Butler's Bridge / West Bend Community Improvement Association Yard of the Month Guidelines

OVERVIEW

Homeowners of West Bend CIA/"Butler's Bridge" will be sponsoring a perpetual, self-governed "Yard of the Month" program.

The purpose of the program is to recognize West Bend CIA / "Butler's Bridge" neighbors who demonstrate above-average efforts in maintaining their property, thereby contributing to the overall appearance of the community at large. There is a great award and the program is administered entirely by volunteers. All award winners receive an official "Butler's Bridge Yard of the Month" lawn-sign, to be placed on their property for the duration of their award month. If your sign becomes lost or damaged, please request a replacement by sending an e-mail to WBCIA@yahoo.com. Position of the sign should be prominent in the yard located midway between the street and the front of the house. The West Bend CIA / "Butler's Bridge" Yard of the Month group congratulates all "Yard of the Month" award selections and encourages all neighbors to join the efforts of these homeowner's in keeping their yards and homes beautiful.

CONTEST GUIDELINES:

All current West Bend CIA / "Butler's Bridge" properties are automatically eligible by default.

- Award winners are selected based on the recommended judging criteria listed below.
- Recipients must reside in West Bend CIA / "Butler's Bridge".
- Key criteria include manicured yard, beautification, originality and creativity.

- The upkeep of the yard can reflect the efforts of the residents themselves or that of a professional landscaper or groundskeeper.
- An award duration term lasts a single calendar month and runs from the first day of the month to the last day of that same month.
- The same property cannot receive more than one award in the same rolling 12 month calendar period. At least 12 months must elapse between awards for the same yard.
- Recipients receiving awards in the middle of the month shall surrender their award at the end of that same month.
- More than one Yard of the Month recipient may be selected in a single month. In other words, multiple yards may be concurrently recognized.
- While an individual's home is being recognized as a West Bend CIA / "Butler's Bridge" "Yard of the Month" they are expected to maintain their yard in the same manner that allowed them to win the title.

RECOMMENDED JUDGING CRITERIA

West Bend CIA / "Butler's Bridge" Yard of the Month candidates are judged solely on the total exterior appearance of their property and front yard as viewed from the street. General upkeep of the yard and property is paramount. Factors include the overall appearance, tidiness and neatness of the front of the property as evidenced by pruned, trimmed and shaped foliage, edged and defined lawns, borders & flower beds, and a visually appealing facade.

LAWN: Healthy grass with no bare spots or excessive weeds. Grass shall be mowed and edged, and grass around foundations and fences shall be trimmed. Debris (garbage, pet feces, etc.) shall be picked up and removed. A unified, simple and balanced landscape design. Neat and natural.

LANDSCAPE & FLOWER BEDS: Beds weeded and edged. Flowers deadheaded and dead plants removed. Trees and shrubs pruned. Natural areas cleaned. Beautification efforts including

new flowers, new trees, new shrubs, etc. Plantings in scale with the surroundings and limited to a few different types of plants rather than too many which may confuse the eye.

WALKWAYS & DRIVEWAYS:

Walkways and driveways shall be clean (including trash containers or yard products removed from view). Area in front of curb free from debris and dirt. Evening appearance after dusk including accent lighting, safety lighting, visible interior lighting, etc.

AESTHETICS: Overall look of landscaping (formal versus informal, use of color and textures, garden art). Inviting look of front entryway (hanging baskets, pots, cleanliness etc.) Originality/creativity (any special touches of the owner i.e., yard art, bird feeders, etc.)

Summary note: While lack of strict adherence to the criteria above does not necessarily result in a disqualification, these principles offer general guidelines that should be recognized by the West Bend CIA / "Butler's Bridge" Yard of the Month program. WBCIA Yard of the Month is dedicated to improving the quality of living and appearance of our community. We encourage residents to take pride in their homes and neighborhood. In turn, we look to celebrate those who do a superior job in maintaining their yards in such a way that they enhance the overall curb appeal of the entire community. Yards of the Month are awarded at the beginning of each calendar month. Yards are judged on neatness, landscaping and color. All yards are eligible. 

2016 Summer Olympics

The 2016 Summer Olympics, officially known as the Games of the XXXI Olympiad, and commonly known as Rio 2016, is a major international multi-sport event in the tradition of the Olympic Games due to take place in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, from the 5th to 21st of August 2016. Record numbers of countries are participating in a record number of sports. More than 10,500 athletes from 206 National Olympic Committees, including first time entrants Kosovo and South Sudan, are scheduled to take part. With 306 sets of medals, the games will feature 28 Olympic sports — including rugby sevens and golf, which were added by the International Olympic Committee in 2009. These sporting events will take place at 33 venues in the host city and at 5 venues in the cities of São Paulo, Belo Horizonte, Salvador, Brasília, and Manaus.

