# **Neighborhood Safety Updates**

### Suspicious Man Posing as Home Security Technician

In July, a suspicious man reportedly attempted to gain access to a home by posing as a home security employee. He claimed he was from a company that was "bought out" and needed to upgrade equipment.

This a common tactic of scammers and other criminals, say home security services like ADT, LifeShield and FrontPoint. Reputable security companies most often call ahead to tell you a service person is coming, and service personnel for these companies will have clear identification.

### Tips on Having the 'Stranger Danger' Conversation with Your Kids

With school beginning, it's a good time to discuss stranger danger. The National Crime Prevention Council advises, "Help children recognize the warning signs of suspicious behavior, such as when an adult asks them to disobey their parents or do something without permission, asks them to keep a secret, asks children for help, or makes them feel uncomfortable in any way. Also tell your children that an adult should never ask

a child for help, and if one does ask for their help, teach them to find a trusted adult right away to tell what happened."

The Council adds, "Make sure that your children know that it is okay to say no to an adult in a dangerous situation and to yell to keep themselves safe, even if they are indoors.

It's good to practice this in different situations so that your children will feel confident in knowing know what to do."

### Other tips:

- Point out safe places. Show your children safe places to play, safe roads and paths to take, and safe places to go if there's trouble
- Teach children to trust their instincts.

Explain that if they ever feel scared or uncomfortable,

they should get away as fast as they can and tell an adult. Tell them that sometimes adults they know may make them feel uncomfortable, and they should still get away as fast as possible and tell another adult what happened. Reassure children that you will help them when they need it.

- Teach your children to be assertive. Make sure they know that it's okay to say no to an adult and to run away from adults in dangerous situations.
- Encourage your children to play with others. There's safety in numbers!

# District 6 City Council Forum is in September

For the first time in Austin's history voters will select an Austin City Council from 10 geographic single-member districts. This change to geographic representation was approved by voters Nov. 6, 2012, as Proposition 3, commonly referred to as 10-ONE.

For those new to the area, Hunter's Chase is in City of Austin District 6.

Under this Charter amendment, the Mayor will continue to be elected city-wide, with 10 council members to be elected only by the voters in the area in which they reside.

The City of Austin in partnership with the City's Ethics Review Commission and the Austin League of Women Voters will conduct a series of single-member district City Council Candidate Forums for the November 2014 election. The District 6 forum will be held from 6pm-8pm on September 15 at:

The first race in the challenge is the Run to learn more.


