

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

CITY OF AUSTIN BULK PICK UP NOTICE

The City will begin conducting a bulk trash pickup in the neighborhood starting on Monday September 5th.

Bulk Items Include: Doors, carpet, furniture, appliances (remove doors), passenger car tires (remove rims, limit eight tires per household), lawn mowers (remove gas/oil), railroad ties (cut in half), pallets, rolled fencing, nail-free lumber

Bulk Item Collection Crews Cannot Collect: Brush, household trash, cardboard boxes, hazardous materials, mirrors, automotive chassis and bodies, motorcycles, trailers, boats and tires that are still mounted on rim, sheet glass and other construction and remodeling debris

Collection Guidelines

• Place bulk items at the curb in front of your house by 6:30 a.m. on the first day of your scheduled collection week

• Separate items into three piles as described below.

• To prevent damage to your property, keep items 5 feet away from your trash cart, mailbox, fences or walls, water meter, telephone connection box and parked cars. Do not place any items under low hanging tree limbs or power lines.

• Austin Resource Recovery only collects bulk items from its residential trash and recycling customers.

• Items will not be collected if they are in front of a vacant lot or in front of a business.

• Do not put items in bags, boxes or other containers. Bulk collection is for items too large to fit in containers. Bags will be treated as extra trash and are subject to extra trash fees.

Separate Items into Three Piles

• Metal Items – Includes appliances (remove doors). These are taken to our Resource Recovery Center for recycling

• Passenger car tires – Rims must be removed. Limit eight tires per household. We cannot collect truck or tractor tires. Tires will go to a tire recycling facility.

• Non-metal items – Includes carpeting and nail-free lumber. These items go to a land fill. Austin Resource Recovery is working on plans to salvage reusable items from bulk collection to help meet the City of Austin's Zero Waste goal.

Because these piles are collected by different trucks, they may be collected at different times throughout the week.

Get Ready for Pruning Season!


Oak Wilt has been very active this year. After moving more slowly during the drought years, the recent few years of rain have made Oak Wilt get back to its normal 75 feet a year pace. While Oak Wilt will continue to move from tree to tree in existing Oak Wilt spots, spring is almost over and so is the threat of getting new centers.

Between February 1st and June 30th is when Oak Wilt infected red oaks can produce "fungal mats" which beetles can land on and get the spores on their body. Then, when wounds are created on other red oaks or live oaks, the beetles can fly to the fresh tree wounds and transfer the Oak Wilt fungus from its body to the wounded tree. While there is no way to eliminate the risk of contracting Oak Wilt, not pruning live limbs on oak trees during the spring is a great way to reduce the risk of contracting Oak Wilt.

So, get ready for pruning season! By taking care of pruning needs in the late summer, fall or winter, you can often improve the structure of the tree and improving the strength of remaining limbs. Then, when spring time comes again, you just need to focus on pruning hazardous limbs or limbs that get damaged during a storm. Always remember to paint the pruning cut or wound with a spray can immediately any time of year.

When Oak Wilt concerns arise in Circle C, contact the Oak Wilt forester at the City of Austin at (512) 974-1881. This website also has lots of information regarding the diagnosis, management and prevention of Oak Wilt.

Dead spots in the lawn? Look for chinch bugs

Chinch bugs often appear in Texas lawns during hot, dry conditions. Usually damage starts in sunny locations or near driveway and sidewalk areas. Damage appears as irregular dead patches in the lawn surrounded by yellowing or dying grass. Chinch bug damage can be mistaken for other lawn problems like white grubs or fungal diseases, so confirmation of chinch bug activity is needed before choosing proper treatment.

So how do you tell if you have chinch bugs? The easiest way is to look for the insects. One way to look is to cut both ends out of a can, push it into the ground using a twisting motion and then fill the can with water for about 10 minutes and wait for any bugs to float to the top. Another way would be to get down on your hands and knees and part the grass to look for the insects. For both methods, samples should be taken in the damaged (yellowed grass), not dead, grass areas.

Chinch bugs are small (about 1/5 of an inch as adults; immatures are smaller). Adults are black with white wings containing triangular markings. Nymphs, or immatures, are yellowish or pinkish with a light colored band across their body. Nymphs do not have fully developed wings.

Treatment is usually a liquid or granular formulation. Liquid

formulations are often bottles that attach to the end of the garden hose or concentrates that you mix with water in a tank sprayer. Granular formulations are applied with push spreaders and need to be watered in after treatment.

Treatment should be applied to the area where damage is occurring and several feet out from the damaged area; the entire yard does not have to be treated. All label instructions should be read and followed before and during the treatment.

BLUE JAYS ARE NOT BLUE?

Blue Jays are easy to recognize because of their crest and their beautiful blue, black and white markings. They are also one of our larger birds, some reaching a foot long. Although beautiful, structural colors. To explain as simply as possible, the blue in the Blue Jay is caused by microscopic structures in the feather that refract light like a prism. When the light passes through a dark

some consider them a nuisance because they can be aggressive. Aggressiveness towards humans can occur when a Blue Jay is protecting its nest. They've also been known to dive-bomb cats and dogs. They can imitate the sounds of the Red-shouldered Hawk and often do this to keep predators away from the nest. Because they are such good parents and very protective, TWRC Wildlife Center rarely receives any eyes-closed nestlings at the Center.