THE GARDEN PARTY

RANDY'S PROVEN THREE-STEP FLEA-ELIMINATION PROGRAM

This summer may be a tough one when it comes to insect control, due in large part to all the moisture and what will likely be unrelenting heat and humidity.

And that combination, I suspect, is going to bring a blow-up in flea and tick populations, starting around June.

So here are my long-standing tips on battling fleas, especially if you have pets. If you don't have pets — or small children playing on lawns — you can just have a pest control service apply insecticides, or you can do it yourself. Insecticides are not my first choice, though, because they need to be applied monthly to truly break the pests' egg cycle

But if you or a neighbor have pets, you've got to employ these proven steps to control the problem:

1. TREAT THE PET - Whether you use expensive veterinary prescription products like Sentinel (which also prevents heartworms), or nape-of-the-neck treatments such as Frontline or Advantage available over the counter, you have to treat the animal on a regular basis. Part of this step also includes bathing the animal as frequently as possible. Vacuuming a pet's fur is probably the most organic way

to treat. In the past, I've recommended diatomaceous earth, but veterinarian friends of mine warn against using it too much because it can dry out the animal's skin.

2. TREAT THEIR LAIRS - Treat areas of the yard where pets hang out or nap with synthetic or organic insect controls. "Manic organics" will burst an aneurysm at the mention of a chemical control where pets hang out, but safety labels on many insecticides like bifenthrin (one of the best all-around flea and tick insecticides) indicate that they're perfectly safe for the average pet as long as they don't eat the granules or treated grass. In any case, there are very few organic insect killers aside from cedar. Outdoor areas used by a mostly indoor dog or cat can be treated with the next step.

3. TREAT INSIDE - Even if your dog or cat is mostly an outside animal, you still have to keep an eye on inside carpet and furniture where they like to hang out. The best way known to treat inside is to vacuum, vacuum, vacuum. The more you vacuum, the more insects and eggs are sucked away. Treating carpet with diatomaceous earth before vacuuming is not a bad idea either. There are also insect-

growth regulators designed for inside use that are odorless and will not stain anything. Nylar (RIGHT) may be the best known, but they all prevent fleas from procreating.

Pros and Cons of Other Flea and Tick Controls

Beneficial Nematodes - Usually, in this part of the state, they are very expensive and really have no proven track record. Since they need a moist, friable soil to do their thing, I think people with improperly raised beds will waste their money applying them to clay soils. Those with organically enriched soils probably don't have insect problems because they have a healthy garden. Ironically, nematodes need a food source. So, if you eliminate fleas and their larvae, the nematodes will starve.

Garlic Powder - I have the recipe for a garlic treatment you can add to a dog's food. If the animal gets hot as it plays, however, the pet may smell like a garlic. But the recipe does work.

Herbal Powders - You can try pennyroyal, rosemary, lavender, thyme, etc., but be very careful because some animals are naturally repelled by these powders. Apply them to the wrong dog or cat, and you could drive them crazy. Plus, the jury is still out on them since there is really no empirical research proving their effectiveness.

Diatomaceous Earth - While this does work quite well on animals with fleas, if used too much, or applied to a pet with sensitive skin,

it can badly dry out the skin.

Orange Oil - Good to spray under decks, for example, as a natural insecticide. As a pet owner myself, I would be very leery of using it directly on the pet, however. There are a bunch of home remedies out there that recommend the product, but I worry that its acidic nature might produce adverse skin reactions.

STORAGE OF TRASH AND TRASH RECEPTACLES

Though most people think of "Trash Day" as the day of the week on which their garbage is collected, many of us place our refuse on the curb the night before. But how early is too early to put out the trash?

The answer is, anytime before 5:00 PM the night before Tuesday and Friday is too early.

The storage of trash receptacles are to be stored out of view from the street at your earliest opportunity or at least no later than 24 hours after the trash has been picked-up.

Our community should never see trash at the curb on Saturday, Sunday, or Wednesday, and not before 5:00 PM on Monday and Thursday unless it is bundled tree limbs only. Grass clippings bagged by you or your lawn service need to be stored out of sight until trash day.
