<u>Wortham Villages</u> WHAT CAN TREES

Trees positivily affect us and our communities. Trees help clean our air. They remove pollution and fossil fuel emmissions from the atomsphere, improving the air quality we breath. Trees absorb carbon dioxide (CO^2), removing the carbon and releasing oxygen back into the air helping to reduce the effects of climate change. While we rely on our cars to get us around, trees remain hard at work absorbing the CO^2 cars emit while driving.

DO FOR YOU? LOTS!

Think of your office. Workers with a view of trees report less stress and more satisfaction, certainly helping contribute to our health. And trees properly placed around buildings help reduce air conditioning needs as well as save energy used for heating. Trees that are positioned well around our homes can reduce a households energy consumption for heating and cooling reducing energy costs annually.

Trees providing shade will cool surface and air temperatures. This lowers temperatures by 20° to 45°F compared to unshaded surfaces. Evaporation of water from trees offers a cooling environment as they release water vapor into the air through their leaves.

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Some studies have shown outdoor spaces including trees as part of the natural landscape have less graffiti and littering when compared to plant-less spaces. Many neighbors enjoy walking around our lake. The addition of trees lets us share this space with wildlife species that depend on trees for their food and shelter.

Lets not forget, trees increase our property values. Planting and caring for trees bring many benefits to our community. Their visual impact helps beautify, they provide cleaner air and lower energy costs. Go out and water a tree today!


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
