





CYPRESS 5K AND PUPPY PARADE

Cypress and Houston area residents can strengthen their families, their bodies, their neighborhood school, and their dogs at a very fun family friendly event this fall. Cypress 5K Fun Run and Puppy Parade benefiting the Performing Arts Department at Spillane Middle School will take place Saturday, November 19th at 9:00 a.m. at Spillane Middle School, 13403 Spillane Woods Blvd.

The event is the school's third annual Fun Run, and will feature a timed run. You don't have to be a competitive runner to participate since the race also features a family run for those pushing strollers or wanting to walk, and a dog walking segment. The race will begin at Spillane Middle School, and go through the Coles Crossing neighborhood. Medals will be awarded in multiple age brackets, and to the first three dogs who cross the finish line.





Dear Fairfield Homeowners

This letter is to inform you that beginning on September 19, 2016 a project to repair lake shore erosion on Lake 9 (West Detention Lake) will begin weather permitting. In order to repair the lake it will be necessary to lower the level of the lake. This will affect both Lakes 8 and 9 since they are connected equalized lakes. The repair project will take a month weather permitting. The crews will be working 6 days a week, Monday - Saturday to complete the project as quickly as possible.

In order for the repair to be a success a strong layer of grass will need to root and grow. Due to this we are requesting that everyone please stop feeding the ducks.

Feeding attracts birds in unnatural numbers, beyond natural food and water supplies, and frequently in numbers beyond what people will tolerate. Over-grazed and badly-eroded lawns, golf courses, and school playing fields are often the result of overcrowding. Grassy areas such as ball fields and golf courses can become unsanitary and unusable.

HIGH CONCENTRATION OF BIRDS CAUSE:

- * Overgrazing of vegetation, leading to soil erosion.
- * Degradation of the landscape, making it undesirable for other species and unsightly for humans.
 - * Unsanitary conditions due to large quantities of bird feces.



BOO TO YOU FROM OUR CREW

It's hard to believe that Halloween is just around the corner. One of my favorite things to do is to carve pumpkins into Jack-o-lanterns. I've never given any thought to why we do that or how this custom started until I began writing this article.

There are many tales about the practice of carving pumpkins. One comes from Irish folklore. A man named Jack, who was a blacksmith, didn't want to go to hell for his many sins so he tricked the devil into guaranteeing that he wouldn't. When Jack died, little did he know that although he was spared from going to hell, he was also denied entrance into heaven. God did not want him. Legend has it that the devil gave Jack a burning coal which Jack put into a carved-out turnip to use as light while he roamed aimlessly somewhere between heaven and hell. Thus the name Jack-o-lantern was born.

Legends aside, we all love carving pumpkins but isn't it a shame that most of them end up in the trash when the holiday is over? Well, this year, don't trash them! Feed our wildlife. Please keep in mind that these suggestions only apply to pumpkins that haven't been painted or decorated which can be toxic to wildlife.

1. Make a bird feeder (see photo). Use wooden dowels and strong twine. It's a good idea to punch holes in the bottom of the pumpkin to let

water drain. You can also cover the holes you made to make the face so the seed doesn't spill out.

2. Save the pumpkin seeds for large birds and small mammals. Let the seeds dry out and then place them in a shallow bowl or flat tray. If the seeds aren't



being eaten, mix them with a small amount of black oil sunflower seeds.

3. You can place small pumpkins around your yard. For larger pumpkins, cut into smaller pieces. Be sure to place some of the pieces in secluded areas of your yard.

There is magic in the night when pumpkins glow by moonlight. HAPPY HALLOWEEN!


