
# Courtyard Book Club

Join the Courtyard Book Club in September to discuss Sue Monk Kidd's novel "The Invention of Wings". The story, set in pre-Civil War Charleston, South Carolina, follows the lives of Sarah, the daughter of a wealthy plantation owner, and Hetty "Handful" Grimke, a Charleston slave. The novel begins on Sarah's eleventh birthday when she is given ownership of Handful, who is to be her handmaid. Soon, Sarah and Handful have established a bond built on affection and guilt. Sarah voices her opposition to slavery early in her life, yet, she must live with it. Handful is spirited and sharp tongued. As Sarah and Handful mature their lives take separate courses. "The Invention of Wings" follows their lives for the next thirty-five years. The author's inspiration is the real Sarah Grimke, daughter of an elite Charleston family, who fought for abolition and women's rights, and her slave Hetty.


