



Fairfield has its own AH-64D Apache Longbow Pilot

Several weeks ago, a Facebook post applauded CW3 Zack Rogers, AH-64D Apache Longbow Pilot, for his military service. It highlighted a flyover he conducted over Fairfield on his way back to Camp Mabry Military Base in Austin. Intrigued by his extraordinary skill and the fact that he took time out of his busy schedule to perform for the community, I asked for an

interview. He and Jessica, his wife, graciously agreed to give us a peek into the life of an Apache helicopter pilot and the sacrifices made by the family that supports him.

For those of us not steeped in military science or current technological advances, the Apache AH-64D is the Army's heavy division/corps attack helicopter. It is essentially a flying tank. The Army's most advanced attack helicopter, it conducts rear, close, and shaping missions including deep precision strikes against relocatable targets, and provides armed reconnaissance, when required, in a day, night, obscured battlefield and adverse weather conditions.

It incorporates a millimeter wave fire control radar, radar frequency interferometer, fire-and-forget radar-guided HELLFIRE missile, and cockpit management and digitization enhancements. The combination of the FCR, RFI, and the advanced navigation and avionics suite of the aircraft provides increased situational awareness, lethality, and survivability, and is what the U.S. is using in Iraq and Afghanistan right now.

If you have never had the opportunity to meet someone capable of earning the right to sit in an Apache cockpit, now is your chance.

"When I was a high school junior," Zack shared, "a recruiter came to Douglass High School to talk to 15 guys who were members of our class of 30, about joining the Texas Army National Guard."

Zack continued, "At the time, the most significant incentive they had to offer was college money. So that is all it took to pique my interest. Since I did not have funds set aside for education, Mom was a cook at the elementary school, and Dad was a carpenter, it did not take much convincing to have me sign on the dotted line. That day I, along with three of my classmates, joined the Texas Army National Guard."

After high school graduation, Zack entered Stephen F. Austin University and also completed basic training becoming a "13



Bravo" which is a cannon crew member. His responsibility was shooting the Howitzer, one of the biggest weapons in the Army.

During Hurricane Katrina, he was deployed to the AstroDome to assist with the refugees. In 2006, he was deployed to the Border to work with Operation Jump Start. While there, Zack continued his college education, and that is where he met Jessica, not only the love of his life, but his teacher, and life coach.

In 2007 he was deploying to Iraq but ended up staying at the MOB Station at Fort Bliss. Since he didn't end up going, he worked at the blood center and continued his schooling from 2008 to 2009 when he deployed to Iraq.

While in Iraq, he chanced

to meet a helicopter pilot who showed him the Black Hawk helicopter, let him sit inside, then took him for a flight.

"Right then and there," explained Zack, "I decided that becoming a pilot was something I was going to do. I submitted my packet in 2010 and was accepted in 2011. Two months later, I was in the program."

Zack and Jessica left in June for Officer Candidate

School at U.S. Army Aviation Center of Excellence at Fort Rucker, Alabama.

"First, I went to Warrant School," he recounted, "then to Dunker, where they dump you upside down in the water to

make sure you can get out. Next, it was SERE, Survival, Evasion, Resistance and Escape . That was the best training I never want to do again! From there I went to the Bell 206, a single-engine helicopter called the TH67. I had never been behind the controls of a helicopter, never even flown a helicopter on a video. An old crusty Vietnam Vet instructor got me through everything but the hovering. I simply could not hover.

"People were getting kicked out right and left. I was down to the line and the most stressed out I have ever been, even in Iraq.

"Amazingly, two days before my check ride, I had a prophetic dream about hovering. In the dream I was competent, capable, and able to hover. The next day, not only was I able to hover, I have been able to hover ever since."

From there, Zack went to instruments in the clouds, the BWS necessary warfighter skills. There, they used an OH 58 Kiowa, where they flew above the trees and landed on the ground. From there, he went to the Apache, and that is when things got serious.

"We conducted day flying, night flying with night vision, then gunnery, which was shooting things with the helicopter, and later we graduated," added Zack.

In January, he took a full-time job as a Training Officer and today, not only is he a pilot, he oversees around 200 pilots throughout the state at a variety of Texas pilot schools.

