Dear Fairfield Homeowners

This letter is to inform you that beginning on September 19, 2016 a project to repair lake shore erosion on Lake 9 (West Detention Lake) will begin weather permitting. In order to repair the lake it will be necessary to lower the level of the lake. This will affect both Lakes 8 and 9 since they are connected equalized lakes. The repair project will take a month weather permitting. The crews will be working 6 days a week, Monday - Saturday to complete the project as quickly as possible.

In order for the repair to be a success a strong layer of grass will need to root and grow. Due to this we are requesting that everyone please stop feeding the ducks.

Feeding attracts birds in unnatural numbers, beyond natural food and water supplies, and frequently in numbers beyond what people will tolerate. Over-grazed and badly-eroded lawns, golf courses, and school playing fields are often the result of overcrowding. Grassy areas such as ball fields and golf courses can become unsanitary and unusable.

HIGH CONCENTRATION OF BIRDS CAUSE:

* Overgrazing of vegetation, leading to soil erosion.

* Degradation of the landscape, making it undesirable for other species and unsightly for humans.

* Unsanitary conditions due to large quantities of bird feces.

Each of our neighborhood schools, Salyards, Ault, Keith, and Swenke received an Exemplary "CASE" rating in the following categories: fine arts, wellness and physical education, community and parent involvement, 21st Century workforce development program, second language acquisition program, digital learning environment, dropout prevention strategies, and educational programs for gifted and talented students.

Yoga is a broad philosophy containing many different paths to achieve the goal of physical, mental and spiritual well-being,said Dr. Bobby Kapur, assistant professor of medicine at BCM and associate chief for emergency medicine at the Harris County Hospital District's Ben Taub General Hospital. In physical fitness, yoga is the practice of physical postures and breathing exercises that allow a person to strengthen the body and at the same time enter a meditative and relaxed state of awareness.

Yoga entails various positions, stretching and deep breathing. Practicing yoga can help a person improve flexibility, balance, limberness, blood circulation, and it can also relax muscle tension and fight infection, Kapur said.

• 1/2 teaspoon chopped garlic

- 1 cup diced celery
- 1 cup diced carrots

Avoiding Thanksgiving Weight Gain

Cooking carefully can help avoid that much-feared aftermath of the Thanksgiving Day meal: weight gain. Although you can't eliminate all calories from the feast, you can at least lower the fat content.

Remember to:

- Use no-fat or reduced calorie substitutes whenever possible.
- Avoid butter or margarine when cooking vegetables. Instead, place the desired amount of non or low-fat butter substitute directly on your cooked vegetables, allowing it to melt naturally. Do not pre-melt non-fat spreads on the stove or microwave because coagulation may occur.
- Do not butter-baste the turkey while it is roasting, but rather, brush its skin with vegetable oil to prevent drying.
- Do not eat the skin, which contains much of the turkey's fat.
- Use skim milk in mashed potatoes, puddings and sauces.
- Use substitute sweeteners for desserts, or at least replace half the sugar.

EXERCISE - BEING THE PERSON YOU CAN BE

Having a goal that truly excites you is the first step to setting up an exercise program. You may want to be 10 pounds lighter by the next school reunion, have more muscle tone in the dress you will be wearing at your daughter's wedding, you may want to quit smoking or drinking or eating fried food or you may want to compare your athletic skills with what you could do in school. You have to have a goal that makes you really want to take the next step.

Once you have your personal goal in mind, you need a reasonable timeline in which to achieve the goal. Let's say you want to lose 10 pounds in six months. You can do that with a good exercise program and a good diet.

Let's start with the exercise program. Think about what you enjoy doing. If you like to be outside you can ride a bike, hike, walk, run swim, play tennis, endless possibilities. Include some of the fun activities that you enjoy and then try some new stuff. If you prefer to be inside, join a gym with a friend who can work out on the same days and at the same time that you do. Hire a trainer if you don't have a work out friend. If you decide to run, you can run even if it is new to you. You could walk a mile three times the first week, two miles the second week, run a mile and walk a mile three times the next week and by the fourth week you could run and walk two to three miles three times a week. If this holds your interest you could add hills one of the days, add some short bursts of speed one day, you could even sign up for a 5k two months from the start of your program. In six to nine months you could run a marathon if you wanted to go that far. It helps to have a friend to work out with. It keeps you both accountable, and it's fun. Find someone that has a similar schedule or similar child care issues. It helps to recognize what time of the day you enjoy working out and find someone that can work out at the same time.

Breast Cancer: Importance of Early Detection
