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
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# Community Compliance Reminders



Please be mindful of the following rules, which are part of Steiner Ranch governing documents:

- Trash containers are to be stored out of sight and should not be visible from the street.

- Parking on the street overnight is not allowed.

- Boats and watercraft must be stored in an enclosed space at all times. Storing

watercraft in driveways or on the street is not allowed.

- Items should not be left in driveways. This includes mulch bags, garden hoses, and sports equipment.

- Any alterations to the exterior of your property (front, back and sides) must be submitted to the HOA office for review and approval.

# Green Waste & Bulky Waste Pick-Up Information

*Green Waste Pick-Up:* Texas Disposal Systems (TDS) will provide Steiner Ranch residents with a seasonal green waste collection pick-up (bagged leaves, brush, limbs and other yard waste) in November. Please follow the HOA Facebook Page at Steiner Ranch HOA Events, the HOA website and the November Ranch Record for the date of pickup.

To participate, residents may place up to 20 thirty gallon paper bags of green waste at their curb on their designated trash pick-up day during the week of green waste pick-up.

#### NOTE: Green Waste materials are composted and therefore must be bagged in paper bags. Plastic bags will not be picked up.

**Bulky Waste & Bundle Pick-Ups:** Residents may schedule free bulky waste and/or bundle pick-ups twice per year by calling TDS. Bundle pick-ups may include tree, shrub, and brush trimmings; newspapers or magazines securely tied together, not exceeding 4 feet in length or 40 pounds. Bulky waste pick-ups consist of large pick-up items such as sofas, refrigerators, water tanks, etc. Call TDS at 512-329-1752 to schedule individual pick-ups.

**Reminder:** Aside from scheduled green waste pick-ups and individually scheduled bulky waste/bundle pick-ups, TDS will not pick up items/bags left outside of trash containers, unless bags are tagged with TDS trash tags. Tags are available for purchase, by check, at the HOA office for \$2.50 per bag. Additional trash/recycle carts may also be ordered directly from TDS.



# New Resident Portal from GrandManors

By now, residents must have received a letter notifying them of their new GrandManor's login information related to their account, which can be found at www.steinerranchhoa. org. The Resident Portal, will become more and more useful in providing real time information on financials, governing documents, amenities & ACC forms, HOA fees/payments, among many other features and will ultimately replace the back pages of the Steiner Ranch website.

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## Fall is here! Now is the time to Prune your Oaks Trees



Oak wilt, caused by the fungus Ceratocystis Fagacearum, is the most destructive disease affecting live oaks and red oaks in Central Texas. Most of the tree mortality results from tree-to-tree spread of

the pathogen through interconnected or grafted root systems, once an oak wilt center becomes established. New infection centers begin when beetles carry oak wilt fungal spores from infected red oaks to fresh, open wounds on healthy oaks. Wounds include any damage caused by wind, hail, vehicles, construction, squirrels, birds or pruning. Research has shown that both oak wilt fungal mats on infected red oaks and insects that carry oak wilt spores are most prevalent in the spring.

Below is a brief description of how you can reduce the risk of fungal spread when pruning.

• Always paint fresh wounds on oaks, including pruning cuts and stumps, with wound dressing or latex paint immediately after pruning or live tree removal at all times of the year.

• Clean all pruning tools with 10% bleach solution or Lysol  $\ensuremath{^{\mbox{\tiny M}}}$  between sites and/or trees.

• No pruning or wounding of oaks during the spring (currently defined as February1 through June 30).

Pruning for general tree health, non-safety related clearance or thinning, should be conducted before February 1 or after June 30.

Debris from diseased red oaks should be immediately chipped, burned or buried. Regardless of the reasons or time of year, proper pruning techniques should be used. These techniques include making proper pruning cuts and avoiding injurious practices such as topping or excessive crown thinning. If you are uncertain about any of this information, you should consult with a Texas Oak Wilt Certified arborist, ISA Certified Arborist, or an oak wilt specialist from a city, county or state government agency such as the Texas Forest Service or Texas AgriLife Extension Service. ## Overnight Parking, Boats & Watercraft Storage Reminders

Per Steiner Ranch governing documents, no automobile or other vehicle may be parked overnight on any roadway within the community. Boats and watercraft must be stored in an enclosed space at all times. Storing watercraft in driveways or on the street is not allowed.