Did you know that Blue Jays aren't really blue? The color we see is the result of the inner structure of the feathers. There are two types of color in birds—pigmented and structural. The cardinal looks red because the feathers really are red. This is pigmented. Blue and green are unique colors in the animal kingdom and are considered



layer of melanin, some wavelengths are filtered out, and the bird looks blue. Feathers look blue for the same reason the sky looks blue.

In late summer you may see a bald Blue Jay. Don't automatically assume that it is sick or has been attacked by another animal. Blue Jays, as well as Cardinals, go through a complete molt of their head feathers but they do grow back.

During the spring, TWRC Wildlife Center admits hundreds of Blue Jays,

both adults and babies. They are admitted to our on-site care program and require daily care. If you'd like to learn how to feed and care for Blue Jays, volunteer and become a part of our Baby Bird Program. It's fun, it's rewarding and you'll be helping our wildlife. How to execute The Forehand Service Return

In previous newsletters, I offered tips on how to hit a forehand groundstroke, a two-handed backhand, one-handed backhand, forehand volley, the two handed backhand volley, the serve, the forehand half-volley, the one-handed backhand volley and the overhead "smash".

In this issue, I will offer you instructions on how to execute the second most important shot in the game of tennis: The Service Return, since it is the response to the first most important shot of the game: The Serve. In the illustrations, Jill Schmidt, player at the Grey Rock Tennis Club, shows the proper technique to execute this stroke.

Step 1: The Ready Position: When Jill is getting ready to return the serve, her eyes are focused on the tennis ball held by the opponent. Knees are relaxed and the hands are holding the racket with a relaxed grip.

Step 2: The Back Swing: Once Jill realizes that the ball has been directed to her forehand, she will turn her upper body and will take the racket back. Notice that the left hand is up in front to allow her to keep her center of gravity in the center. She has loaded her weight on her right foot and will be ready to step forward to meet the ball

Step 3: The Point of Contact: Jill now is ready to step into the ball. She has kept her eye on the ball and her center of gravity now is shifted to the point of contact. Notice the left knee being slightly bent and the left foot is pointing to the ball meeting the racket

Step 4: The Extension of the Point of Contact: Jill is now directing the ball toward the opponent's court. Her eyes have now shifted toward her target and her body weight is now fully in front of her left foot. The left hand is still helping to keep the center of gravity in the center without opening up too early.

Step 5: The Follow Through: Once Jill has finished her stroke, the momentum of the racket continues to move almost to a point behind her neck. Her left hand is next to her body and her right elbow is pointing toward her target. Her body is now ready to take the "split step" with both feet in order to prepare for the opponent's returned shot.



Hey Circle C, the Squires Team is off to a blazing start in the first 7 months of real estate, already selling 26 homes in Circle C Ranch and 9 other properties around Austin for almost \$19,000,000. in sales to date. That said, the real estate cycle has been bouncing from extraordinary to tepid and all levels in between. If you watch the builders in the area, what their actions indicate will tell you the immediate future of what is happening in the micro-market of Southwest Austin and Circle C Ranch. The month of June is the major turning point of each year in Circle C. When school is out, people take their kids and go on vacation for 2-4 weeks and then resume their home search once back from their break. After July 4th, it generally picks up with last minute, before-school buyers and we are slammed through the rest of the year. Last year, in August of 2015, the local builder (Cal Atlantic aka Standard Pacific aka Streetman Homes) started reducing their prices as they saw the market starting to fall in Avana and Grey Rock Ridge. They had been pushing the price ceiling ever since October of 2012 when this whole market shot through the roof. Their intention last August was to sell off all of their inventory of speculation homes (pre-built homes under construction hoping a buyer buys them) by the end of the year in December 2015. Prices dropped throughout much of Circle C Ranch in September 2015 by 2-3 -4% in most instances, with some even more. Of course, there are always going to be exceptions in every case with each individual property selling based on it's own merits. The market had hit the saturation point and there were only so many buyers that can afford \$400,000.+ for new and resale homes in Circle C. The large home buyers had already purchased to have their kids in school by fall and to get acclimated to the neighborhood. In January of 2016 the market was once again deplete of listings, so the prices went up quickly and it has been a super-hot market through April. Builders realizing their mistakes last year have already begun to slash prices starting in May and are continuing to do so as we go through June and into July/August. They are trying to move their inventory early this year and Cal Atlantic is further enhancing their efforts by paying 4% for realtors to bring buyers out to their homes. They are trying to sell everything, once again, before Christmas. Yes, this is early and may be a wake-up call to the marketplace... As Circle C Ranch goes, so goes the rest of the southwest area. Now, the builders in Rim Rock are paying agents 6% to bring a buyers out to their products sitting on the ground. Also, being an election year will have some sort of impact on buyer confidence, not knowing the direction the country will be led, etc. That will pass after the election and everyone will get settled in for whatever that future holds. The market is still very active in Circle C, but when bringing a re-sale home to the market it must be as clean, neat, staged, upgraded and updated as can be, to be able to compete with the new homes or possibly reflect the property's deficits in price. All areas of Circle C have different values and each have their plusses and minuses. Not everyone wants to live in Avana or Circle C North or Vintage Place or wherever else for their own reasons. Some buyers wish to be just in Kiker Elementary and some wish to be just in Clayton. We will see how the market shakes out after July 4th and gauge the sales strength of the market by the time you read this newsletter. 