I asked, "What has life taught you so far? "

His answer was, "You can achieve anything you put your mind

to! The fact is I was very, very lucky. However, the truth is that I worked very, very hard! Early on, I decided I was not going to take "NO" from anybody, and I worked my ass off for my dream."

"Equally as important," offered Zack, "I am convinced that family is everything. Next to that, it is my children's education. That is a high priority for both Jessica and me."

In closing, I asked Zack what he liked best about his job. With a big smile, he said, "I get to fly a \$30-million-dollar helicopter and if you are into guns and flying there is nothing more exhilarating. Nothing matches the satisfaction you get when you can respond to a request for fire or help out the guys on the ground."

"By the way," he added, "We're looking for pilots. If anybody between the ages of eighteen and 31 would like to come to join the Texas National Guard, have them give me a call. I would be glad to answer any questions."

"One more thing, for the folks in our community," he sighed. "I know that some people might be uncomfortable with flyovers. However, I am very high up in the air so no worries, helicopters are safe and I am not breaking any FAA regulations. I am gone a lot. I don't get to see my kids as much as I should. So, when I get a chance to fly over, it is for them to see, so they can understand that is why my dad is always gone. I do that for my kids. "

Zackary and Jessica are the proud parents of 15-year old Cole, 11-year old Aeson and 8-year old Gavin.

Captain Andrew H. Lawrence was commissioned a Navy Ensign February 1965 and earned his Naval Flight Officer wings September 1965. A sampling of his assignments included Officer-in-Charge of Patrol Squadron Sixty-Seven in Memphis, TN; Deputy Controller; and Deputy Chief of Staff for Manpower for Commander Naval Reserve Force. In January 1989, he assumed the duties of Commanding Officer of Naval Support Activity in New Orleans.

While serving as Tactical Coordinator for a flight crew in Patrol Sixteen, Jacksonville, Fla, he earned two Air Medals for action in Vietnam; he also received the Meritorious Service Medal, the Navy Commendation Medal, and the Navy Achievement Medal.



William C. "Bill" Wilson began active duty with the U.S. Army on April 15th, 1969. He completed basic training at Fort Polk, Louisiana and went on to Fort Lee, Virginia to begin training to become a supply clerk. However, the Army needed company clerks, and Bill had a valuable skill for a man in those days. He could type. He became a company clerk at Fort Lee,

similar to the Radar O'Reilly of the Mash TV fame but not nearly as colorful. In 1970, he received orders for Germany. Serving at support command headquarters in Worms, Germany, Bill became a personnel management specialist and attained the rank of Specialist Five. In 1972 the Army began a reduction in force and Bill was released from active duty on January 24th of '72. He completed the remainder of his six-year commitment in the inactive reserves and received an honorable discharge.

Currently, Bill continues to serve by working with the Corps of Cadets at Texas A&M. He is a 16-year Squadron III parent and frequent volunteer with the Corps of Cadets Association. In addition, he is an official volunteer for the Texas A&M Aggie Corps Recruiters Program and at every opportunity participates in college fairs at high schools in the fall. **Ivan Beauchamps** is a Navy Hospital Corpsman E-4, stationed at Ft. Meade Army Base--Defense Information System Agency (DISA), DOD. Ivan is also a pastor. He is the son of Jackie Penha, a Fairfield Resident.



Sergeant Jordan Hendricks joined the Marines immediately after finishing high school in 2004 and served for 10 years. As combat veteran, he served on the front lines on active duty and in the reserves. He fought in Iraq while active and was called up from the reserves and sent to Afghanistan while in the reserves. Tours of duty include:

Active, 2004-2008, 1st Marine Division, 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines, Weapons Company (Mobile Assault Platoon 1).

Reserves: 2009-2014, 4th Marine Division, 1st Battalion, 23rd Marines.

Alpha Company (Weapons Platoon). Jordan is the son of Stacey and Rusty Templet.

LTC (R) Carol L. Strong received her Bachelor of Science Degree in Retail Management from Southern Illinois University (Carbondale) in 1983. In 1986, Carol enlisted in the US Army and served as an "Improved Hawk Pulse Radar Technician." She was recommended and selected to attend the US Army's, Officer

Candidate School. She received her active duty commission in June 1988 into the Ordnance Corps. Carol commanded the 190th Maintenance Company at Fort Hood, Texas.

