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

#### **Annual Report to the Membership**

The 2017 Annual Report to the membership from the Board of Directors will be printed in the March 2018 newsletter. A copy will also be posted on our website and available in the HOA office during the month of March 2018.

#### **CC&R Proposed Future Vote**

The Circle C Board of Directors has been working on a proposal to update the Circle C Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&R's). In order to make any changes to the CC&R's, we will need 66 2/3% of all eligible votes in favor of the changes. A few of the changes the board has been working on are:

- 1. Article III, Section 2 one vote per home
- 2. Article III, Section 3 one assessment rate
- 3. Article V, Section 3, k amending to trash pickup one day a week
- 4. Article V, Section 3, m allowing permanent basketball goals with approval
- 5. Article V, Section 5 changing Christmas lights to holiday lights to be all inclusive for all holidays.
  - 6. Propose to add 152 Lots to CCHOA

#### **Wastewater Averaging Continues**

The wastewater averaging period spans three consecutive billing periods beginning in Mid-November and ending in mid-March. The water used during the averaging period will determine wastewater charges for most customers for the 2017-2018 service year.

#### **Lower Your** Wastewater Costs

You can lower your wastewater costs for the next year by conserving water during these billing periods. To help you conserve water in the winter months and lower your wastewater average, follow these basic water-saving tips:

- Check your irrigation system for leaks and turn them off during the fall/winter months.
  - Fix all leaky faucets and toilets;
  - Sign up for the free Dropcountr app and get home water use reports
  - Run your dishwasher and washing machine only with a full load
  - Take shorter showers place timer in your bathroom
  - When buying new water-using appliances look for the WaterSense label

#### Important Circle C Seals Swim Team News!

The Circle C Seals are a non-profit, volunteer operated, summer league swim team here in the neighborhood. Despite the team's 25% growth in the past few years, continued growth and the traditional new swimmer addition process, there have been challenges to keep up with the community's

explosive growth/demand. In response to feedback, the team is changing its process for adding new families/swimmers to the team from a wait-in-line process to a lottery approach. The team's board will be exploring all options this year to expand the size of the team in the long term to serve a greater portion of Circle C; however, today we are constrained by sharing finite pool space/time with the greater community.

The Seals will be holding the second of two information meetings at the Circle C Community Center (7817 La Crosse Ave.) Saturday February 17th from 1:30pm-2:30pm to share all the ins and outs of Seals' membership with residents interested in having their children (5-18 yrs old) join the team for the May/June season ie volunteer/attendance requirements for new Seals/Families; coaching staff/philosophies, fees; season timeframe; the fun; etc. We will also cover exactly how the lottery will work, but in short - names will be pulled from a swim cap in order to fill available spots. Families MUST have attended either of the 2 meetings and align to Seals' membership requirements to be offered entry into the lottery that will be publicly held via Facebook Live in early March. A single 'tryout' will occur thereafter on Sunday, April 8th to ensure the prospective new Seal can traverse the 25-yard length of the pool un-assisted/safely. We will work our way down the lottery list until all slots are filled.

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## Hope4Minds and Team Luke Merge to Expand Resources for Families of Children with Brain Injury

Austin-based nonprofit Hope4Minds and Lubbock-based foundation Team Luke will merge to become Team Luke Hope for Minds, allowing the two complementary organizations to work together and provide expanded services and resources to families of children with brain injuries.

"For the past six years, Hope4Minds has worked hard to establish programs that fulfill the unmet needs of these families," Ronda Johnson, director of family services, said. "Team Luke has done a great job raising resources and awareness, so we are excited to be able to have a higher impact together."

According to the Texas Brain Injury
Alliance, an infant, child, teenager, or
adult in the U.S. sustains a traumatic brain injury every 21

seconds. There is a void, however, in access to services for children who have brain injuries. And that's where Team Luke Hope for

Minds steps in.
"This is a big step f

"This is a big step forward to filling that void," Johnson said. "Together, we can do more to provide support groups, financial assistance, and educate communities about prevention. Our

scope of services has been the state of Texas, and it had to be a brain injury that occurred as a result of an accident, so we're expanding on that and will be able to help children in other states and with injuries from other causes, like a stroke or an aneurism."

Hope4Minds was formed in December 2011 as a community effort organized after an 11-year-old boy named JD suffered an anoxic brain injury due to a


nonfatal drowning in his family's hot tub. The family struggled with the lack of information, guidance and expenses. They received significant financial support from their community and a decision was made to form Hope4Minds to help families experiencing the same struggles.

