The Minimalist Darwinian Gardener

Hopefully, freezing weather is behind us (though always possible in the first two weeks in March). The record low for March was 19 degrees F in 2002. I will not miss putting covers on sensitive plants. We had freezing rain last March 2014, so don't let your guard down just yet. Unless you don't mind covering plants before a freeze, don't plant any plant that cannot tolerate 18 degrees F.


Think about planting some vegetables. Those to plant in March are beans, corn, cucumber, eggplant, kohlrabi, mustard, peppers, pumpkin, radishes, squash, and tomatoes.

Bare root planting season is over, so any planting of woody plants should be from containerized plants. Among ornamental, woody plants that do well in our area are Ligustrum, Crape Myrtles, Wax Myrtles, Pineapple Guava, Purple Sage, and Bottle Brush. The Chinese Fringe Tree is stunning in March...even in the moonlight.

Our lawns are beginning to come alive again. Along with the grass will come some weeds. It is best to pull these as needed. Certainly, mow them if they are shading the lawn. In general, according to "Texas Gardner," don't fertilize until the grass starts growing and needs mowing. Fertilizing dormant grass will just encourage weed growth. The rule of thumb from them is, "fertilize when you have mowed twice."

Our west lawn was getting way too much water from a downspout. We were in the toadstool business. The recently planted bush was barely alive. I moved the bush, but to fix the problem, I thought I would have to dig under the sidewalk and direct the water to the South. I am not sure if you have ever dug under a sidewalk, but getting even a 1/2" pipe under a sidewalk is a challenge, let alone a 4" drain pipe. I wished I had thought more about putting future lines under the sidewalk before the contractor poured the sidewalk eight years ago.

Not to digress too much, but, when we had the sidewalk poured, I had him pour an 8 x 8 slab for a garden shed as well. Because he was a sidewalk guy who always sloped concrete to direct water off of them, and I didn't watch him, he sloped the slab as well. It isn't much fun trying to build a level building on a sloping concrete slab.



But back to the story. I went to the hardware store and bought a Amerimax Home Products Black Extend-A-Spout costing about \$13. This device was easy to install. I cut it to fit so it would not be a tripping hazard. It works perfectly. I would say that 95% of the downspout water now goes to the other side of the sidewalk.

Note that you should buy a few stainless steel self-tapping screws to attach these. Mine didn't come with them.