Additionally, Carol served as the Division Support Command Planner and the Support Operations Officer in the 101st Airborne Division during Operation Enduring Freedom. She planned and coordinated logistics operations for many top secret combat missions. Carol received her Master of Science Degree from Florida Institute of Technology and is a graduate of the Army's Command and General Staff College. LTC (R) Garrick Strong served his final tour of duty at Prairie View A&M University as the Professor of Military Science in the Army ROTC department.

Captain Jim Ware After graduation and completeing the ROTC program, Jim was commissioned 2nd Lt and ordered to report and attend the Engineer school at Ft. Belvoir, VA. He also served at Ft. Leonard, MO and Camp McCoy, Wisconsin. He was released from service in 1963 as a Captain, CE-USAR.



Seaman 1st Class Charlie Ware went into service in 1943. He was sent to boot camp in Faragate, Idaho, where according to family stories, "he almost froze." Upon completion, he was sent to the Hawaiian Islands, where he became an aircraft line captain. He spent the remainder of the war right there and was very lucky to return home in 1945.



JimWare's Father-In-Law Albert Loy was in the Merchant Marines and became the Chief Cook of the ship that was transporting troops to Italy. Brothers Roy Loy and Glen Loy were in the Army. Glen was with his unit in a fox hole where he was wounded. He came home luckily only losing an eye! In photo Glen Loy, Roy Loy & Albert Loy. **Ralph Linkenhoker, Jr.** entered the Air Force in 1974. After completing boot camp in San Antonio, TX, he was assigned to Rantoul, IL to obtain certification as a Fuel Specialist. From there he was stationed at Barksdale AF Base, a Strategic Air Command base in Shreveport LA responsible for maintaining Long Range Bombers. He was discharged



in 1976 and remained in the reserves until 1978.

Senior Chief Petty Officer Ralph Likenhoker III joined the Navy in 1999 went to basic training at Great Lake Navy Training Center training as an aviation ordinance man focused on building the bombs, rockets and other munitions used on aircraft. From there he was stationed at the LHD 7 Iwo Jima as a Ships Company. After four years he moved on to do two billets on the USS Enterprise (CVN-65), formerly CVA(N)-65, then to Shore Duty at Pax River, MD where he worked on experimental aircraft associated with weapons systems. 





Yard of the Month

Summer has arrived here in Fairfield. This month we visited onefourth of Fairfield South. The areas included: Silver Lake, Silver Crest, Summer Gate, Travis Point and Sterling Lake Estates.

The month of July we are featuring the home of David and Marilyn Taylor. Their home is located at 16922 Thomas Ridge Lane, in the Silver Lake subdivision. David and Marilyn's yard is pristine, well planned, great balance, harmony and consonance. All their planting areas are bordered with professional stacked rock that compliments the brick and rock on their home.

David credits his wife, Marilyn with the planning of their landscaping. Great job Marilyn, everything looks beautiful.

There are two Crimson Bottlebrush Trees (Callistemon) flanking the outside corners of the home. The Bottlebrush-like flowers bloom sporadically throughout the year above dark green leaves. They have cylindrical spiked flowers with long stamens that resemble a brush.

In their defined planters you'll see a variety of Shrubs, including Boxwood, Ilex Cornet "Burfordii Nana" and Gold Mop Cypress just to name a few. I also see some Carex "Evergold Burpee", its long spike leaves in variegated green are very hardy in our area and add great color and texture to any garden. One of my favorites is their use of the Texas Red Yucca "Hesperaloe Parviflora". This is one of the very best drought tolerant flowering succulents, a hummingbirds' favorite that produces tall spikes of reddish-pink flowers that continue to bloom all summer. They planted Latana Camara, yellow, of the verbena family. Their yellow flowers are aromatic. It goes without saying that Knockout Roses always are great color to any garden.

I love the very appropriate flag by David and Marilyn's front entrance, "Celebrating America". Their flag, to me, tops off their beautiful yard in style.


