

Residents of Willowbridge HOA **NEW TRASH COLLECTION SCHEDULE**

Beginning Thursday - December 3rd BEST TRASH will be your trash and recycling collection provider TRASH COLLECTION WILL CHANGE TO MONDAY AND THURSDAY RECYCLE WILL BE MONDAY Please have trash and recycling out by 7:00 am

On each regularly scheduled collection day, Best Trash will collect residential refuse in resident supplied containers between 30-50 gallons and weighing up to 40 pounds, located at the curbside within 3' of the street.

Trees, shrubs, brush trimmings and fencing must be bundled up to 40 pounds, in lengths no greater than 4 feet with no branch diameter exceeding 3 inches. The bundling is required to allow quick pickup and size limitations are required to avoid damaging the equipment in the crushing process.

Items excluded from normal collection are dirt, rocks, bricks, concrete, tires, batteries, motor oil, cooking oil, waste generated by a private contractor or any materials or items deemed hazardous materials. Please do not dispose of gasoline, motor oil, paints, cooking oil, or any other liquid items in a container that is not visible to Contractor personnel. If it results in spillage, that causes a stain, Best Trash is not responsible for the clean up. Best Trash will leave a tag explaining the reason for non-collected item(s).

Items such as appliances, furniture, carpet (up to 1 room, rolled up four feet wide and less than 40 pounds), will be picked up either of your collection days. By Federal Law, refrigerators and freezers or any other items containing Freon must be drained of Freon and have an accompanying bill to validate such service was performed.

RECYCLE: Best Trash takes great pride in our recycling program and efforts. Ensuring the best recycle program for our customers takes time and effort on both sides. Please remove caps, liquids and food products from inside the containers. Please only use the recycle bins for recyclable materials, not as an extra trash container.

Best Trash will collect all paper products, all plastics, aluminum and tin cans, cardboard boxes, ALL COLORS GLASS that are placed within the provided recycling cart. If items exceed container capacity, please place them adjacent to the cart well marked as recycling materials.

Best Trash will provide each current residence with one 65 gallon recycling cart. Best Trash will replace any carts that are defective or otherwise become unusable due to normal wear and tear. Lost or stolen carts will be replaced at the residents expense for \$65.00 each.

Holidays: If your regular pick-up falls on a holiday (New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th – Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day), the pick-up will be made on the next regular scheduled pick-up day. If your recycling day falls on a holiday it will be picked up the next week on your normal scheduled recycle day.

10 tricks to make your life easier and your home ready for the holidays

1)Drop your phone in water? Quick- stick it in a jar of rice. You may be able to absorb the moisture before it does damage. First, power the phone off. If you can, remove the battery and towel it and the phone dry. Fill a jar with regular dry, uncooked rice and leave it for up to 2 days.

4) If pet hair on your carpets is the problem, don't grab the vacuum first. Get your squeegee from the garage and run it over the carpet and just stand back and watch all the pet hair come up. Then grab the vacuum.

5) Is there greasy buildup on your cabinets, and you're about to host a holiday party. Don't panic. Simply combine 1 tablespoon of cooking oil with 2 tablespoons of baking soda and those cabinets with shine.

6) Do you enjoy your favorite lasagna of casserole this time of year, but hate the cleanup of your glass baking dishes. The solution is a ball of aluminum foil and a tiny bit of dish soap to get all the food residue up before putting in the dishwasher.

7) Enjoy making soups, sauces or frozen beverages, but don't have room in the dishwasher for your blender. All you need to do it fill it half way, put ¼ teaspoon of dish soap and turn the blender on medium then high for 1 minute. It leaves is clean and residue free every time

8)Oh, you broke a glass right before company shows up and you can't see every little shard on the floor or carpet. Take a piece of sandwich bread and push down on the area. You'll be amazed how much glass it picks up.

9)Are your TVs and computer screens full of dust? DON'T use any cleaning sprays. Simply get a coffee filter open it up and rub over the surface. You can't imagine how much dust was once there. 10) With every holiday party comes leftovers, and sometimes your fridge suffers. To absorb smells and odors from your fridge, don't use an open box of baking soda, get your newspaper and put it in overnight. You won't believe the difference in the morning.

The Recipe Box: Pumpkin Gingerbread Trifle

This dessert is great for a crowd or party, easy to make, can be made days ahead, and a super delicious addition to any holiday. **Ingredients**

2(1/1) output) packs

- 2(14-ounce) packages gingerbread mix
- 1(5.1- ounce) box cook-and-serve vanilla pudding mix
- 1(30-ounce) can pumpkin pie filling
- $^{1\!\!/_{\!\!2}}$ cup packed brown sugar
- 1/3 teaspoon ground cardamom or cinnamon
- 1(12-ounce) container frozen whipped topping
- ¹/₂ cups gingersnaps, optional

Directions

Bake the gingerbread according to the package directions: cool completely. Meanwhile, prepare the pudding and set aside to cool. Stir the pumpkin pie filling, sugar, and cardamom into the pudding. Crumble 1 batch of gingerbread into the bottom of a large pretty bowl. Pour ½ of the pudding mixture over the gingerbread, then add a layer of whipped topping. Repeat with the remaining gingerbread, pudding and whipped topping. Sprinkle the top with crushed gingersnaps, if desired. Refrigerate overnight. Trifle can be layered in a punch bowl.
