MUD & WCID Tax Meeting

The Parkland & Lakeland Village WCID #157 held its second informal Town Hall Meeting on September 25th at Pope Elementary School. Present were Chairman Keith Nystrom, Vice Chairman Cameron Dickey, Directors Shane Bueno & James Motejzik and the new financial advisor, John Howell & residents. This was not a formal board meeting so residents were free to ask any questions of the Board members as well as the financial advisor. This was a key informational meeting for voter input because the WCID Board was about to set its 2019 tax rate. The good news in that on October 11, the WCID Board lowered the tax rate 1.75cents from 2018, resulting in the lowest tax rate ever for WCID #157. Thus on an average home price of \$350,000 your tax savings is about \$61.25.

The Lakeland Village MUD #419 held its Public Workshop meeting on Thursday, October 10th at the Lakeland Village Activity Center. Present were Chairman Bob Thomas, Vice Chair Radney Poole, Directors Ed Conger, Shea Thielen, and Sandra Kalb and many Bridgeland residents

The MUD #419 Board provided information and answered questions about their 2019 budget, water quality, security, and most importantly about the setting of your 2019 tax rate. As of 10-10, MUD# 419 had not set its 2019 tax rate.

Both meetings were a historic moment because this is the first time the WCID #157 & MUD #419 have held in Bridgeland tax rate discussions with the residents. Many thanks to the Board members for your transparency and for your willingness to involve us in the tax rate process. We are looking forward to the new website where we can communicate with the directors and review information.

Lakeland Village HOA Board Candidates & Election Info



For the past ten years, the Lakeland Village Board has been controlled by a majority of Board members who are employees of Howard Hughes Corporation or an affiliate. Lakeland Village because it is 90% built out will now be able to elect an all Lakeland Village resident Board. A notice was sent out to all residents to file for the Board if desired. The candidates

who filed for your Lakeland Village HOA Board are: Gaye Barclay, Sheri Bourgeois, Kay Burkhalter, Heath Melton, Tony Martin, Frank Ramirez, Rafael Vieska, & Mike Willingham. Their candidate statements and photos can be viewed on bridgelandlife.com and/or on their candidate facebook pages.

On Friday, November 2, at 6:30 pm at the Activity Center, there will be a Candidates Forum with moderator Buddy Broussard. All candidates will be given an opportunity to speak and residents are given an opportunity to ask questions.

On Wednesday, November 28 at 7:00 pm will be the Lakeland Village Town Hall Meeting and Election of Candidates. Each candidate will be given an opportunity to speak but due to time

limits, there will be no questioning of the candidates.

For a limited period prior to November 28, Lakeland Village residents will be allowed to vote electronically. However, you may instead wait and cast your vote after hearing all the candidates at the Town Hall Meeting on November 28.

The specifics of how electronic voting will work will be provided in late October or November.

Due to changes in the law, in this November election, Builders who own lots in Lakeland Village will be allowed to vote one vote for every lot the builder owns, until the lot is sold to a resident. The developer who also owns lots in Lakeland Village is entitled to vote but has graciously waived its right to vote.

As of about mid- September 2018 the Builders own about 168 lots. At the last Board election in 2017, only 323 Lakeland residents voted. So if all the Builders vote their 168 votes, Lakeland Village homeowners can easily be outvoted. That is why it is so important that every resident turn out to vote. This is one election where every single vote will count. So please VOTE!
