You will still be able to return your 2018 Board of Directors Election Ballot and Proxy which is located on the back of your Semi-Annual Statement that you may return with your semi-annual assessment by **March 1, 2018**. Otherwise you may attend the annual meeting on **Wednesday, March 7, 2018** and vote at the meeting, or turn your ballot or proxy into the CCHOA office (7817 La Crosse Avenue) by 5:00pm on **March 7, 2018**. Replacement absentee ballots and/or proxies are available by calling the CCHOA office at 512-288-8663.



CC&R Proposed Future Vote

The Circle C Board of Directors has been working on a proposal to update the Circle C Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&R's). In order to make any changes to the CC&R's, we will need 66 2/3 of all votes in favor of the changes. A few of the changes the board has been working on are:

1. Article III, Section 2 – one vote per home

2. Article III, Section 3 – one assessment rate

3. Article V, Section 3, k – amending to trash pickup one day a week

4. Article V, Section 3, m- allowing permanent basketball goals with approval

5. Article V, Section 5 – changing Christmas lights to holiday lights to be all inclusive for all holidays.

6. Propose to add 152 Lots to CCHOA

Holiday Lights and Décor

This is a friendly reminder that holiday lights and décor must be removed no later than **January 15th.**

If you have decorated trees along MoPac, SH45 or any Circle C common areas and have not yet removed the decorations, please do so as soon as possible.

Wastewater Averaging Has Begun

The wastewater averaging period spans three consecutive billing periods beginning in Mid-November and ending in mid-March. The water used during the averaging period will determine wastewater charges for most customers for the 2017-2018 service year.

Lower Your Wastewater Costs

You can lower your wastewater costs for the next year by conserving water during these billing periods. To help you conserve water in the winter months and lower your wastewater average, follow these basic water-saving tips:

• Check your irrigation system for leaks and turn them off during the fall/winter months.

• Fix all leaky faucets and toilets;

• Sign up for the free Dropcountr app and get home water use reports;

- Run your dishwasher and washing machine only with a full load'
- Take shorter showers place timer in your bathroom

• When buying new water-using appliances look for the WaterSense label;

• Visit WaterWiseAustin.org for water conservation tips and to find out about rebate programs.

Important Circle C Seals Swim Team News!

The Circle C Seals are a non-profit, volunteer operated, summer league swim team here in the neighborhood. Despite the team's 25% growth in the past few years, continued growth and the traditional new swimmer addition process, there have been challenges to keep up with the community's explosive growth/demand. **In response to feedback, the team is changing its process for adding new families/swimmers to the team from a wait-in-line process to a lottery approach**. The team's board will be exploring all options this year to expand the size of the team in the long term to serve a greater portion of Circle C; however, today we are constrained by sharing finite pool space/time with the greater community.

The Seals will be holding 2 information meetings at the Community Center (7817 La Crosse Avenue) on Sunday January 14th (2:30-3:30pm) and Saturday February 17th (1:30-2:30pm) to share all the ins and outs of Seals' membership with residents interested in having their children (5-18 yrs old) join the team for the May/June season - ie volunteer/attendance requirements for new Seals/Families; coaching staff/philosophies, fees; season timeframe; the fun; etc. We will also cover exactly how the lottery will work, but in short - names will be pulled from a swim cap in order to fill available spots. Families MUST attend either of the 2 meetings and align to Seals' membership requirements to be offered entry into the lottery that will be publicly held via Facebook Live in early March. A single 'tryout' will occur thereafter on Sunday April 8th to ensure the prospective new Seal can traverse the 25-yard length of the pool un-assisted/safely. We will work our way down the lottery list until all slots are filled.

WHAT'S IN SEASON AT THE WILDFLOWER CENTER?

Here's what's likely to be blooming, fruiting or setting seed in Central Texas this time of year. Look for these native plants around town, at the Wildflower Center and perhaps in your own backyard!

DWARF PALMETTO (SABAL MINOR)

It's not often that nature works in straight lines, but it sure is easy to imagine the sleek fronds of dwarf palmetto coming right off an architect's drafting table, fashioned from ruler and pen with a careful eye for angles and rays, light and shadow. One of only four native Texas palms, Sabal minor tolerates poor-draining soil, is hardy in cold weather (for a Sabal), and adds striking variety to a garden's damp, shady areas — its broad, stemless leaves waving hello from ground level. Once established, this fan-shaped palm is surprisingly drought tolerant, and its spherical blue-black fruit contrasts beautifully with those parallel lines. Not sure how to wear stripes and dots together? Ask a dwarf palmetto!

EVERGREEN SUMAC (RHUS VIRENS)

This evergreen is more of a "very-briefly-not-green," considering that Rhus virens goes about a week between dropping winter leaves and sporting a coat of fresh growth. But we'll take it! When many branches in the landscape are bare, this sumac offers glossy green foliage and — even better — fuzzy red fruit. That festive fruit (which is said to make a tart, refreshing tea) appears in late fall and can persist through winter, brightening up landscapes like handfuls of candy suspended in midair. What's more, this shrub is fast growing, drought tolerant and generally easygoing, meaning it isn't bothered by many pests or diseases. Good looks, tough attitude and zest, to boot. What more could you ask for?

Slaughter Creek Watershed Circle C Pond Rehabilitation

CIP #10856.004 NOTIFICATION OF MAINTENANCE PROJECT

The City of Austin Watershed Protection Department will rehabilitate the stormwater quality ponds serving the Circle C Ranch, Phase C, Section 9 neighborhood. Major maintenance and needed improvements will be done to the two retention/ irrigation ponds located along Slaughter Lane near Beckett Road. The primary goal of the project is to repair the existing pond liner systems which currently leak.

Construction is proposed to start Spring 2018. Disturbances to the neighborhood will be minimal, except that construction crews will access Pond #2 via York Bridge Circle to move equipment in and out. The noise from construction equipment may be audible during business hours.

MoPac Intersections CIP #10856.004 NOTIFICATION OF MAINTENANCE PROJECT

Improvements are on the way for Loop 1 (MoPac) at the intersections of Slaughter Lane and La Crosse Avenue! Congestion and traffic volumes have grown at accelerating rates, causing difficulty for drivers who pass through and use these intersections.

Improvements will enhance safety for all modes of travel, decrease wait times at the intersections, decrease overall travel time, and improve left-turning movements.

Planned improvements include:

• Constructing two mainlanes in each direction on MoPac underneath Slaughter Lane and La Crosse Avenue to improve traffic flow at the intersections and on MoPac

• Constructing a Diverging Diamond Intersection (DDI) at MoPac and Slaughter Lane to address congestion by allowing vehicles to travel more efficiently through the intersections (check out an example animation by visiting https://youtu.be/ TRs_ncEMkCY)

• Improving the intersection at MoPac and La Crosse Avenue

• Improving and adding pedestrian and bicycle accommodations

The contractor for the project is Webber, LLC and construction is anticipated to begin in early 2018. Both intersections are expected to be complete within three years, weather permitting. Crews will begin by preparing the right of way and excavating at both intersections. Construction will begin with the MoPac and Slaughter Lane improvements and, once complete, crews will construct improvements at MoPac and La Crosse Avenue.

Working with property owners, business owners, residents, and all other stakeholders is a priority for TxDOT and the project team. We will identify opportunities to reduce impacts and provide updates on construction, as they become available. A webpage is being created with more details and will be available soon.
