DIY Balloon Drop

Take a disposable New Year's Eve tablecloth and gently attach each corner with a piece of tape to a blade on your ceiling fan. Attach a piece of string long enough to pull while standing on the floor to one of the corners of the tablecloth. Fill the inside of the tablecloth with blown-up balloons. At midnight, pull the string and let the balloons fall.

Time Capsule

Gather up mementos from the past year and put in a container. Bury the container in the backyard. Next New Year's Eve, dig up the container and reminisce.

Bubble Wrap Stomp

Just before midnight, spread out bubble wrap on the floor (the large bubbles work best). At the end of the countdown, stomp on the bubbles. It sounds like firecrackers. Kids will love it. Adults, too.

New Year's Eve Tree
