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

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Cinder's Block

Hi, neighbors. Well, since we seem to be having monsoons this summer, I want to call to your attention a really bad disease that is frequently spread by flood and standing water. It's called "leptospirosis." The bacteria, called "Leptospira," is spread by the urine of affected animals that gets into the water and soil and enters through the skin. It affects humans as well as pets and can be fatal. Fortunately, there is a vaccine for your pets and I urge you to get your pets vaccinated. This is a disease you can unknowingly get from your pet.

On to more pleasant things! Fall should be right around the corner ... notice I said "should." I'm ready for some cooler weather about now. School has started and we all need to watch out for the school buses, and children walking along the streets and sidewalks. The great thing about livin' in the south is that we get to BBQ and grill all year long so we need to continue to be aware of safety issues related to that.

With fall comes Thanksgiving – ah, the smell (and taste) of fried turkeys! Fried turkey is awesome and easy to do but there are some real dangers with turkey fryers, especially the propane fueled fryers. Here's some guidelines and hints to keep you safe if you fry turkeys:

- Make absolutely sure that the turkey is completely thawed before frying. Water (ice crystals in the bird) and hot oil do not mix and can cause the oil to overflow the container. If you're using propane, this is going to cause a big fire and risks burning down your house as well as serious burns to whoever is close.
- Use a turkey that is no larger than 12-14 pounds raw weight. Better to fry 2 birds for your meal than end up with a partially raw turkey!
- Wash the turkey and dry it inside and out before seasoning and frying it. (My momager is really good at this. She thaws and washes the bird, seasons it really well, wraps it in plastic wrap, lets it sit overnight and then, just before it's ready to go in the grease, she dries it again and adds a bit more seasoning. I hear that her Tony Chachere's bill is really big at Thanksgiving.)
- Monitor the oil temperature closely you want to keep it about 375° at all time so it will cook evenly.
- Be sure that the oil is completely cooled before clean up this takes several hours.
- I probably don't need to say this but if you use a propane fryer, keep it away from the house - on the driveway is a good place to do it.
- Again, if you use propane, do not store the propane in the house or in an attached garage.
- Keep pets and children at least 3 feet away from the fryer.
- Read and follow your turkey fryer manufacturer's instructions STAY SAFE and I'll see you next time with other news and safety tips.
