

### THE LEUKEMIA & LYMPHOMA SOCIETY RECOGNIZES BRADLEY HOOTON WITH NATIONAL "HERO AWARD" FOR THE 2018 STUDENTS OF THE YEAR CAMPAIGN



18-year-old Cypress Ranch High School student, Bradley Hooton of Cypress, Texas has won the national "Hero Award", for his extraordinary fundraising efforts during the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Texas Gulf Coast Chapter's 2018

Students of the Year campaign. He ran his own fundraising campaign as part of LLS's innovative program, "Students of the Year".", and qualified by leading a multi-generation team to raise over \$67,000. His class raised an astonishing \$350,000 to create a world without blood cancer.

Candidates for Students of the Year sign up for a fierce seven-week fundraising competition, for which they appeal to family and friends to raise critical funds, which LLS deploys to advance breakthrough treatments and to support the more than 1.3 million blood cancer patients in the U.S. The candidates/teams who raise the most money at the end of the competition earn the title Student(s) of the Year. Top local fundraisers become eligible to win the national title. In 2018, the students raised money in honor of 11-year-old Corinne Miller, a local blood cancer patient who is currently in remission from Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia.

When Hooton learned he had won the national "Hero Award" he

was thrilled, "I was honored to have been selected to run for Student of the Year. I never imagined my team would have been so successful in providing the funds necessary for cancer research. I am thankful to have had this opportunity," said Hooton.

Hooton ran an incredible campaign. He was first nominated by his cousin, Stephanie Carroll, who was the 2017 Woman of the Year. Hooton ran his campaign in honor and memory of his father, who unfortunately lost his battle to Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML).

"Congratulations to Bradley and all our candidates, supporters and volunteers who helped to make Students of the Year a huge success," said Billie Sue Parris, LLS's Texas Gulf Coast Executive Director. "For these incredible individuals, it's not just about winning a title, it's all about the impact they are making in their communities and how important their contribution and efforts are in the advancement of blood cancer cures".

I had 3 kids. I was drowning in life and academics already. So why?

My answer might surprise you. I wanted to be a good mom again.

We always put on the very best sides of ourselves for... others. Not our family. We are the kindest, most patient, most gracious and giving

with candy if they'll do it without crying—you know you've done it.

Every parent worries about their kids and about being a good parent but it's hard. It's even harder when you both work. It's even harder when you have no family nearby. It's even harder when... I could continue but I'm sure you know as well as I do that the excuse train could ride the rails for a while.

I needed to resurrect the patient, funny and sweet mom who was always willing to hold your toad while you went potty. I wanted some version of that mom to come back.

Chiara brought her back. Chiara made me snuggly on the couch again. Chiara made me review English papers again. Chiara made me laugh and roll my eyes with a smile on my face. She made me think about my rules and the rationale for them; and reminded me of the importance of explaining them. Chiara was the kind of kid who would come downstairs, see me making dinner and just slide in gently beside me and start chopping garlic. I had gotten tired and allowed myself to check out way too often. But with unfamiliar eyes on me, I dug a little deeper to the better mom that was always still there but had become complacent.

Having a foreign exchange student living in your home will certainly mean a lot of those lofty things. You will learn more about incredible places, taste wonderful food, and witness discovery and wonder again through a child's eyes. But you might also find that dusty side of yourself, try it back on and live it again.

### MEMORIAL HERMANN CYPRESS HOSPITAL ENCOURAGES BACK-TO-SCHOOL PHYSICALS

As parents are preparing their children to go back to school, there are numerous items to check off the list – and if your child is an athlete – obtaining an annual physical is mandatory. Most school districts require the exams for student athletes, as well as the use of a specific pre-participation medical history form in order to identify family history that might suggest a risk for sudden cardiac death.

Physicians will perform a head-to-toe physical of your child. Parents can expect the physician to listen to the heart, check the lungs, monitor blood pressure, test cholesterol, check for anemia, screen vision and update vaccines, among other things. Parents can also use this annual visit to discuss nutrition and exercise options, and to address any general wellness questions they might have.

Some student athletes may receive a referral for additional screening, or due to family history, some might need a cardiac screening.
