



CLEAN REFRIGERATOR AND FREEZER

Unplug and sort through the contents. Discard anything past its prime. Add baking sada to the water to deadorize surfaces.

CLEAN WINDOWS

Use a soft brush to clean off dust, cobwebs, and dirt. Wash windows inside and out with a squeegee and rag to remove excess water. Choose a cloudy day (if possible) – the sun's heat can dry windows too fast, creating streaks. Use warm soapy water to scrub each window screen with a brush.

DUST

Get to all the places that are out of the way or hard to reach. Doorframes, fans, bookshelves (and everything on them). Work from the ceiling down and vacuum the dust that settles to the floor.

RENEW CUSHIONS

Rotate and flip mattresses. Thoroughly vacuum them and the box springs. Sofa and chair cushions should also be flipped if their design and construction allows.

PERFORM A SAFETY CHECK

Check smoke detector batteries frequently; replace every six months. Also check batteries in carbon monoxide detectors and flashlights; inspect pressure gauges on fire extinguishers.

REPLACE FILTERS

Vacuum and clean grates (and coils and condensers, if applicable) on furnaces, refrigerators, stoves, and air conditioners. Remove filters in furnaces and air conditioners, and either clean or replace them.

DEEP-CLEAN RUGS

Start with vacuuming. Many area rugs can be machine-washed. Air others on a clothesline; beat dirt and dust from them with a tennis racket, then shampoo at home or send out to a cleaner.

SRMA & SRROA 2019 Elections and Annual Meetings

The Steiner Ranch Master Association (SRMA) will hold their elections and annual meetings in March and the Steiner Ranch Residential Owners' Association (SRROA) will hold their elections and annual meetings in April. Both Boards consist entirely of Steiner Ranch homeowners, who are elected by Steiner Ranch homeowners.

March SRMA Election - March 26th, 2019

The SRMA Board consists of seven board members. Considering the complex nature of SRMA Community and operations, need for ramp up time and board stability, the Board unanimously approved three-year terms for new Board members beginning March 2019 and also condensed the Districts to four (were five) to align with annual member voting requirements. There will be four board member positions 1, 2, 3, 4 representing four new Districts 1, 2, 3, 4 and three At Large member positions (5, 6, 7). Any SRMA homeowner can stand up for an At Large position irrespective of the District.

In March election, SRMA homeowners from District 3 (was 4), and District 4 (was 5) will elect board members from their respective voting Districts and also vote for two At Large members. SRMA home owners outside of District 3 and 4 can only vote for At Large members. Regardless of their voting Districts, once Board members are elected to the SRMA Board, they represent Steiner Ranch (SRMA) interests as a whole.

The SRMA Annual Meeting and Election will take place on March 26th, 2019 at 6:30 pm. Registration will begin at 6:00 pm at Towne Square Community Center.

District 4 (was 5) - Belcara, The Bluffs, Emerald Ridge, The Grove, Mediterra, Monterey, Palisades, Santaluz, Sierra Vista,

SRROA Annual Meeting and Election - April 25th, 2019

The SRROA Annual Meeting and Election will take place on April 25th, 2019 at 6:30 pm. Registration will begin at 6:00 pm at Towne Square Community Center. The SRROA will elect three members during this election.

SRROA neighborhoods include: Chaparral, The Summit at Eastridge, The Valley at Eastridge, Hancock Hill, Mesa North, Plateau, Rocky Ridge

SRMA and SRROA Candidate Information

Only candidate bios and photos which pertain to a homeowner's voting district will be visible on the online voting website. Specific online voting information is included in homeowner Annual Meeting and Election packets.

Election results will be announced at the SRMA and SRROA annual meetings. Homeowners are encouraged to attend and to vote.

How To Vote

- 1. Attend the SRMA or SRROA Annual Meeting and Election and cast your ballot.
- 2. Vote online by visiting your specific voting District website. SRROA and SRMA district specific website information is included in homeowner annual meeting packets, which will be delivered via regular mail in March.
- 3. Vote by proxy. Proxies are included in the Annual Meeting packets which will be delivered via regular mail in March.

