


Calling Meridian Mamas to Join Circle C Mom's Club

GRILIFE EXTENSION Chiggers

Chiggers are the immature stage of a mite. They climb onto people walking through infested areas, crawl upwards, and wander around the body seeking a good site to settle down and feed. Feeding preference for these mites is in areas where skin is thinnest or where clothing fits tightly, such as the ankles, waist, behind the knees, and the groin area.

Chiggers do not burrow into skin as many people believe, so "smothering" them with nail polish is useless. When chiggers feed, they inject a digestive enzyme that breaks down skin cells which are then eaten. Itching and redness is caused by our body reacting to the enzymes injected into our skin. Itching typically begins 3-6 hours after being bitten, peaks at 24 hours, and can last up to two weeks.

The best way to avoid getting chiggers is to avoid infested areas. Since this is not always possible, here are some other things to try:

- Wear protective clothing- tightly woven items that fit loosely; including long sleeves & pants; shoes or boots
- Tuck pant legs into boots
- Avoid sitting on the ground
- Remove & launder clothing ASAP after being in infested areas
- Shower/ bathe after being in an infested area; scrub vigorously with a washcloth
- Use an insect repellent with DEET or picaridin

To treat chigger infestations around the home try the following:

- Keeping lawn trimmed
- Maintain vegetation; do not allow weeds to grow up & keep brush cleared
- Targeted residual pesticide sprays, usually pyrethroids

For chigger bites:

- Do not scratch pustules; opening pustule might lead to infection
- Oral antihistamines or topical anti-itch creams to relieve itching sensation

I Didn't Sell My House & Summer Selling Season is Over! Now What?

We get this question often this time of year.

In our experience, this question comes from two types of sellers. The first type is the seller who has had their home on the market all summer did not successfully sell it. The second type is the seller that for whatever reason needs to list their home this time of year and will be new to the market. Let us squash one myth: you can successfully sell your home anytime of the year. We have received contracts on homes the day before Christmas, so don't let that theory prevent you from moving forward.

Let's dive into what you do if your property has been on the market all summer and hasn't sold. We always say these listings come down to the two "P's" in real estate: Price & Presentation. If your home hasn't sold you are missing the mark on one or both of these points. It is possible to dig yourself out of this hole, but most of the time you will need to tweak both Price and Presentation to make this happen. We recently took over a listing from another brokerage that sat on the market for over 300 days without a single offer. The seller worked with us to present the property in a different way to the market. The first weekend we had it listed, we received three offers and were under contract at \$10k above their list price. So, if you are a seller in this type of situation, don't lose hope!! Make sure you are partnered with the right Realtor and they have a new action plan in place to get your home sold.

What if you are needing to list your home now as we approach the holiday season? The good news is that you get to benefit from the summer appreciation. However, this is not the time of year to try to push beyond those summer numbers. You need to also keep in mind the current market conditions. For the first time since 2012, our inventory in Circle C and Meridian has increased significantly. It has not been uncommon over the last few years to have only 15 to 20 available resales in our area at any given time. At the time this article is being written-just before the publication deadline, we have over 50 available homes in Circle C and Meridian. The market is still extremely strong, but gone are the days that a seller can stick a sign in the yard and get multiple offers. Make sure you are partnering with a Realtor who's plan for the Presentation of your home will get you that high Price you are wanting. Your Realtor should know the homes you will be competing against and come up with a plan so that your home will beat the competition. If you can't compete with the competition, then you should price the home accordingly. We can't give away all our secrets on how to accomplish this. However, it's really important to partner with the right Realtor who has the right plan for your home. If you do this, you will have a successful sale regardless of which type of seller you are!!
