• Mail your check to PO Box 163541, Austin, Texas 78716. Please do NOT postdate your check nor staple your invoice directly to your check but do include it in the envelope.

• Make your payment using Bill Pay through your financial institution

• Use the New "Online Payment" Option through the Circle C HOA website. If you are making your payment through the website please remember to list your property address in the note section.

Please remember the Financial Office is not located at the Circle C HOA office, and the CCHOA office is not bonded to accept payment nor can they provide information about account status. All financial questions should be directed to Terri at the financial office.

CITY OF AUSTIN BULK PICK UP

The City will begin conducting a bulk trash pickup in the neighborhood starting on Monday September 5th.

Bulk Items Include: Doors, carpet, furniture, appliances (remove doors), passenger car tires (remove rims, limit eight tires per household), lawn mowers (remove gas/oil), railroad ties (cut in half), pallets, rolled fencing, nail-free lumber

Bulk Item Collection Crews Cannot Collect: Brush, household trash, cardboard boxes, hazardous materials, mirrors, automotive chassis and bodies, motorcycles, trailers, boats and tires that are still mounted on rim, sheet glass and other construction and remodeling debris

Collection Guidelines

• Place bulk items at the curb in front of your house by 6:30 a.m. on the first day of your scheduled collection week

• Separate items into three piles as described below.

• To prevent damage to your property, keep items 5 feet away from your trash cart, mailbox, fences or walls, water meter, telephone connection box and parked cars. Do not place any items under low hanging tree limbs or power lines.

• Austin Resource Recovery only collects bulk items from its residential trash and recycling customers.

• Items will not be collected if they are in front of a vacant lot or in front of a business.

• Do not put items in bags, boxes or other containers. Bulk collection is for items too large to fit in containers. Bags will be treated as extra trash and are subject to extra trash fees.

Separate Items into Three Piles

• Metal Items – Includes appliances (remove doors). These are taken to our Resource Recovery Center for recycling

• Passenger car tires – Rims must be removed. Limit eight tires per household. We cannot collect truck or tractor tires. Tires will go to a tire recycling facility.

• Non-metal items – Includes carpeting and nail-free lumber. These items go to a land fill. Austin Resource Recovery is working on plans to salvage reusable items from bulk collection to help meet the City of Austin's Zero Waste goal.

These piles will be collected by different trucks so please keep in mind they may be collected at different times throughout the week. Visit the City of Austin's website for more information: www. austintexas.gov/department/residential-bulk0collection



You may have seen some new work beginning our neighborhood. Construction work has begun in zip codes 78739 and 78749. Google Fiber is building a brand-new fiber-optic network. Construction for Google Fiber started in Park Place off of Beckett Lane and is continuing throughout Circle C. All owners affected should have or will receive door hangers at least 48 hours prior to construction. information becomes available. Here are a few helpful resources to keep handy while construction is happening:

- Crews will mark important construction zones with spray paint and flags. Please try not to move these, if at all possible.

- There are a variety of factors that could impact how long the construction process will take, from weather to permitting to the location of existing utilities.

- If you run into any issues during construction, Google Fiber wants to hear from you. You can give them a call at 866-777-7550 (24 hours a day, 7 days a week). This line has been specifically set-up to answer residents' questions about construction

MAILBOX REPLACEMENT PROJECT

The Circle C HOA board has approved to complete the remaining phases of the mailbox replacement project in 2016. The locations that will be receiving new mailboxes are Circle C North (East side), South Bay and the Main Mail Center at the Swim Center Plaza.

The mailboxes have been ordered and the installation will take place in October. The USPS will be putting notices in every resident's box that will be affected with the exact date. Circle C North (East side) and South Bay replacements will only require the mail delivery

service to be interrupted for 3 days. The Main Mail center mail delivery will be interrupted for approximately a week due to new concrete having to be poured for a more secure installation. During these interruptions the affected resident's mail will be held at the Oak Hill Post Office (6104 Old Fredericksburg Road).

Information will be forthcoming regarding new keys which will be distributed from the Oak Hill Post Office. All residents will be required to visit the Oak Hill Post Office to receive their new keys; the date that you can pick up your new keys will be included in the notice you should receive from the USPS.

RE-SODDING YOUR YARD

If you are thinking about re-sodding your yard this fall, the King Ranch Turfgrass website is a great resource to use. They have a comprehensive "how-to" guide that we have included below along with a great section of FAQ's to get you started with your project. There may be other turf installation companies that provide detailed information as well.

In general, the best types of grasses for our Central Texas are Buffalo, Zoysia (which is found in many of the commons areas throughout Circle C), Bermuda and St. Augustine. There is a handy turfgrass selector available online to help you narrow down the best choice specific to your yard. KING RANCH TURFGRASS SOD INSTALLATION GUIDE

Preparation - Prepare the area

If at all possible, install a permanent underground irrigation system and check the water application is uniform. Most sod failures are due to improper coverage of irrigation. Eliminate draining problems by having soil slope away from foundation, etc. Rake and smooth the soil and remove rocks and roots prior to laying sod.

Water the prepared area and provide a moist base for the sod.

Turf Installation - Laying the Sod

Install your sod immediately upon delivery. Sod should be laid within 24 hours of delivery. Begin watering the sod within 30 minutes of installation. Don't wait to water the sod until you are finished with the entire project. Sod requires contact with the soil and moisture to survive.

• Handle sod carefully to avoid breakage.

- Fit sod pieces together snugly, with ends touching.
- When needed, trim sod with a sharp knife.
- Water as you go. Thoroughly water the sod.

• An application of fertilizer 6 weeks after laying sod is recommended. Sod comes fully fertilized. New roots need to grow into soil. Fertilizer can burn the new roots and prevent the sod from rooting in.

• Begin mowing sod when roots are established. Root establishment takes approximately 2 weeks. Stay off of your sod for at least 14 days. Control pets. Urine spots and foot printing on new sod can cause permanent damage.

Watering - How much, how often?

Proper watering is essential to the establishment of your new sod.

• Check your local requirements regarding watering regulations.

• During the first week, keep the sod and soil beneath thoroughly moist.

• Frequency and length of waterings will depend on how warm, how windy and how rapidly the lawn dries out following each watering. The goal during the first week is to keep the sod and soil beneath moist all the time. A general guide, water twice a day during the first week.

• Watering times should be 15 to 20 minutes (3/4"-1") per watering. These numbers may need to be increased during very hot weather.

• If water starts to collect, or if local weather conditions provide rain, cut back a bit on the watering time.

• Reduce watering during the second week, gradually allowing the soil to firm up.

• After 3 weeks, your sod should be established.

Hey Circle C! What a difference 2 months makes. In March, April and May we were seeing record sales, few days on market and high price's per foot.
