STEEPLECHASE IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS UPDATE

Monument construction has been completed but the new lighting and landscaping has been delayed due to the May rains. This work should be complete by the end of June.

Likewise progress on the parks has been delayed by the weather and completion is now projected for early fall.

Pool joint replacement and pool office renovation should be completed by mid-summer. Plans are being made to rent the pool office area for smaller group meetings.

RESIDENT SURVEY RESULTS SUMMARIZED

The Steeplechase BOD thanks everybody who took time to complete the survey and submit comments about the pool, clubhouse, tennis courts and the cul-de-sacs. All of the comments were reviewed by the BOD and will be taken into consideration as future plans are made and actions taken.

This following summarizes the survey results.

- Tennis court usage is light. Comments included resurfacing request and removal of some courts for other activities. The most common rating for the courts was "okay".
- Pool tags were purchased by about half of the participants. Nearly 90% of pool ratings were "okay", "good" and "very nice". Considerable comments were made about the need for better control of pool activity by the lifeguards and better performance by the pool service company (don't check tags, dangerous play [hard football] in the pool, kiddie pool disgusting, lifeguards lazy, etc.). There were also suggestions about offering snacks/drinks, keeping the hot tub working in the adult pool, extending the season, etc... PLEASE NOTE THAT THE POOL SERVICE COMPANY FOR 2015 HAS NEW MANAGEMENT. YOU SHOULD HAVE RECEIVED A LETTER FROM THE POOL COMPANY MANAGEMENT IN MAY. ALSO, THE HOT TUB WAS REPAIRED LAST YEAR.
- There is high awareness that the clubhouse can be rented with about half noting that they have rented or will rent. Ratings on the clubhouse were overwhelming "okay", "good" and "very nice". There were several comments about the resident rental rate being "too expensive". Some participants indicated that they couldn't find any information about how to rent or the cost.
- Cul-de-Sac ratings were rated "poor" and "okay" by nearly all the participants. There were numerous suggestions to include "no outlet" signage, enforce no parking on the island, as well as re-sodding, new trees, benches and flowers, etc... SCIA HAS BUDGETED TO BEGIN IMPROVEMENTS IN THE CUL-DE-SACS THIS YEAR. THIS IS PLANNED TO BE A MULTI-YEAR PROGRAM DUE TO BUDGETING CONSTRAINTS.



STEEPLECHASE



Cicadas are fairly large insects but can vary in size with some growing over 1 ½ inches. Color may also vary depending upon species, but many are brown

or green. All cicadas have bulging eyes and, on adults, wings that are held

roof-like over the body. The wings are semi-transparent with thick wing veins.

Cicadas have 2-5 year life cycles and appear in Texas in mid to late summer.

Females insert egg clusters into branches of trees using their saw-like ovipositor

The majority of their life cycle is spent underground.



(egg laying structure). Eggs hatch after about 6 weeks and small nymphs drop to the ground where they burrow into the soil. Nymphs feed on sap of tree roots with their piercing-sucking mouthparts. After becoming fully developed, nymphs emerge from the ground at night and climb onto nearby objects such as tree trunk, plants, fences, etc. Adult cicadas emerge from the last nymphal stage leaving behind the exuviae (cast skin). Adults can live 5-6 weeks.

Male cicadas are well known for their "song". They rest on a tree and produce a whining sound to attract females. The sound is produced by two vibrating membranes on the side of the abdomen. Females do not "sing". Adults feed on juices from tender twigs, but usually do not cause lasting harm to the plant from feeding.
