Management Transition - Celeste Bellnoski retired early last year and after an extensive search for a new Community Manager, we hired Tally Jenkins as our new manager. Tally has 30 years experience in managing Community Associations and holds the CMCA<sup>®</sup> (Certified Manager of Community Associations), AMS <sup>®</sup> (Association Management Specialists) and PCAM (Professional Community Association Manager) designations, which is the highest level of certification awarded by CAI<sup>®</sup> (Community Association Institute).

**Office Administrator** - Jeneka Hartsfield, who is our longtime supervisor of the Gate Guard Staff has been moved into the office as the administrator to assist the Manager. She is doing a great job and we are glad to have her in this position.

<u>**Transponders**</u> – We now have an additional option for transponders. The original transponders are still available in the office for \$35.00. We have added a smaller windshield decal transponder (similar to ez-tags). They will only operate at CGNOA gates and are available now for \$25.00 each.

**Entry Access** - The gate readers were replaced earlier this year and unfortunately, the readers at the main entry had a major issue that took months to diagnose. The issue with the readers was difficult to diagnose because not only did they work intermittently, they tested as normal on all of the equipment used to determine the cause of any problems. an owner, we were able to get in contact with TransCorp corporate offices and they became involved in helping to resolve the problems after about a couple of weeks. The issue was so unique that TransCorp had never seen anything like it either, but they did continue to work with us until we all agreed to replace the underground wiring.

We recognize that many of our residents were very frustrated at the length of time that it took to correct the problem. We shared that frustration and worked diligently to find a solution to the problem and want to acknowledge and share our appreciation for your patience as we worked through the process.

**Speed Bumps and Gate Arms** - In an effort to try to reduce the damage to the entry/exit gates and the Board approved the installation of 3" speed bumps at all of the gates and gate arms at the North Eldridge gates to help reduce tail gating. The response to the 3" speed bump was immediate and many residents were unhappy with them.

The Board took the comments and concerns into consideration along with the responsibility of protecting the community's assets. We determined that the best compromise was to lower the speed bumps to 2" inches and remove the speed bumps from the visitor lane at the main entrance to provide an option for anyone that wanted to avoid the speed bumps all together. The 3" speed bumps were in

place approximately 5-6 weeks and during that time, the gates were not hit one time. The morning after the speed bumps were lowered to 2" the North Eldridge exit gate was hit. The gates have been hit several times since the speed bumps were lowered.

The gate arms are working as intended but have taken several hits from non-residents and residents without ez-tags that have tried to beat the arms. After several visits from the gate contractor to adjust the timing, we are hopeful the amount of hits to the arm will be significantly reduced.

Please <u>DO NOT</u> direct your guests and/or contractors to the North Eldridge gates. Please direct them to the main entry. The rear gates are for RESIDENT only with proper (EZ-Tag or Transponder) access. The gates are most frequently hit by non-residents or residents without proper access. Each time the gates are hit, it causes excess wear and tear on the motors and also requires hours and hours of staff time to review the videos in an attempt to identify the responsible vehicle. These costs are hard to re-coup, even when we locate the driver.

**Loan** - The Board received approval for a loan of \$1,000,000.00 for improvements to our infrastructure. All of the deteriorating concrete walls that consist of the small stacked stones will be replaced. Work began this week on the section of wall along the South side of

Canyon Gate Pointe Drive from SH 249 to Northcanyon Drive. The project to replace all of the deteriorating concrete wall is expected to take up to a year.

**Boudreaux Road Fence Improvements** - There are plans to install a fence along Boudreaux Road that matches the wooden fence and columns that are along the N. Eldridge and Northpointe Drives common areas. Letters were mailed to all impacted owners advising of the fence replacement and requesting their approval to replace their existing fence. Work will begin on this fence as soon as we receive 100% approval of all impacted owners.

**Playground Upgrades** - We are also planning to improve both of the playgrounds. Landscaping upgrades for the Boudreaux entrance will be evaluated once the other major projects are complete and we are able to determine the remaining budget.

**Landscape Maintenance** - The Association has hired a new landscape company. Vista Landscaping will assume the landscape management contract on March 15th. The owner of Vista Landscaping was in attendance at the Annual Meeting to introduce himself and share his company's maintenance philosophy.

2017 will be a busy year and we are looking forward to the improvements to the community.


