeting when they arrive, sign, and mail in your proxy as soon as possible to help us avoid the costs of rescheduling a second annual meeting. Remember that sending in your proxy early will not prevent you from showing up at the meeting and voting directly yourself. Receiving your proxy just helps insure we will have a quorum and gives us the ability to conduct necessary business if you do not attend. If you have any questions, please contact any Board member or Marilyn Childress.

The terms of two directors end this January, and one of the necessary things we will do at this meeting is vote to fill those positions. We are very happy to announce that Cathleen Barrett has decided to give us three more years of her time and will run for a second term. Cathleen is also our Caller editor, and we are very thankful for all the time and care she puts into every issue. After many years of serving our community on the Board and as Chairman of the Landscaping and Decoration Committee, Ed Ueckert has decided someone else should have some of the fun and will not run for another term. However, Ed has promised to continue to help out with irrigation, electrical, and landscaping problems and for that we are very lucky and thankful. Another important matter to consider is the need to raise annual dues by \$52.00 starting in 2015. This comes out to a \$1 a week and is long, long overdue. In addition to the increased costs of everything we do as part of the routine maintenance of the common areas, you are all aware that the Courtyard has suffered the repercussions of extreme and severe weather events over the last several years — both

flooding and drought. After going through a major cleanup following the 2010 flood, the recent heavy October 2013 rains caused the waters of Bull Creek to again cover major parts of the woods and the peninsula near the pier, and fill in our channels and areas within the pond and around the island with new silt. This new debris needs to be cleared before the pond is filled in completely. In the aftermath of the recent deadly Central Texas fires and recognizing the continuing threat that hill country communities face, the Board has begun what will be a long, difficult - but very important process of making our neighborhood safer in the event of a wildfire. Initial fire safety work will involve clearing the common areas of years of dead and dried vegetation and wood that all become deadly tinder during the dry summer months. Very simply, we cannot accomplish this important work plus the regular maintenance of our common areas with the current dues. Without this raise, the Board cannot continue to maintain our facilities and common areas as required by the Declaration. Please call and talk with a Board member if you have any questions.

Looking ahead - to help safeguard our trees from oak wilt, keep in mind that January is your last month to finish up any tree trimming projects. Get it done now. Oak trees should not be trimmed from February through June, as this is when the carrier beetle is most active. Play it safe & safeguard your shade. Blue trash days this month are Saturday, January 4 (holiday slide) and Fridays January 17 and 31. Please do not leave containers out for days before or after Friday pick-ups.

Finally, drivers - please continue to watch your speed in the Courtyard as you come and go during this darkest time of the year. Our many walkers and runners (both 2 & 4 legged varieties) can help, too, by wearing light and/or reflective clothing, carrying a flashlight, and not taking up more space than is needed to get by on our streets. Everyone benefits when we make the effort to keep our neighborhood safe. Hope to see you at the Annual Meeting.



It is an easy, safe, and free way to communicate with one another regarding issues directly related to our neighborhood. Nextdoor The Courtyard is a quick and effective way to get the word out about such things as a break-in, finding/recommending a trustworthy babysitter, recommendations for tradesmen, asking for help finding a lost pet, or announcing community events. As of 12/9/13, we were up to 73 members and growing. "Nextdoor's mission is to use the power of technology to build stronger and safer neighborhoods."

NEXTDOOR in the City of Austin

The City of Austin is now working with Nextdoor to provide official notifications and alerts to all neighborhoods across the city. As part of this effort, you will see periodic updates from various city departments, including the police, on Nextdoor The Courtyard. For example, you may receive updates about nearby road closures or safety issues that are relevant to our neighborhood.

It is important to note that city staff can only see their own posts and replies to these posts. They can NOT access or view any information that you or our neighbors have shared on Nextdoor The Courtyard, including your profile information. Access to Nextdoor The Courtyard is still restricted to members who can verify that they live within the neighborhood boundary.

Communicating with city staff is entirely voluntary. You can choose to:

- Comment publicly on city posts to start a community dialogue
- Contact city staff via private message
- Mute city staff if you'd prefer not to receive updates
- Adjust the amount of email notifications you receive by changing your email settings