## **Residential Exterior Changes & Enhancements Require Architectural Approval**

Any changes or enhancements you make to the exterior of your home requires architectural approval by the association. Steiner Ranch governing documents require the submission of plans and specifications for review and approval by the Architectural Committee (AC) before construction or installation begins. Improvements requiring approval include, but are not limited to, front door changes, playscapes, pools, decks, patios, ponds, new siding or trim colors, planter boxes, arbors, walkways and sheds. Before making exterior changes to your home, please submit a Modification Application, which can be found on the HOA website under the 'Architectural' tab.





#### Why are so many elementary kids in braces these days? We get this question all the time! Here's the scoop.



Contrary to popular belief, the increase of children in early braces is NOT due to parents overly-concerned with aesthetics, or practioners "pushing" treatment. Orthodontists have been doing early treatment for decades. However, when you and I were young, they used more appliances (think big removable chunks of plastic and metal). Today, we tend to choose braces over appliances. In addition, the pediatric dental profession has grown tremendously. With their specialized training, fewer children that need early orthodontic intervention are missed.

The American Association of Orthodontics and the American Academy of Pediatric Dentists recommend that all children be evaluated for orthodontic needs at age 7. This does not mean that all children need early treatment. Since some orthodontic problems can cause irreversible damage and some can only be treated before the skeletal structure is mature, it is important to identify which children may need treatment:



In many instances, Dr. Arnold and Dr. DeSantis will recommend postponing orthodontics until all the permanent teeth are in, usually around middle school. We will monitor your child's growth and development over the following years until orthodontic treatment timing is right. These visits are always complimentary. If we do recommend an early round of treatment, it is often for one or more of the following reasons:

- Lower the risk of trauma to teeth and gums
- Reduce the chance for permanent tooth extraction
- Correct oral habits that alter the shape of the jaw bones
- Reduce the need for jaw surgery
- Simplify adolescent orthodontic treatment
- Improve appearance

Bottom line - you have nothing to lose by having your child evaluated for orthodontics. At a minimum you can rest assured that either no early treatment is needed, or if it is, that we didn't miss the window to intervene.

# **Steiner Ranch Pool Rules**

To ensure Steiner Ranch pools remain fun, safe, and sanitary for all residents, the below rules are in place.

Pools are for residents of the Steiner Ranch Master Association and the Steiner Ranch Residential Owners Associations, and up to 4 guests per household without a reservation.

1. Pool gates must remain closed and locked at all times. A facility fob is to be used to access locked facilities during hours of operation. DO NOT PROP GATES!

2. The association may deny access to the pools at any time due to occupancy limits, weather, pool conditions, or if maintenance is required.

3. At the discretion of the association, and as approved by the Board of Directors of the SRROA and/or SRMA, certain periods of the normal open swim hours may be set aside for specialized activities.

4. Use of the pool facilities is at the resident and/or guest's own risk.

5. Lifeguards, when present, have full authority and are responsible for the interpretation and enforcement of all rules.

6. Only lifeguards are permitted on the lifeguard stand.

7. An adult must accompany children 14 years old and under at all times.

8. Proper swim wear is required. Swim diaper and plastic pants must be worn by children who are not completely toilet trained.

9. No diving. Dive blocks are for use by Swim Teams and/or private lessons approved by the Association.

10. No Smoking.

11. No glass containers of any type are allowed in the pool facility.

12. No pets in pool area.

13. Residents are responsible for any damage they, their guests, or their children cause and for cleaning up any mess or trash created by them prior to leaving the pool facility.

14. Violation of these rules may result in suspension of pool privileges, fines or other charges, and/or legal action.



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
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# HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

We ask residents to keep the below safety tips in mind before heading out for trick-or-treating. Happy Halloween!

• Steiner Ranch is dark at night, with limited street lights. Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers or have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.

• Slow down and be especially alert while driving in the neighborhood. Children will be excited to get from house to house- which means they may run into streets unexpectedly.

• Cross the street at corners and enter and exit driveways slowly.

