Many of us have found ourselves searching for a beautiful, yet affordable, venue to hold various events such as showers, birthday or retirement parties, small weddings and other celebrations. Do you know that Summerwood has 2 beautiful facilities that residents can rent? The beautiful Club Summerwood and the newly renovated Central Clubhouse are ideal for many different types of events. Conveniently located close to your home, these facilities can be ideal for location to host your next social gathering. Tables and chairs are included in the rental and we do not have a list of service providers you are limited to.

Club Summerwood's beamed ceiling and stone fireplace provide a beautiful setting for up to 100 guests. Two interior spaces give numerous set up options while keeping your guests together. The kitchen includes full size appliances and a large catering sink on one side and a separate serving side with expansive granite countertops. With advance arrangements, you can even have alcohol at your event at Club Summerwood. The facility can be rented for only \$40 per hour with a 4 hour minimum and a \$15 per hour attendant fee. A deposit and administrative fee apply and security is required based on the time of the event and if alcohol will be present.

Holding up to 60 guests, the Central Clubhouse overlooks picturesque Lake Anne and boasts a kitchen with full sized appliances, including an ice maker. 



SELECTED AS TEXAS ALL-STATE MUSICIAN



Isabel Alvarado, a member of the 2018 Summer Creek High School Choir, performed with the Texas All-State Choir in San Antonio, Saturday, February 17, 2018 at the Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center as part of the 2018 Texas Music Educators Association Clinic/ Convention. She was chosen for this honor through a

competitive process held this year across the state at district, region and area levels. Isabel is a student of Erin Thompson and sings at school under the direction of Amanda Robison who is a member of the Texas Music Educators Association, an 11,000+ member organization headquartered in Austin. This is Isabel's third time to perform as a member of a TMEA All-State organization. Isabel is the daughter of Garrett and Erica Wyatt.

High school students selected to perform in the all-state concerts have competed through several levels of auditions beginning in the fall of 2016 to arrive at the state level. Allstate is the highest honor a Texas music student can receive. Over 1,500 students are selected through a process that began with over 60,000 students from around the state vying for this honor to perform in one of 13 ensembles (bands, orchestras and choirs). Texas Music Educators Association sponsors the Texas All-State competition. This competitive process begins throughout the state in auditions hosted by 33 TMEA Regions. Individual musicians perform selected music for a panel of judges who rank each instrument or voice part. From this ranking, a select group of musicians advances from their Region to compete against musicians from other areas in seven TMEA Area competitions.