Tim Siegel, former Texas Tech men's tennis coach and father of Luke Siegel, who suffered an anoxic brain injury due to a golf cart accident in July 2015, formed the Team Luke Foundation in January 2017. Luke's story gained a powerful following on social media, and resulted in support from some of Luke's favorite athletes like New Orleans Saints quarterback Drew Brees, Wimbledon champion Maria Sharapova, Texas Rangers short stop Elvis Andrus, and many more.

Team Luke Hope for Minds will operate under its united mission: To enrich the lives of children with a brain injury and give hope to their families through support and education. "For me, it's not just personal because of what happened to my son," Siegel said. "It is also personal because helping other families has kept me going and made me want to make a difference in other people's lives because of what I've gone through. By merging, we have an opportunity to reach more people and to utilize our strengths to help families in need."

#### WHAT'S IN SEASON AT THE WILDFLOWER CENTER?

Here's what's likely to be blooming, fruiting or setting seed in Central Texas this time of year. Look for these native plants around town, at the Wildflower Center and perhaps in your own backyard!

#### CAROLINA JESSAMINE (GELSEMIUM SEMPERVIRENS)

This flowering vine's name might nod to the Carolinas, but it's truly an equal-opportunity Southern belle, occurring from Virginia over to Texas and in every state between. Its lemon yellow, trumpet-shaped flowers and glossy evergreen leaves make Gelsemium sempervirens a garden favorite. But watch out: It's as tenacious as it is handsome and will climb without abandon if allowed to grow unchecked. And, though its flowers attract native bees, hummingbirds and spicebush swallowtail butterflies, its leaves, roots and seemingly innocent flowers are all toxic to livestock and humans — its nectar has even been known to poison gluttonous honeybees. Plant one in moist, well-draining soil to add a touch of sunshine to your garden, but remember this is one native plant that gives new meaning to the phrase "for your eyes only."



Looking for a native plant sweetheart this February? If the heat is on, weather-wise, you'll start to see one of our garden's most prized partners, the coral honeysuckle, in bloom. Hummingbirds frequently pair up with it — just look at the shape of those flowers; they're a natural match! Bees and butterflies are similarly drawn to its sweet nectar and bold color; birds from robins to quail feed on its fruit; and humans have been known to use Lonicera sempervirens leaves (in various medical concoctions) to treat asthma, bee stings and sore throats. Unlike many vines, this one isn't too aggressive, and its bright red-and-yellow firecracker flowers are so pretty, we'd be in love even without all the perks. So, go ahead: Put a valentine in its mailbox, but yours won't be the only one!



When is the perfect time to list my home for sale?

I'm often asked by my Circle C clients which months are the 'best' months to market their homes to get the most showings, offers and money for their properties. Sales are generally strong year-round in Circle C because it is a highly desirable neighborhood with plenty of new and resale homes of all sizes and prices. Generally, the spring and summer are strong months starting in early May and continuing through August. This is the time when large families purchase homes to have their kids in school by September. Young couples with infants or no children usually buy from September through December so there is no competition from the larger families and they can close by the holidays. All that said, the past few years we have seen a trend with buyers coming out early in January, February and March. February has typically been the slowest month in real estate so most real estate companies take their conventions during this month. Most cities aren't Austin though and we have seen a huge increase in early buyers wanting to beat the rush and purchase their homes in February, March and April to beat the summer rush. In the 1st quarter of 2017, we had multiple offers on almost all of our listings because there was a big demand and a very limited supply of homes. The only competition were homes left over from 2016 that had been highly over-priced or had some other type of issue and hadn't sold. Last February, March and April was a smoking hot market. When May/June comes around, sellers in the current Circle C price range (typically \$400,000.+/- ~ and UP) take the kids on vacation right after school lets out and you don't see a resurgence of sales until well after the 4th of July. This year, there are only 33 homes on the market as an average for the past 2 months. (Usually there is an average of 50+ homes on the market during the year over the past few years.) This drives the price up on resale and new homes because of a lack of supply and you have a much better chance of selling your home higher. There are many buyers in the market now because interest rates remain attractive, hovering around the 4.25% level on a 30 year mortgage. The lack of homes and the level of interest rates means one thing to Circle C sellers. Now is the time to list. If you have been considering moving up to a larger home, down-sizing to a smaller home or just need to move please allow me to provide you with an accurate, comprehensive and no-obligation market analysis.
