

The Northeast Water Purification Plant Expansion

The Northeast Water Purification Plant expansion continues to progress. Work right now is primarily focused on the installation of two 108" pipelines running from the plant to lake Houston. The plant itself is being expanded and the concrete is being poured for the new foundation. A tunnel is being placed under West Lake Houston Parkway so the pipeline can proceed under the roadway to the Lake.

Construction is ongoing and the workers are trying to disrupt the neighborhoods as little as possible but we know it can be noisy and dusty. We apologize for any inconvenience. 

PUMPKIN ROLL

YIELD: 10 servings PREP TIME: 25 minutes COOK TIME: 15 minutes

INGREDIENTS: For the Cake

- 1/4 cup powdered sugar (to sprinkle on towel)
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 tablespoon pumpkin pie spice
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 3 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 2/3 cup pure pumpkin puree
- For the Filling

16

- 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup powdered sugar, sifted
- 6 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

DIRECTIONS:

- 1 Preheat oven to 375°F. Line a 15 x 10-inch jelly-roll pan with parchment paper and spray with non-stick cooking spray. Sprinkle a clean tea towel with powdered sugar. Set pan and towel aside.
- 2 In a medium bowl, combine flour, baking powder, baking soda, pumpkin pie spice and salt.
- 3 In a large bowl with an electric mixer, beat eggs, vanilla and sugar until thick.
- 4 Add in pumpkin and mix to combine.
- 5 Stir in flour mixture.
- 6 Spread batter evenly into prepared pan.
- 7 Bake for 13 to 15 minutes or until top of cake springs back when touched.

8 Immediately loosen and turn cake onto prepared towel. Carefully peel off paper. Roll up cake and towel

together, starting with narrow end. Cool on wire rack.

9 In a medium bowl, beat cream cheese, powdered sugar, butter and vanilla extract until smooth.

10 Carefully unroll cake; remove towel.

11 Spread cream cheese mixture over cake. Reroll cake.

12 Wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate at least one hour.

NOTES:

Store prepared Pumpkin Roll in refrigerator for up to 5 days. You can also wrap tightly in a layer of plastic wrap and then foil and store in freezer for up to one month. Remove frozen Pumpkin Roll to room temperature one hour before serving.