HOA Oak Wilt Policy Prohibits Pruning Oaks February 1 - June 30



The Steiner Ranch Master Association (SRMA) and Steiner Ranch Residential Owners' Association (SRROA) each have oak wilt policies which residents are responsible for following. The policies specifically state that oak tree pruning is prohibited from February 1 – June 30, as this is the period in which oaks are most at risk of infection. To view the policy in its entirety, visit the

Steiner Ranch HOA website and click 'FAQS' from the top menu, then 'Oak Wilt Policy'.

Reduce The Chance For Spreading Oak Wilt

Know When NOT to Prune - No pruning/trimming oaks from February 1st through June 30th.

Paint – Always paint fresh oak wounds immediately after pruning with wound dressing or latex paint regardless of season.

Sterilize Pruning Tools – Clean all pruning tools with 10% bleach solution or Lysol between sites and trees.

Properly Dispose of Red Oak Debris – Debris from diseased red oaks should be immediately chipped or burned.

If uncertain about trimming, consult a Texas oak wilt certified arborist, an oak wilt specialist from a city, county or state government agency such as the Texas Forest Service or Texas AgriLife Extension Service, or visit texasoakwilt.org.

Spring Green Waste Pick-Up

Texas Disposal Systems (TDS) will provide Steiner Ranch residents with a seasonal green waste collection pick-up (bagged leaves, brush, limbs and other yard waste) during the week of April 15th, 2019.

Each resident may place up to 20 thirty gallon paper bags of green waste at their curbside on their designated trash pick-up day on April 15th –April 19th, 2019.

**Please note: This will be the only green waste pick up this Spring. Residents may schedule bulky waste, and bundle pickups twice per year by calling TDS. Bundle pick-ups include tree, shrub, and brush trimmings securely tied together, not exceeding 4 feet in length or 40 pounds. Call TDS at 512-329-1752 to schedule individual pick-ups.

Reminder: Aside from scheduled green waste pick-ups and individually scheduled bundle pick-ups, TDS will NOT pick up items/bags left outside of trash containers, unless bags are tagged with TDS trash tags. Tags are available for purchase, by check, at the HOA office for \$2.50 per bag. Additional trash/recycle carts may be ordered directly from TDS.

Greenbelt Reminders

Please remember and share with all family members the following:

- Greenbelts in Steiner Ranch are private property of the HOA. Cutting trees, constructing forts or fire pits, and any other activity which damages greenbelts is prohibited and may result in fines and penalties.
 - Fires are absolutely prohibited in Steiner Ranch greenbelts.
- Motorized vehicles are not allowed in greenbelts or trails as they pose a potential safety hazard to walkers and bikers. They also damage the trails, which the Trails Committee and other volunteers graciously maintain.

Should you observe someone vandalizing the greenbelts, please contact the Travis County Sherriff's Department.

Community Compliance Reminders

The HOA office would like to remind residents of the following Steiner Ranch rules:

- Trash containers are to be stored out of sight and should not be visible from the street.
 - Parking on the street overnight is not allowed.
- Items should not be left in driveways. This includes mulch bags, garden hoses, and sports equipment.
- Any alterations to the exterior of your property (front, back and sides) must be submitted to the HOA office for review and approval.

Thank you for abiding by these rules, which are part of Steiner Ranch governing documents.

VHS Mulch Delivery

The annual Vandegrift High School band mulch fundraiser is a fantastic way for homeowners to support the VHS band while sprucing up their landscaping. Mulch will be delivered by band members on April 4th and 5th, 2019. Please spread mulch as soon as possible. The HOA will send compliance notices to homeowners' who have mulch bags visible from the street after April 22nd. Thank you for your support!

Making Exterior Changes? Don't Forget To Obtain Architectural Approval First

Thinking about modifying your deck, adding a pool, or changing the color of your exterior trim? Steiner Ranch governing documents require the submission of plans and specifications for review and approval by the Architectural Committee (AC) before construction or installation begins. Improvements requiring approval include, but are not limited to, playscapes, pools, decks, patios, ponds, new siding or trim colors, planter boxes, arbors, walkways and sheds. Before making exterior changes to your home, please submit a Modification Application, which can be found on the HOA website under the 'Architectural' tab.

