#### Baylor Scott & White Clinic – Austin Circle C Unveils Pediatric Room Painted by Graphic Design Students from Bowie High School



Senior graphic design students from Bowie High School recently completed a very special project that brought their work to life at the Baylor Scott & White Clinic – Austin Circle C at 5000 W. Slaughter Lane in Southwest Austin.

Led by graphic design instructor, Judith Cooper, the students met with the Baylor Scott & White team to map out the collaboration and later presented pitches for murals that would decorate the walls of the clinic's pediatric room. After receiving feedback, the students worked on the designs with every decision centered around the needs of the children who visit the clinic.

"Our collaboration has meant so much more than just doing class work," said Cooper. "For our students, knowing that children will enjoy the pediatric room when they may be feeling under the weather inspired them. Getting feedback and encouraging support from staff has also helped build confidence in their abilities. Students can see that their art and hard work has made a difference."

Cooper added that the graphic design students were fortunate to work with entire Baylor Scott & White staff, including doctors, nurses and office personnel, who were offered support and encouragement during the project.

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#### WHAT'S IN SEASON AT THE WILDFLOWER CENTER?

Here's what's likely to be blooming, fruiting or setting seed in Central Texas this time of year. Look for these native plants around town, at the Wildflower Center and perhaps in your own backyard!

#### MEALY BLUE SAGE (SALVIA FARINACEA)

Missing those bluebonnets? Dry your eyes, native plant lover (unless you have allergies). Mealy blue sage is here to fill that big blue void in your heart. This attractive perennial fills landscapes with cerulean wands that are highly deer resistant, making it great for garden borders. Salvia farinacea is one of those wildflowers we think of as a "pollinator magnet"; plant them en masse and, come bloom time (which can extend into October with deadheading), partake in a pollinator viewing party. Those pipe-cleaner flowers will be positively buzzing with bees, hummingbirds, butterflies and moths. Sounds like perfect lemonade-on-the-patio time to us!

#### TURKSCAP

#### (MALVAVISCUS ARBOREUS VAR. DRUMMONDII)

Any Texan worth their salt knows this is a sunny place, and, appropriately, lots of native plants can take the heat. But we need a little pretty in the shady places, too — after all, that's where we'll want to be when temperatures rise. Luckily, Turkscap (Malvaviscus arboreus var. drummondii) is one handsome flower that agrees shade is where it's at (but it will adapt to other conditions and thrive most anywhere if need be). This shrubby plant pairs nicely with giant spiderwort (Tradescantia gigantea), is drought tolerant, attracts pollinators and is even edible! Its fruit tastes similar to apple — hence another common name, "manzanilla," or "little apple" in Spanish.

# News You Can Use

#### Mud Daubers

Mud daubers are a great wasp to have around. They are solitary, generally docile, and can help to reduce various bugs in the landscape. Mud dauber wasps are  $\frac{3}{4}$  to 1 inch in size and come in a variety of colors. They have a very thin, thread-like waist.

Mud daubers create a mud structure that they provision with insects and/or spiders; they lay an egg on each prey item within a cell in the nest, and then seal the nest off. When larvae hatch from eggs, they eat the items provisioned for them, pupate, and then emerge as adults to begin the process over.

Management is not usually needed for mud daubers as they do not guard their nest like other wasps. While they are capable of stinging, they are not considered to be aggressive. If you do not like the look of the mud nests, you can remove them with a putty knife.



#### Pet Place Reasons to "Scoop the Poop" by Jennifer Magness, DVM

Dogs are a very popular pet and are found in many households. There are 70 million pet dogs in the United States alone. Opening up your home to a dog also means accepting responsibility for that pet, including cleaning up their waste.

Most people have heard the term "scoop the poop" but some people may not have heard the reasons why this is so important. Some people view dog feces (or what most people call dog poop) as a good fertilizer, but this is actually a myth. Dog diets mostly contain animal products such as chicken and turkey. Thus, a dog's waste contains substances created by the breakdown of the animal products. It does not enrich the soil for plants such as grass. If not picked up, dog feces can enter waterways via storm drains after it rains. Nitrogen in the feces depletes the oxygen from the water, and the water is made harmful to fish

and other aquatics. It is often listed as the third leading cause of water pollution. Dog feces are also considered an environmental pollutant as it contains harmful organisms. One gram of dog feces may contain as much as 23 million bacteria. Harmful bacteria such as Salmonella and E. coli can be found in dog feces. Parasites such as Giardia, Cryptosporidium, roundworms, hookworms

and whipworms may also be found. Many of the parasites (usually in a resistant egg form) linger in the environment for years, even if the rest of the dog feces breaks down over time. Both bacteria and parasites are health hazards for both humans and animals that come in contact with them.

Besides the "ick" factor of stepping in dog poop and the unpleasant odor of it, dog feces can serve to attract pests (such as flies) and rodents (such as rats). Being

a responsible pet owner and scooping your dog's poop is important for the community health of both humans and animals. It helps Improve local

water quality. Scooping your dog's poop also promotes favorable views towards dogs by others in the community.






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# News You Can Use **PREPARE FOR A HURRICANE**



Each year NOAA and the American Red Cross publishes a preparedness guide of tropical cyclones to help us prepare for such an emergency. You can download a copy of that guide at http://www. nws.noaa.gov/os/hurricane/resources/TropicalCyclones11.pdf. This guide gives great information on the metrological terms associated with tropical storms and what to expect from those storms. Most importantly, it lists critical information about how to prepare for an incoming storm.

#### GUIDELINES EACH YEAR PRIOR TO HURRICANE SEASON:

- Determine safe evacuation routes inland
- Learn locations of official shelters

• Check emergency equipment such as flashlights, generators and battery powered equipment such as cell phones and your NOAA Weather Radio All Hazards receiver.

• Buy food that will not spoil and store drinking water.

• Buy plywood or other material to protect your home if you don't have it.

- Trim trees and shrubbery so branches don't fly into your home.
- Clear clogged rain gutters and downspouts.
- Decide where to move your boat if applicable.
- Review your insurance policy.
- Find pet friendly hotels on your evacuation route.

#### DURING THE STORM AND WHEN PEARLAND IS IN THE WARNING AREA, YOU SHOULD:

• Closely monitor radio, TV or NOAA Weather Radio All Hazards for official bulletins.

• Close storm shutters.

• Follow instructions issued by local officials. Leave immediately if ordered.

• Stay with friends or relatives at a low-rise inland hotel or at designated public shelter outside of the flood zone.

• DO NOT stay in a mobile home or manufactured home.

• Notify neighbors and a family member outside of the warned area of your evacuation plans.

• Take pets with you, but remember that most public shelters do not allow pets other than service pets for people with disabilities.

• Identify pet friendly hotels along your evacuation route.

#### IF YOU ARE STAYING HOME TO "HUNKER" OUT THE STORM:

- Turn refrigerator to maximum cold and keep it closed.
- Turn off utilities if told to do so by authorities.
- Turn off propane gas tanks.
- Unplug small appliances.

• Fill bathtub and large containers with water in case clean tap water is unavailable. Use water in bathtubs for cleaning and flushing only. Do NOT drink it.

• Stay away from windows and doors, even if they are covered. Take refuge in a small interior room, closet or hallway.

- Close all interior doors. Secure and brace exterior doors.
- If you are in a two-story house, go to an interior first floor room.

• If you are in a multi-story building and away from water, go to the first or second floor and stay in the hallways or other interior rooms away from windows.

• Lie on the floor under a table or other sturdy object.


