## Irrigation After the Rain

There are multiple City of Austin watershed retention ponds around Circle C which capture storm water runoff. This captured water volume is then irrigated back onto the surrounding landscape rather than allowing direct runoff into the watershed. The City of Austin retention irrigation systems have excellent pollutant removal efficiency. So, when you see those high spraying heads going off during or soon after we have a lot of rain, it's likely the COA retention pond system at work.

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## Help Plan Austin's Future Parks! Second Round of Community Meetings Begins May 2

The Austin Parks & Recreation Department (PARD) kicks off a second round of "Our Parks, Our Future" community conversations on May 2. Input will help park planners prioritize investments for parks, facilities, and recreational programming over the next ten years.

Since fall 2018, the "Our Parks, Our Future" long range planning process has held regional community meetings, on-site intercept engagements, and received more than 4,400 survey responses.

Upcoming meetings will seek additional guidance from neighborhoods throughout the city. The next five community meetings are scheduled for May 2 - 4, 2019:

"We heard from more than 4,000 Austinites in the first phase of the Our Parks, Our Future planning process," explains Kim McKnight, PARD Environmental Conservation Program Manager. "The second round of community meetings will provide an opportunity for us to combine what we heard from the public with the data we gathered about needs and gaps in services and amenities."

The long range plan is developed every ten years and provides a blueprint to guide land acquisition, capital improvements, and the development of programs and amenities. The City of Austin's leadership, staff, and partners are committed to involving the community in planning and decision making through a variety of means, including in-person meetings, ongoing informal

conversations, and technology. The plan is funded in part through a contribution from the Austin Parks Foundation.



## WILDFLOWER NOTES

Here's what's likely to be blooming, fruiting or setting seed in Central Texas this time of year. Look for these native plants around town, at the Wildflower Center and perhaps in your own backyard!

### AMERICAN BASKET-FLOWER

(CENTAUREA AMERICANA)

No one-trick pony, American basket-flowers are almost as stunning before and after their "prime" as when they're in full-bloom glory. This drought-hardy annual starts adding vibrant color to prairies and roadsides in May and June, but its fluffy, tan seedheads and wickerwork bracts remain beautiful after the creamy disc flowers and filamentous, purple-pink ray flowers have expired. Centaurea americana gets its common name from the basketlike quality of those straw-colored bracts, which are fascinating to behold pre-bloom, as well, when violet petals just begin to emerge from their handy container. This natural weaver boasts sweet-smelling, showy flowers that attract people and butterflies alike, and it makes for an amazing cut flower for arrangements. There is truly much to love — a basketful you might say.

## SPRING OBEDIENT PLANT

(PHYSOSTEGIA INTERMEDIA)

Just about everyone can relate to wanting something to stay put, be it a mischievous puppy, a wandering toddler or even a wayward plant. Good luck with the first two, but — thanks to a dutiful perennial known as spring obedient plant — we can at least have some order in our gardens. A member of the mint family, spring obedient plant earned its name from its flowers' tendency to stay where you push them, at least temporarily. This water-loving southern belle does well in low areas such as rain gardens and along wetland edges. And it thrives with heavy, clay soils and sun to part shade, so you've got options. You can even grow Physostegia intermedia in a drainage ditch and not hear complaints. Now that's what we call good manners.

## Around Circle C

## Mosquitoes



Mosquitoes can not only be irritating by biting, but they also are able to transmit various diseases to humans and animals. They are known to transmit heartworm in dogs and cats, and they can spread encephalitis (including West Nile Virus), Chikungunya, Zika, dengue, yellow fever, malaria and filariasis among humans.

Most female mosquitoes require a blood meal for egg production whereas males feed on nectar and do not bite. Eggs are laid on the surface of water or in dry locations that can be flooded by water. Eggs laid in dry locations can remain dormant under for several months. Eggs hatch into larvae, or wigglers. Mosquito larvae live in water and feed on organic debris or microscopic plants and animals. Larvae molt into pupae which are non-feeding. Mosquito pupae spend the majority of their time at the surface of the water, only moving when disturbed.

Many things can help to reduce mosquito problems around the home. Since three of the four life stages of mosquitoes are in or near water, it is best to eliminate all sources of standing water. Containers such as watering cans, buckets and bottles can turn into mosquito breeding grounds. Water should be drained from birdbaths, gutters, flowerpots and pet dishes at least once a week. Children's wading pools should be emptied of water at least once a week and stored so they cannot collect water when not in use. Tree holes should be filled in with sand or mortar, or drained after each rain. Leaky faucets and pipes located outside should be repaired.

Areas that cannot be drained, such as ponds or large rain collection systems, can be stocked with fish that eat mosquito larvae. Dunks can also be used in these areas. Dunks are a small, donut-shaped

product that contains Bacillus thuringiensis var. israeliensis. The donut disrupts the life cycle of the mosquito and is non-toxic to humans, amphibians and fish.

Avoiding outdoor activities during peak mosquito hours is the best method to avoid being bitten. When outside, wear loose-fitting, light colored clothing with long sleeves & long pants. Repellants containing active ingredients such as DEET, picaridin, IR3535, oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE), para-methane-diol (PMD), or 2-undecanone can be effective to keep mosquitoes from biting when evening activities cannot be rescheduled.

## Why Acupuncture?


