

NATIONAL NIGHT OUT

Kyle, TX, to join cities nationwide for "America's Night Out against Crime"

On Tuesday, October 6, our Plum Creek neighborhood will join forces with over 16,000 communities nationwide for the 32st Annual National Night Out crime and drug prevention event. National Night Out is designed to:

- Heighten crime and drug prevention awareness,
- Generate support for, and participation in, local anticrime efforts,
- Strengthen neighborhood spirit and law enforcementcommunity partnerships
- Send a message to criminals that our neighborhood is organized & fighting back.

From 5-8pm on October 6, you are asked to lock your doors, turn on your porch light, and spend the evening outside with neighbors, police, firefighters, and EMS workers. Plum Creek HOA will host 4 block parties: Haupt

Park, Kirby Park, Decker Park, and McNaughton Park. Find your nearest park, invite your neighbors, and come on by.

Door prize drawings will be held throughout the evening. Games and prizes will be available for children. Kyle police, firemen, and EMS workers will be available for visiting and to show off their vehicles. ADT Security, Van Guard Safety Cameras, and other vendors will also be available at the Haupt Park Community Center from 5-8pm. Everyone is invited to bring food or drinks to share. Paper products will be provided.

National Night Out is a night for us to stand together to promote awareness, safety, neighborhood unity, and give crime and drugs a going away party!

PLEASE TRIM THOSE TREES!

Winter is the Perfect Time!

Due to safety concerns, the HOA is evaluating street and yard trees that encroach on the sidewalk and streets. Since these trees belong to the homeowner, we want to provide residents with the opportunity to prune their own trees. The HOA requests that you prune your trees seven (7) feet above the sidewalk to prevent injury and fourteen (14) feet to prevent damage to emergency vehicles. Corner lots and round about lots need to clear limbs for sight distance of traffic signs and oncoming vehicular traffic at intersections.

City of Kyle and Hays CISD regularly drive through Plum Creek to inspect for drivability for large fire trucks and schools buses.

We have a short window to prune in winter, but this time of year is best for pruning!

When raising your tree's canopy, follow proper pruning techniques, including cleaning tools between trees and wound spraying any cuts on all OAK trees to prevent Oak Wilt.







GARAGE SAFETY TIPS





- Make sure that the garage door opener control button is out of reach of small children so that they do not play with the controls.
- Consult the owner's manual and learn how to use the garage door's emergency release feature. This can be important in case of a power outage or other emergency.
- Visually inspect the garage door each month. Look at springs, cables, rollers and pulleys for signs of wear. Do not attempt to remove, adjust or repair these parts or anything attached to them. A trained door repairman must make adjustments to these parts, which are under high tension.
- Never place fingers between door sections and explain the dangers to children. If you have small children, consider a door with panels that can't pinch. Avoid cables, springs, and riding or playing on a moving
- While on vacation, unplug the garage door opener unit or use a vacation lock console security switch, which renders remotes unusable and is an optional accessory to most openers.
- Never leave the remote control in the car or with a parking attendant. Consider using a key chain remote and always lock the entry to the inside of your home especially if your opener is programmed to your vehicle. It is a small inconvenience for safety and security.
