Loving Thought From A Mom Written by Katherine Schmidt With Joshua Schmidt

As a mother of four, watching your youngest prepare for high school graduation brings up a flood of nostalgic and heartfelt memories. Our experience in the Cypress community has been a wonderful mix of challenge, discovery, collaboration, connection, and joy.

After several wonderful years living in inner-city Houston, I found myself having sleepless nights worrying and wondering how best to feed my youngest child, Joshua's, voracious curiosity and intelligence, while also meeting his unique needs. It was apparent to us that we were on a completely different journey from anything we had previously known and were going to have to think out of the box about Joshua's future.

By happy coincidence, Joshua's Godparent's, Jim and Michelle Smith had relocated to Fairfield at about the same time. "Far-field" as we once called it, turned out to be a beautiful community. The more we visited, the more we appreciated all it had to offer and upon closer investigation, discovered Cy-Fair ISD had a very progressive and highly regarded program for children with disabilities.

Joshua's story began on June 07, 2001. He was born in the Texas Medical Center at the height of hurricane Allison. Joshua had some issues at birth, and due to some unforeseen complications, he arrested for 30 minutes when he was 10 days old. This led to his Cerebral Palsy, causing significant physical disabilities.

Despite Joshua's rough start, doctors frequently said that his early success was in large part due to his three older sisters, Melissa, Zoe, and Alyson. Their constant love and attention and typical sibling banter was good medicine for Joshua, and he wasted no time learning how to hold his own in a house full of girls.

Joshua has been described by people who know him as very hard working, perseverant, resilient, courageous, hilarious and most likely to be CEO. So, it was wonderful to find a community that opened its arms and encouraged Joshua's zeal and "work hard play hard mentality, without exclusion."

Indeed, the assurances given by the Cy-fair Independent School district that Joshua would be educated in the most inclusive environment possible consistently exceeded anything I could have hoped for. The complex challenges we faced were at times daunting but always addressed in the most positive, creative and collaborative spirit. Even when we had to go back to the drawing board, Joshua's best interests were always prioritized by the teachers, administrators, and staff.

But our community is particularly special in that the educators who teach in Cy-fair ISD, also raise their families in this community and are a huge and integral part of the strength of the community.

Whether it was being invited to help coach the Keith Cougars football team, play a game of pick-up basketball in his walker

(he's a great guard), get welcomed on the paintball field, (we love everyone at TXR Paintball), playing adaptive tennis, hitting golf balls or participate in Jiu Jitsu, Joshua was always encouraged to participate.

One of Joshua's greatest achievements was working out with Coach Todd Holloway doing adaptive Crossfit. After working tirelessly for years to walk independently, Joshua, now fourteen with the heart of a champion and Todd's help, was finally able to meet his goal of walking independently. Shortly after, Joshua ran his first 5K. Fortunately, Todd's gift for working with Joshua was greater than my fear of him falling!

Working out is now one of the most important aspects of Joshua's life, for body, mind, and spirit. Joshua is also a comanager of the Cy-Ranch Baseball team and is enjoying the final days of a wonderful experience with great friends, gifted and talented teachers, administrators and staff in CFISD. Next year Joshua will be attending Lone Star College to pursue a degree in adaptive recreation, where he hopes to share his joy of working out with others with disabilities.

As a mother, I can only echo Joshua's sentiment when he says, "Thank you to everyone who stood beside me while I struggled and still gave me room to grow. There are no words that can fully express my gratitude."

A very special thanks to the teachers, staff and administrators at Keith Elementary, Salyards Middle School, and Cy-Ranch High School for always being on "Team Josh." An especially big thank you to those who worked with Joshua the closest and longest: Heather Faunce-Estay, Julie Neira, Sherrie Kostura, and Terrie Surtain, Jacob Leonhardt, and J. R. Satchel.

We will forever remember the fun, laughter, challenges and the successes of our journey with you, and carry it forward into an exciting future!