Texas Disposal Systems (TDS) is the residential waste services provider in Steiner Ranch. Services provided include weekly trash pick-up, every other week recycling pick-up, HOA scheduled spring and fall green waste pick-ups, curbside Christmas tree pick-up, and scheduled individual bulky waste pick-ups. Residents may schedule their individual, twice-yearly bulky waste/large item pick-ups, by contacting Texas Disposal Systems directly at 512-329-1752.

Nesting Season Approaches for Endangered Birds

Two endangered species of birds, the **Black-Capped Vireo** (BCV) and the **Golden-Cheeked Warbler** (GCW), will again be making their home in Steiner Ranch this spring. These songbirds are native to the area and their nesting seasons begin soon. Why is this important to know? Several of the trails established in Steiner Ranch go through the Balcones Canyonland Preserve (Powerline Hill and Eastridge trails) where many of the birds reside. The birds are especially sensitive to environmental changes during nesting season. The established trail rules were designed to minimize the effect humans have on the birds during this period. Though the Steiner Ranch Master Association (SRMA) has the right to install and maintain trails in the Preserve, violations of the following rules could force closure of the trails through the end of the nesting season.

GCW Nesting Season – March 1st through July 31st BCV Nesting Season – March 15th through August 31st

Please review the following trail rules before your next hike:

- 1. The trails are for Steiner Ranch residents, their guests, and persons with written authorization from Taylor Woodrow Communities/Steiner Ranch, Ltd. ONLY.
- 2. Trail hours will be from dawn until dusk. There will be no access of the trails allowed after dark. (Continued on Page 11)

- 3. Use of the trails is at your own risk.
- 4. Only use of designated trails is allowed. Leaving designated trails is prohibited.
- 5. No motorized vehicles allowed.
- 6. No horses allowed.
- 7. No feeding animals.
- 8. Bikes are allowed only on Hike-and-Bike Trails. Bikes must yield to pedestrians.
 - 9. No loitering.
 - 10. No hunting.
 - 11. No cooking, fires, or smoking.
 - 12. No camping.
 - 13. All pets must be on a leash at all times.
 - 14. No littering or dumping allowed.
- 15. Do not disturb natural landscapes. Be cautious of plants and wildlife in their native habitat.

In addition to the rules above, the following apply only to the Permitted Trails in the Conservation Easement (Powerline Hill and Eastridge trails):

- 16. No picnicking.
- 17. No tape recordings of birdcalls or other wildlife.
- 18. Access permitted at trailhead access points only.



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
Mother and Son Dance



Where Can Embers Ignite Your Home?

From the Steiner Ranch Firewise Committee

In the event of a wildfire, embers present a risk to those both near the fire and far away. When driven by high winds, live embers can travel for miles before alighting on structures or other wildlands.

Furthermore, the greatest risk to homes is not the embers from wildfires but from other burning homes and structures. Wildfires burn with relative speed whereas homes burn for hours and generate enormous heat, putting anything nearby in danger of igniting.

Embers need to land on flammable materials or surfaces in order to continue to burn. They can also be blown into small gaps or cracks in a home's facade, where they can smolder for as long as there is sufficient fuel and oxygen. For example, think of a dryer duct full of lint or an attic stacked with boxes.

To address these risks, take these few simple precautions:

- Inspect your roof for lifted tiles and replace any that do not form a tight seal with surrounding tiles.
- Many homes have what are called "weep holes" in their stone or brick exterior walls that allow for drying and venting after rain. Plug these holes with metal mesh screening material.
 - Clean your ducts to remove any dust and debris.
- Check that vents, such as attic vents above your garage or the soffits underneath your roof overhang, do not have openings greater than ¼ inch. If they do, line them on the interior or exterior with metal mesh screening.
- Check your garage and other exterior doors for cracks or openings that lead to the interior of the structure. Seal these with caulking or weatherstripping.
- Wooden decks and fencing are often dry and cracked, creating an abundance of openings for embers. Sand and seal or paint any wooden structures, especially those in direct contact with your house.
 - Clean your gutters and remove any debris from the roof.
- Remove flammable landscaping plants and materials such as shrubs, tree branches and wood mulch from direct contact with the house.
- Remove any flammable materials you are storing against the structure, i.e., piles of firewood, lumber, etc.