• Always walk on sidewalks or paths and avoid walking in the street. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible.

• Watch for cars that are turning or backing up.

• Young children should not be alone at night without adult supervision. If kids are mature enough to be out alone, they should stick to familiar areas and trick-or-treat in groups.



# Tip from WCID17 No One Likes a Broken Water Pipe!

As you mulch your outdoor beds and think about winter coming, fall is the perfect time to take a walk through your home and yard to make sure you won't be faces by broken water pipes this winter. You can cross outdoor winterizing off your list of worries by taking a few simple precautions in late October or early November while it is still warm:

• Drain and insulate irrigation backflow valves (RPZ);

- Disconnect and drain outdoor hoses;
- Insulate pipes or faucets in unheated areas;
- Seal off access doors, vents and cracks;

• In severe cold weather, open the cabinet doors that have plumbing pipes inside to allow heat to help protect them;

• Consider allowing a faucet to drip a small continuous stream or shut your water off at the master shutoff; and

• Make sure you can locate your master water shutoff.

What if you prolong or you wake up one morning and find the pipes have frozen anyway? Have the plumber's phone number handy. If you think you know where the freeze up occurred, and want to try thawing it yourself, the easiest tool is probably the hair dryer with a high heat setting. Wave the warm air back and forth over the pipe, not on one spot. Be careful, because the pipe may already be broken. It's not leaking because the water is frozen. When you thaw it out, the water could come gushing out. Be ready to turn off the water if necessary, or better yet, shut the valve off before thawing the pipe.

Hand to Hold welcomes GINGER ZEE, a writer, dancer and Good Morning America Chief Meteorologist, as she headlines its fifth annual Baby Shower – Seasons of Life: Gathering Strength from the Storm in the Grand Ballroom of the JW Marriott in downtown Austin on Friday, November 2, 2018, from 11 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. The Hand to Hold Baby Shower raises funds to provide support and programs for families in Central Texas and beyond. Hand to Hold's resources and programs for families provide Peer Support, Psychological & Emotional Support, Whole Family Care and NICU & Beyond programs.

Two leading causes of disability or death among newborns are premature birth and birth defects. Premature birth – a baby born before 37 weeks of gestation -- affects 54 families each week in the Greater Austin Area - Travis, Williamson, Bastrop, Hays and Caldwell Counties (Texas Department of State Health Services, 2012.). Other babies may be referred to the NICU because of a defect or other health concern -- five percent (5%) of all Texas babies are born with one or more birth defects (Texas Birth Defects Registry, 2011).

ZEE will inspire guests with her message of resilience and selfcare, leaving attendees feeling renewed, empowered, and intensely moved by her raw, poignant chronicle of life as a Natural Disaster. "When babies need intensive care and an extended hospital stay, we are right there with parents and families to make sure their emotional needs are met, too," says Kelli Kelley, Austin resident and co-founder and executive director of Hand to Hold. "When hospital care centers on the whole family, their babies also do better. We help parents cope with in person support, podcasts and online information so that they have hope, courage and wisdom to parent their medically fragile child."

Baby Shower guests represent many families who have experienced life with a baby in neonatal intensive care and also, infant loss. With luxury prizes from jewelry and spa treatments to fine dining, Hand to Hold's fanciful Baby Shower games will delight and surprise guests – some of whom didn't have their own baby showers due to premature birth or loss -- as they gather to raise support NICU families and also honor their own birth and parenting experiences.

Seasons of Life: Gathering Strength from the Storm is hosted by neonatal ICU Parent Graduates Heather Nichols and Beth Cohen, Co-Chairs with Honorary Chair Camila Alves McConaughey; Hand to Hold Founder and Executive Director Kelli Kelley; and a committee of 25 Central Texas volunteers.

Guest speaker GINGER ZEE is an Emmy Award-winning chief meteorologist at ABC News and the face of our nation's weather headlines on Good Morning America and across all ABC News broadcasts and digital platforms. She is also the New York Times bestselling author of Natural Disaster: I Cover Them; I Am One. Since joining ABC News, Zee has covered almost every major weather event and dozens of historic storms. A mother of two, Zee lives in New York City with her husband.

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