Without a place to land and burn, or a way into your home, embers present a significantly lower risk to your family.



Examples of places embers can enter your home: 1. Vent holes in soffits are vulnerable to embers and ignition from nearby branches 2. Cracks around the garage door 3. Shrubs can ignite next to windows and shatter the glass 4. Weep holes

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Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event

When: Wednesday, March 6th and May 4th, 9:00am – noon Where: Lake Travis Reuse & Recycling Center, 3207 Neidhardt Drive, Austin, TX 78734

Household hazardous waste (HHW) consists of common everyday leftover household product(s) which have any of these potentially hazardous characteristics: flammable, corrosive, toxic, or reactive. These kinds of products require special disposal and may be safely disposed of at the Lake Travis Regional Reuse & Recycling Center.

Collection events are FREE and open to residential customers of the utility partners. To drop items off, residents must present a valid driver's license or utility bill from WCID # 17. There is a 30-gallon limit per customer per event.

Why is proper disposal important? Improper disposal of HHW includes pouring products down the drain, on the ground, into storm sewers, or in some cases putting them in the trash. The dangers of such disposal methods might not be immediately obvious, but improper disposal of these materials may pose a potential health hazard or may pollute the environment causing adverse effects on plants, fish, animals, people, and drinking water.

Tips for properly handling HHW:



- Sort your items first please do not bring boxes of trash to the center
- Latex paint can(s) with a small amount of left-over paint should be opened and left to dry out so they can be thrown away in your residential trash pickup
 - Items not in their original container need a readable label
- Never mix products as incompatible products may react, ignite, or explode
- Follow instructions for use and disposal provided on product labels

The Center will accept:

- Household products such as cleaning products, drain cleaners, oven cleaning solvents, degreasers, polishers, pool chemicals, household rechargeable batteries, mercury thermometers, gas grill propane tanks;
- Paint products such as latex and oil-based paints, spray paints, preservatives, strippers, etc. Automotive products such as antifreeze, car batteries, oil, oil filters, transmission fluid, & brake fluid

Detect And Chase Down Leaks

March is World Water Month

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is asking everyone to "Fix a Leak Week" during the week of March 18 to 24, 2019, the World Water Month, March. Leaking faucets, showerheads, toilets, and irrigation equipment can raise a family's water bill by 10 percent. If citizens, Nationwide, will check for leaks, twist your way to leak-free fixtures, and replace when necessary, household repairs could save more than 1 trillion gallons of water annually.

Check for Leaks. One way to detect leaks is to evaluate your water use during the winter (when irrigation is not being used.) A household of four generally consumes no more than 12,000 gallons of water per month during winter months. If your family is using more than that, leaks might be the culprit. Stop by the WCID 17 Administration office for free leak detection tablets to check toilet tanks. Another method is to check your water meter before and after a two-hour period when water isn't being used to verify whether the reading changes. If it does, a leak is likely.

Twist your way to leak-free fixtures. Once you've identified any leaks, tighten hose and pipe connections and faucet valves, or wrap showerheads with pipe tape if needed to form a good seal. Dripping faucets are easily remedied by replacing worn-out gaskets and washers. To save even more water, twist a WaterSense labeled aerator onto your bathroom sink faucets. Finally, check your garden hose for leaks at its

connection to the spigot. If it leaks while you run your hose, replace the nylon or rubber hose washer and ensure a tight connection to the spigot using pipe tape and a wrench.

Replace when necessary. Most toilet leaks are the result of worn-out flappers, which are cheap and easy to switch out with new ones. And if you still can't nip that drip in the bud, it might be time to replace the fixture. Look for the WaterSense label when considering a new toilet, faucet, or showerhead to ensure water savings with the performance you've come to expect.

Household leaks are a drain on resources and your wallet, but fixing them is relatively easy and saves water, energy, and money. CELEBRATE WORLD WATER DAY, Friday March 22nd, 2019.

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


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
